

Down Under-Bred Under Presidential Consideration

After finishing a late-closing third behind Versado in the second of two divisions of the opening round of the Presidential Series last weekend at the Meadowlands, Mr. Hasani N definitely proved he belonged in the group of top-flight older pacers. He'll look to improve that show finish on Saturday night when he lines up in post eight in the lone \$40,000 division of the second leg of the Presidential at the Big M.

Purchased this past summer as part of a group of 10 Down Under-breds by the Muscara family's Muscara Racing Trust, and one of five sent to trainer Darren Cassar, Mr. Hasani N had six wins and two seconds in eight starts last year after ar-

iving stateside, amassing earnings of \$107,000.

"He was actually the cheapest of the five I got at the time," remembered the 35-year-old Cassar, a native of Australia who came to the United States 11 years ago and is now stabled at Winners International in Columbus, N.J. "He came in good form but he was a young, green horse. Before we bought him he had only 20-odd starts."

A 5-year-old son of Christian Cullen, Mr. Hasani N was a seven-time winner in New Zealand before being purchased, including his last three starts Down Under. He made his U.S. debut in late October at Harrah's Philadelphia, winning a conditioned race in 1:52. After a second-place finish in his next start Mr. Hasani N strung together four consecutive victories, including a career-best 1:49.4 effort and a 1:51.4 clocking over a "sloppy" track at Harrah's Philadelphia, the latter a race that led Cassar to the decision to nominate him to the Presidential.

"Every challenge I threw at him, he just kept getting better," said Cassar, whose stable currently numbers a dozen. "The one run at Chester when he won in 1:51, that's when I said he was a good horse. That track was off that day and he went in :51. He just kept improving. And he's just a fast horse."

Cassar said he has had to make some equipment changes along the way and he plans on another on Saturday night.

"When he first came he was very green—and he still is—and the Down Under horses never go straight. They go in and they go out," he said. "We had him rigged up for running in at Chester and last week I didn't change anything. This week I'll take the Murphy blind off and I think he'll be a lot of straighter."

Although Mr. Hasani N's third-place finish in the Presidential opener was the first time he hadn't finished one-two, Cassar was extremely pleased with the effort.

"I was very, very happy with the race," he said. "He hadn't raced in three weeks. I had to give him a week off after his last race because he got sick. He definitely needed the run. He was fit enough, but the way John (driver John Campbell) raced him was perfect for him. He gave him an easy trip and still paced home.

"John hopped off the bike and said he was definitely a free-for-all pacer, and coming from him, that helps," he added.

Cassar said he is considering entering Mr. Hasani N in the George Morton Levy Series at Yonkers, but he wants to race the pacer there once before deciding if he fits a half-mile track. He said the new free-for-all series inaugurated this year by Meadowlands operator Jeff Gural is also under consideration. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Marcus Miller, Mr. Dennis Seek Hirt Victory

The second leg of the Clyde Hirt Series opens up Friday at the Meadowlands. Marcus Miller will make the journey from Illinois to New Jersey and will be trying to win a division of the series with Mr. Dennis. Miller, who has four drives on

the card, including two in the Clyde Hirt Series, has high hopes for the 4-year-old son of Dragon Again heading into the 11th race of the Friday Big M card.

Mr. Dennis, out of the prolific pacing broodmare Lisheen, has a record of 1:51.3 and \$51,120 in earnings through 20 starts dating back to last year. With such an outstanding pedigree, it's hard to be surprised he is one of the top choices of his division this week.

Mr. Dennis recorded a strong second-place finish in last week's leg.

"He raced really well. The trip worked out pretty much like how I had hoped. He did run out a little late in the stretch so I had to wrench him down. He's not a tough horse to drive, just a little quirky," said Miller about last week.

While Mr. Dennis did escape squaring off against prohibitive series favorite Holdingallthecards, he will face the impressive winner and 2-1 morning line favorite OneThroughTen.

Still, Miller is quite confident in Mr. Dennis. "I expect him to be very good. We re-rigged him since last start. We will see how the race unfolds."

The son of Erv Miller has been a top driver on the Illinois circuit for several years and is hoping to make these Meadowlands appearances a weekly journey.

Meadowlands Handle Up 25%; Fan Meets “The Captain”

Business remained strong for the third week of racing at the Meadowlands. All sources handle on the live product was up 25 percent over last year's dates despite the competition from Yonkers on Friday and Saturday.

Most of the increase is coming from remote locations, which benefits simulcast partners more than it does the Meadowlands' bottom line. The good news is that those increases contribute to the overall health of the industry and boost pool size on the M1 races appreciably.

Another growing revenue stream is the import simulcast business (those wagers taken by The Meadowlands on other tracks) which is up 10 percent vs. 2012.

Darin Zoccali, director of racing operations, spoke of the first few weeks, “We continue to be excited about how the betting public across the country has received our product. Last year, the winter season was practically an extension of fall and we have already seen two snowy nights this year, yet our overall numbers still show a substantial increase.

“Jeff Gural has always been a staunch advocate of bringing people to the track to be a part of the live product, which at the Meadowlands is the best in the business. Moving toward opening our new facility, bringing people to the track will remain our number one priority. We are very excited for the prospects of this upcoming weekend as the betting cards are simply tremendous.”

The Captaintreacherous promotion has started to capture the imagination of the local racing fans. One prospective “partner” reportedly visited the Gaitway Farm stable of trainer Tony Alagna to see his “new horse.”

“I came off the track and noticed a gentleman standing by Captaintreacherous's stall,” said Alagna. “When I introduced myself, he excitedly produced the form used in the drawing and said, ‘I entered that contest at the Meadowlands and I might own part of this horse!’

“He asked about a picture, so the groom shined ‘The Captain’ up and brought him out and they took a few shots together. The visitor spoke highly of the improvements at The ‘M’ and when he left my barn went over to Mark Harder's stable to see Golden Receiver.

“It just reinforces how important it is to embrace the fans. This guy looked to be in his early forties and he's going to go home and tell his friends how he enjoyed the whole experience. We need more of that.” *(Meadowlands)*

A Band With Horse's Name Tries For Grammy Gig

Pacinello is looking for a trip to the Grammy Awards. Not the horse, the band. Pacinello, a Vernon, N.Y.-based band, is participating in the Grammy Live: Gig of a Lifetime

contest. The winning band gets a trip to Los Angeles to perform during Grammy week. Voting, which was through Facebook and Twitter, ended Thursday (Jan. 16).

Founded by Molly D'Agostino, the 17-year-old daughter of harness racing trainer-driver Joe D'Agostino, the band is named after 7-year-old pacer Pacinello, who has won 33 races and made \$347,305 in his career. Among his triumphs were the finals of the 2010 Complex and Exit 16W series at Meadowlands Racetrack.

Since then Pacinello has raced frequently at Vernon Downs, where he has won nine times, mostly in the Open.

“Molly has loved horses her whole life,” Joe D'Agostino said. “She fell in love with him. That's where the (band) name comes from.”

Joe D'Agostino, who has three racehorses in addition to running an insurance and tax business, is more than a proud father when it comes to talking about Pacinello—the band. He also is the group's drummer.

“It was supposed to be temporary until she could find someone her own age,” D'Agostino said, laughing. “It's been a few months now and I'm still hanging in there. It's been semi-permanent, but I think eventually they'll have to find somebody that's a little bit younger.

“They're very young and I haven't played in years. I played as a teenager; they kind of had to roll me out of mothballs to get this thing going.”

Molly D'Agostino plays the guitar and writes the band's songs. Kim March, whose uncle is a blacksmith at Vernon Downs, sings. Andrew Dietz, on bass, rounds out the group. *(HRC)*

Penn National Plans For NJ OTW Near Philly

Penn National Gaming Inc., the largest operator of pari-mutuel facilities in North America, has signed a lease to renovate a former restaurant in Gloucester Township into New Jersey's fifth Off-Track Wagering (OTW) facility.

“Favorites at Gloucester Township” will be located at the former Stone Grille on Blackwood-Clementon Road and will offer South Jersey horse racing fans a convenient location to watch and wager on their favorite New Jersey, and national, racetracks. The location is just off Route 42 and minutes from the Walt Whitman Bridge.

A late summer opening is anticipated barring any issues in obtaining the necessary local and state approvals. Renovations to the interior of the facility will include the additional of nearly 100 flat screen televisions.

Penn National Gaming Inc. is a joint venture partner in Freehold Raceway located in Freehold and will be utilizing one of Freehold's four OTW licenses for the Gloucester Township facility. Freehold operates an Off-Track Wagering facility in Toms River which opened in 2008. (Penn National)

New Post-Race Procedure Announced In Ontario

The Ontario Racing Commission (ORC) has released a notice to the industry regarding new rule changes approved by the ORC Board in December, clarifying a number of procedural issues related to the test barn and associated retention area.

In the case where a claimed horse is required to go to the test barn, physical custody of that horse will not pass from the original owner to the new owner until the testing procedure has been completed and the horse released. This change was approved to ensure that the original owner (or representative) is in attendance for the test, as those interests will be responsible in the case of a positive test. (ORC)

Ohio's Larry Foureman Dies

Larry L. Foureman, 77, of Arcanum, Ohio, president of the Ohio Colt Racing Association, vice president of the H.M. Parrshall Memorial and treasurer of the Signature Series fair races in the Buckeye State, died Jan. 14, at Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton.

Mr. Foureman was born in Abbottsville on Aug. 7, 1935, the son of the late Wherly D. and Iva A. (Burns) Foureman. He was a member of Grace United Methodist Church, Ithaca. He was a former Darke County Commissioner, Van Buren Township Trustee, Arcanum Mayor and member of the Village Council, Darke County Township Trustee past president, State of Ohio Township Trustee director, past president of the State of Ohio County Commissioners, founder of the National Kiddie Tractor Pullers and the Henipen Racing Ducks.

Mr. Foureman was the originator of the Halloween Bean Supper, director of the former Arcanum National Bank, former Arcanum assistant fire chief and a founding member of the Arcanum Community Rescue Squad. He was a member of the Arcanum Area Business Association and the

Greenville Moose, Eagles, and Elks Lodges, and on the board of directors of the Eagles Lodge.

He is survived by his wife, Judith (Rogers), whom he married May 14, 1983; children, Mark David (Tammy), Lari Lynn Reinoehl, Michele (Brent) Black, and Jack Matthew Louderback; grandchildren, John, David, Travis Reinoehl, Tyler (Sarah) Reinoehl, Angie (Matt) Nichol, Kelly Manson and Natalie Louderback; and seven great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; sisters, Thelma and Berdine Case; brother, Myron "Barney," and son-in-law, Gary Reinoehl.

Backstretch Security Expert Pete Lang Dies

Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB) Supervisory Senior agent Peter J. Lang, 64, died at his home in New Jersey on Jan. 13.

Mr. Lang, a native of New Jersey, formerly worked as a police officer with the Sea Bright and Monmouth Beach, New Jersey Police Departments, prior to beginning his employment with the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau in May 1981. In 1996, upon the creation of Standardbred Investigative Services, an internal division within TRPB, Mr. Lang was named Supervisory Senior Agent, and provided oversight to investigations and initiatives involving the Standardbred industry. He provided assistance on special projects at Standardbred racetracks including Pompano Park, Scioto Downs, Monticello Raceway, Delaware County Fair, The Meadowlands, Freehold Raceway, Northfield Park, Lebanon Raceway, The Red Mile, The Meadows and Dover Downs.

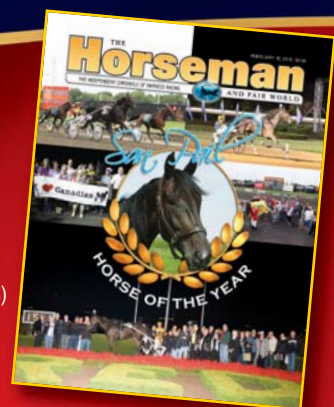
