

### Tetrick Talks Horses—Plenty Of Horses

Tim Tetrick has driven in at least 3,000 races annually every year since 2005, including 2007 when he climbed into the sulky a staggering 4,728 times and snagged an all-time high of 1,189 victories. Still as busy as ever, Tetrick is already closing in on 1,300 drives this year, with more than 200 wins.

Tetrick will add substantially to his drive total this weekend as he will be in perpetual motion. He is scheduled to drive in four qualifiers Friday morning at the Meadowlands (post time 10 a.m.) and then head to Harrah's Philadelphia, where he is scheduled to drive in all 14 races (post time 12:40 p.m.). With that card completed around 5 p.m., Tetrick will return to the Big M (post time 7:15 p.m.) where he will drive in races 2-13. He'll be back for the baby races on Saturday morning at the Meadowlands, with another 12 drives scheduled that night at that track.

While the Saturday night card at the Meadowlands is full of stakes, Friday night's program is filled with overnights. The 11th race is the featured event, a \$30,000 A1/FFA Handicap Trot, which will mark the 4-year-old debut of 2012 Hambletonian winner Market Share.

A winner of more than \$2 million last year, the Linda Toscano-trained Market Share comes into the race off a pair of winning qualifiers at the Meadowlands. Debuting on May 18, the son of Revenue won in 1:54.4, coming back on May 25 to score in 1:56. In both efforts Tetrick let Market Share trot in mid-pack until the stretch, when the horse rallied with final quarters of :27.2 and :26.1, respectively.

"He qualified good in both but I only used him a quarter in each," Tetrick said by phone on May 29 while on his way to compete on the afternoon card at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Here is a brief synopsis from Tetrick on each of his drives in the top-class races Saturday night at the Meadowlands:

**Anndrovette** (Race 1, Golden Girls division): "She's been awesome this year. She got a brutal trip the whole mile last week (fourth in the Betsy Ross after being parked the mile)."

**Smilin Eli** (Race 2, NJSS 3CT final): "I like this horse. He's done everything I've asked him to do. I think he can go on to bigger and better things. I really think he's a player."

## “Equuleus” Set To Make First Start In Somebeachsomewhere

Odds On Equuleus, a respected member of the 2013 class of 3-year-old pacing colts, begins his season Saturday night when he competes in race 9 at Mohawk, a \$75,000 division of the Somebeachsomewhere. If all goes according to plan, the Somebeachsomewhere will be his prep for the North America Cup.

“When his (New York) Sires Stakes got cancelled, the Somebeachsomewhere became his prep,” said Robin Schadt, who trains the Art Major colt for Dana Parham’s Odds On Racing.

The colt’s prep for the Somebeachsome-

where was a training mile, plus three previous qualifiers at the Meadowlands.

“I trained him last Saturday at Magical Acres,” said Schadt, who declined to provide a clocking for the mile. “We trained him a stiff training mile, let’s leave it at that.”

Schadt said she thinks her colt is ready to go.

“My biggest fear was this race might have just been a 12-horse field, instead of two divisions of seven. With a smaller field, none of the horses should have to be used too much or too hard,” she added.

Schadt said she plans to ship Odds On Equuleus to Classy Lane Farm, where he will hopefully spend the three-week span from the Somebeachsomewhere through the North America Cup final. After that Odds On Equuleus will head back to Odds On Stable’s eastern base at Magical Acres in New Jersey, where Schadt is training a stable of 10 horses.

## Hart Looks To "Lite" Up SBSW Stakes

The men will be separated from the boys over the next several weeks, as prep races for the \$1 million North America Cup, to be raced June 15 at Mohawk Racetrack, get underway in earnest this weekend. Two \$75,000 divisions of the Somebeachsomewhere Stakes at Mohawk are set for Saturday evening.

Trainer Ed Hart will send out an aptly named son of that stallion—Moonliteonthebeach. He will start from post three with Randy Waples driving. The 3-year-old pacer will make a big step up off a win on May 18 at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs, in a career-best 1:51.3, in a Pennsylvania Stallion Stakes division. He has three wins in seven

career starts and \$32,623 in purse earnings.


"He won last year at two a couple times and he's a very fast horse," said Hart, who trains the colt for

owners Blue Chip Farm, Scott Kimelman, Sheila Baird and Steve Demeter. "He didn't race well in the Champlain (last Sept. 8; he was 11th) because he was slipping. Then he got sick so we decided to kick him out and bring him back this year. He had various 2-year-old problems. Instead of it going on, we decided to just shut him down. He did show a lot of speed and acted like he could be a 'real' horse."

Hart says Moonliteonthebeach already has the attitude of an accomplished horse.

"He's a cocky son of a gun," he said. "He was real tough at two, very tough on himself. We had to back off one time when he got his foot caught in the water bucket. He's a real playful horse. He hurt his leg a little bit but he came back fine. He was out on the track one time and threw himself. He was tough to handle at two, but he's matured a lot this year."

Moonliteonthebeach had a long layoff, from mid-September of last year. "We brought him back the first of the year

to jog and he's been going ever since. He had a nice rest," Hart said.

Hart thinks this weekend's race will give some clues as to the future for Moonliteonthebeach.

"We're going to see. It's an awful tough field and we'll have to get a good trip in there. I know he seems to try at the end of the mile. He's always coming. He's got very good speed and a great attitude. He's got to step up with the big boys now." (HRC)

## Pacers Look For Hometown Edge In Molson

Doug McNair has enjoyed numerous memorable moments at The Raceway at Western Fair District during his driving career. On Friday, he hopes to add the \$150,000 Molson Pace for older male pacers to the list.

The 23-year-old McNair will drive Aracache Hanover in the Molson Pace. Aracache Hanover, a 6 year old who has earned \$1.48 million in his career, will start from post 2 for trainer Gregg McNair, Doug's father, and owners William Switala and James Martin of New York.

McNair got his first career win at The Raceway at Western Fair District in 2008 and has claimed multiple driving titles at the London, Ont. half-mile oval. In 2010 at Western Fair he became the youngest driver to reach 1,000

lifetime victories.

"It would be great to win (the Molson Pace) because I got my start there," McNair said. "To win in front of the home crowd would be good. It's a really nice field, but we can't complain

about the post position. (Aracache Hanover) usually likes the front, but he can race from anywhere. It should be interesting to see how it lines up."

Aracache Hanover has a win and two second-place finishes from four starts this year. He is coming off a last-place finish from post 10 in the Dan Patch Invitational on May 25 at Hoosier Park, but McNair said he thinks Aracache Hanover flipped his palate when McNair had to take a tight hold of the horse in traffic.

"I think in the last start I cut off his air when I had to grab him up, but he went a big trip at Woodbine a couple of starts ago," McNair said. "He's tough. He's a big, strong horse; big gaited. He can race anyway you want.

"He's usually always in the big dances and I try to follow him around as much as I can. He's one of the best horses, if not the best horse, I've ever driven."

McNair is looking forward to another chance to drive Aracache Hanover in the Molson Pace. The duo finished fifth from post seven last year.

"Western Fair reminds me of Yonkers a bit, where if you get to the front you can control the speed," McNair said. "I guess I know (with my experience at Western Fair) where to

jam on the brakes and where to let them rattle. It's more of a front-end track, with no passing lane, but you can come first-up if you're driving the right horse."

Also in the field is Foiled Again, the richest pacer of all time, and Betterthancheddar, who will be making his 2013 debut. Betterthancheddar comes into the race off a nine-length qualifying win in 1:52.2 at Mohawk and will start in the second tier.

Co-owner Steve Calhoun is from nearby Chatham, and he is confident the pacer will be ready to go Friday.

"He'll be ready," said Calhoun. "We would love to have gotten a race into him before this but that's the way it worked out."

Calhoun expects to have several family members and friends from the area on hand to cheer on Betterthancheddar and is excited to be competing on his home turf.

"I've been coming here since I was a kid and Casie (Coleman) and I have been fortunate enough to compete in this race before with some success," he admits. "It would be a big thrill to win it and I'm just looking forward to the challenge of competing against such a great field." *(with files from HRC and Western Fair)*

The Meadows had enough for seven races on Friday morning (May 31), with offspring from the first crops by pacing sires Well Said and Art Official and trotting sire Explosive Matter. The Meadows showcases babies for the first time this season Saturday, June 1. Baby races will go on Saturday mornings at the Big M and have a box close of 4 p.m. on Friday. Baby races were also drawn for Mohawk Racetrack on Saturday morning, with a filly from the first crop by Shadow Play scheduled to be among the starters.

## No SBSW Stakes For Captaintreacherous

Myron Bell, racing manager and partner in the Captaintreacherous Stable, told [harnessracing.com](http://harnessracing.com) Tuesday morning that Captaintreacherous will not make the trip to Mohawk Racetrack this weekend for the Somebeachsomewhere and instead will wait to make a trip to Canada for the North America Cup eliminations on June 8.

The 2012 Pacer of the Year, Captaintreacherous won his 3-year-old debut on May 19 at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs with a 3 1/2-length, 1:49.4 score in a \$62,587 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) division. The second leg of PASS is scheduled for May 31 at The Meadows, but Bell said that event was also off the table.

With trainer Tony Alagna based at Gaitway Farm in New Jersey, the decision to miss Saturday's Somebeachsomewhere was made primarily to avoid the burden of travel. Bell said if Captaintreacherous had gone to Mohawk this weekend for the race named for his sire he would have made the return trip to New Jersey before turning around and heading back for the NA Cup elims.

By bypassing the Somebeachsomewhere, Bell said Captaintreacherous will start June 22 at Pocono Downs in the eliminations for the \$500,000 Max Hempt Memorial on June 29. That would lead into the Meadowlands Pace eliminations on July 6, with the final on July 13.

"We didn't want to be away in Canada three weeks in a row this early in the year," said Bell. "This way we can enter him in the Hempt. If we raced in the Somebeachsomewhere we couldn't have gone to the Hempt."

Bell said the plan now calls for Captaintreacherous to go a fast training mile behind the gate this weekend at the Meadowlands.

"We were very pleased with his first start," said Bell. "I think he is very good right now. I don't think we have to race him to give him a prep. If we train him in 1:52 behind the gate I think he'll be just as ready if he raced. One race less now at the start of the year gives you one race more at the end of the year. There are plenty of races." — [harnessracing.com](http://harnessracing.com)

## Tracys Song Stretches Streak To 17

Tracys Song did it again. The 8-year-old pacing mare won for the 17th consecutive time at Monticello Raceway on Tuesday afternoon, May 28. In doing so she not only extended her Mighty M record for most wins in a row, but she continues to outdistance herself from all others in races won in North America this year.

Bruce Aldrich Jr. was again at the controls for trainer Bob Lounsbury and guided the mare to another wire-to-wire triumph, this week in a time of 1:59 over a racetrack made heavy from an extended light rain.

"I heard the rumors that Danny Gill's horse (Community Spirit driven by Jimmy Marohn Jr.) was going to end our win streak today," Aldrich admitted in the winner's circle after the race. "So I was prepared.

"We grabbed the racetrack and had the front by the first turn and Jimmy settled in tight on my back as we went to the (first) quarter in :28 and a piece."

After that, Aldrich got Tracys Song by the half in :59.3 and they passed the third stanza in 1:29.4.

"I wanted to back her off as much as possible so she'd have something to come home with," Aldrich explained about the relatively slow middle half. "On the final turn she had her usual kick and although Jimmy was out at us, Tracy just kicked it in another gear and we win it by a little more than a length."

As usual, Lounsbury was on hand in the winner's circle, as was owner Nancy Fugere.

### Saratoga Announces \$30 Million Expansion

As Saratoga Casino and Raceway approaches its 10th year of operation, expansion plans are officially underway. A \$30 million plan unveiled Tuesday, May 28, includes a 120-room hotel with guest spa, indoor pool and lobby bar, a 24,000 sq. ft. multi-purpose event center, and a signature fine dining restaurant.

The plans are the most significant expansion ever done at Saratoga Casino and Raceway and the present the transformation of the facility into an international resort destination. The property underwent a \$15 million renovation and expansion prior to opening in January 2004. In 2007, \$25 million was spent to add 400 slot machines and electronic table games, Vapor Night Club and the Garden Buffet.

Architectural renderings of the project were unveiled on May 28, a construction timeline, and an economic impact study demonstrating the significance of the project to Saratoga Springs, Saratoga County and New York State.

"Since opening in 2004, we have seen tremendous growth and are very proud to have generated in excess of \$111.3 million for our horsemen and \$601.2 million for education in New York State," said Jamie Hartman, executive vice president and chief operating officer of Saratoga Casino and Raceway.

The construction timeline anticipates work beginning in spring 2014 and the opening of the expansion project in spring 2015. (*Saratoga Casino and Raceway*)

### Ohio AG Asks Top Court To Reject Roundtable Appeal

According to reports, on May 28 the Ohio Attorney General's Office asked the Supreme Court of the State of Ohio to reject an appeal filed by the Ohio Roundtable, which has challenged the constitutionality of a 2011 law that authorized video lottery terminals at racetracks. The Ohio Roundtable has challenged the law authorizing VLTs in other courts previously.

The Attorney General's Office, in its filing to the Supreme Court, contends that the Ohio Roundtable lacks standing in challenging the constitutionality of the VLT law. Previously, the Franklin County Common Pleas Court and the Franklin County Court of Appeals rejected the Ohio Roundtable's argument on the grounds the suit lacks standing.

Among the six justices on the Supreme Court of Ohio is former Standardbred breeder Paul E. Pfeifer.
