

Captaintreacheros Ready For NA Cup Elimination

The big stakes season at Mohawk Racetrack will officially be in full swing with eliminations for the North America Cup, Fan Hanover, Goodtimes, Elegantimage and Armbr Flight set for this Friday and Saturday night.

The showcase event, the Pepsi North America Cup, has drawn 21 three-year-old pacers, which means there will be three 7-horse eliminations. Last year 28 horses were entered in the race, with three eliminations.

The undisputed favorite prior to the eliminations is Captaintreacheros, the 2012 Dan Patch Pacer of the Year and 2-Year-Old Pacing Colt of the Year. He'll be starting from post 5 in Race 3, the first of the three elims.

The NA Cup elim will be the second race of the season for Captaintreacheros, who won a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes at Pocono Downs in 1:49.4 on May 19, and since then has been keeping fit with qualifying workouts at the Meadowlands.

"The Captain's" trainer, Tony Alagna, told Harness Racing Communications that the colt is ready for the NA Cup elims. "I don't anticipate the horse being anything but on his game," said Alagna.

"His maturity level has changed quite a bit," Alagna continued. "His demeanor in the barn; he was so playful last year. He still has that playfulness, but he knows the difference between when it's time to be serious and when it's not."


Alagna had wanted Captaintreacheros to race at the Meadowlands the week before the NA Cup elims, but when the race didn't fill, he trained him over the one-mile oval on Saturday, June 1.

"We didn't want to be away from home for three weeks up in Canada; we were worried about sickness and being away from home," Alagna said in his interview with Harness Racing Communications. "If everything works out right everyone will say 'Wow, what a great idea' and if it doesn't go perfect everyone will say 'Boy, you should have raced him.' We made the decision together and don't feel it's going to affect the horse either way. If he's on his game it shouldn't matter."

Alagna also trains NA Cup contender Wake Up Peter, the runner-up to Rockin Amadeus in last year's Breeders Crown and the third-place finisher in last Saturday's New Jersey Sires Stakes championship at the Meadowlands. The colt's June 1 performance was impressive since he raced parked for most of the mile and paced his last quarter in :27.1. Ron Pierce has been Wake Up Peter's regular driver and likes the colt's chances, which will be on the line in Race 7.

"I thought he went a monster mile," said Pierce of the Rocknroll Hanover colt's effort in the Sires Stakes final.

Alagna agreed with Pierce's assessment. "(Wake Up Peter) raced as big as a horse could race the other night in the Jersey final," Alagna said. "The colt gets a lot of bad posts and bad things happen to him.

"He has a tremendous turn of speed," added Alagna. "He's not quite as versatile as Captain; he's got a big brush on the end of a mile but he can't put four quarters together like Captain can. But not all of them can." — *By Kathy Parker*

Takter: "He's One Of The Horses To Beat"

Jimmy Takter will be sending out Rockin Amadeus, who beat Captaintreachers in last year's Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, in the second elimination for the Pepsi North America Cup, Race 7, at Mohawk Saturday night.

Takter has prepped Rockin Amadeus for the race with three qualifiers and two starts—both wins—and he believes his colt is ready following his 1:49.3 score at the Meadowlands in the New Jersey Sires Stakes final on June 1.

"He's good and sound and fresh. I think he's one of the horses to beat," said Takter.

"He can cut the mile, but this horse is very immature in his brain still. Right now, to me, he is a little better chasing."

Takter said Rockin Amadeus, a son of Rocknroll Hanover-Kikikatie bred and owned by Lothlorien, showed his immaturity in the homestretch at the Meadowlands last Saturday night, when he eked out a neck win over Johnny Rock. "He saw something on the toteboard, they had changed something, and he shied a little in the stretch," he explained.

Takter said now that Rockin Amadeus is racing, he has altered the colt's training.

"I think horses are slightly over-trained today. He went out today (Wednesday) a few intervals on the straight track. We warm up about six miles, then he did six intervals, all in 2:40. It takes about an hour. There's no speed stress, but they get tired."

While Takter is confident Rockin Amadeus is in peak form, trainer Robin Schadt wasn't so sure about her highly-regarded colt Odds On Equuleus after he appeared wobbly and faded to finish sixth after leading his division of the Somebeachsomewhere Stakes.

Schadt said she feared that missing a prior start in the New York Sires Stakes because of a change in the schedule robbed her colt of a valuable prep.

"Qualifiers aren't the same as races," she noted.

She said blood work done the Monday after the Somebeachsomewhere also revealed the colt was "under the weather," probably from the "stress of shipping and the new environment."

Schadt trained Odds On Equuleus Wednesday at Classy Lane near Mohawk and reported that she was happy with his work, and that she has also had aluminum shoes put on his front feet for the NA Cup elimination.

More NA Cup Insights:

Moonliteonthebeach (Race 3): "We think its just being green, so we're throwing it out. Randy (Waples) told me after the race to put him in (the NA Cup), but then he picked off." — *trainer Ed Hart explaining his colt's break while he was in the midst of a solid first-over challenge in the Somebeachsomewhere.*

Vegas Vacation (Race 9): "I tweeted that he tied up on me on Wednesday and he didn't even get to train this week a fast mile, we only went in about :30 with him because he tied up on me. I told the owners that there's a good shot I'm scratching him on Wednesday. He's a wicked fast horse. I wish he was a little bit smarter." — *trainer Casie Coleman about her colt, who set a 1:48.3 stakes record in winning a Somebeachsomewhere division.*

Beach Memories (Race 9): "I was really pleased with his race at The Meadows (1:49.4 win with :27.1 and :27.3 quarters). He's a big, growthy colt, and he's been caught on the lead a lot, and I think he can be even better coming from behind." — *Dave Palone, the colt's driver in all four of his victories this year.*

Apprentice Hanover (Race 9): "It was disappointing, somewhat. But 1:49.4 and kicking at the wire, we're still in the game." — *trainer Ben Wallace about his colt's fourth-place finish behind Beach Memories in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes action at The Meadows on May 31.*

Fillies Facing Off In Fan Hanover, Elegantimage

In addition to the North America Cup, the Mohawk weekend racing programs include eliminations for the Fan Hanover for 3-year-old pacing fillies, the Elegantimage for 3-year-old trotting fillies, the Goodtimes for 3-year-old trotting colts, and the Armbro Flight for trotting mares.

The Fan Hanover, with an estimated purse of \$400,000, attracted only 11 entries. Among them was Jerseylicious, a winner of eight of 11 races already this season and the runner-up in the New Jersey Sires Stakes final. Jerseylicious received a bye so that created a 10-horse elimination field, with just one filly to be eliminated.

Surprisingly, one of the missing fillies is last year's divisional champion Somwherovrainbow, a daughter of 2004

(eliminations on June 22), and the way her schedule with other stakes was set, she was going to have to race nine straight weeks without a break, and I didn't want to do that," said George Teague Jr., who trains and also bred and co-owns Somwherovrainbow. "I hated to miss the Fan Hanover, and I really didn't even make up my mind not to go until Monday (June 3)."

The daughter of another Fan Hanover champion will be taking a shot at this year's race. Where the girls are, who will start from post 8, is a daughter of Cabrini Hanover p,2, 1:51 (\$1,303,790), who won the 2005 Fan Hanover.

"If she would start drawing better, we would be in great shape," said the filly's trainer, Jimmy Takter. "I think she has the world record for bad posts!"

Takter might be right. Before drawing post 8 for the Fan Hanover elim, Where the girls are started from post 10 (and won) on May 24 at the Meadowlands, and in two of her other three starts this season she drew post 8 as well. Last season she drew post 9 for the Breeders Crown final (and finished fourth), post 8 in her Breeders Crown elim, and posts 8 and 9 in stakes action at The Red Mile.

"She has a ton of ability," Takter added about his filly, who was bred and is co-owned by David Willmot, who campaigned Cabrini Hanover with the late Bob Anderson. "I think she can establish herself in this division."

On Friday night at Mohawk, two eliminations for the Elegantimage Stakes for 3-year-old trotting fillies will be contested. The first elim features Bee A Magician and To Dream On, last year's the Dan Patch 2-Year-old Trotting Filly of the Year.

Horse of the Year Rainbow Blue, who won the Fan Hanover.

Somwherovrainbow competed at The Meadows on Tuesday (June 4) in a \$78,224 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes, winning by four lengths in 1:51.4.

So why not the Fan Hanover?

Bee A Magician, a daughter of Kadabra, is undefeated in three starts this year after winning 10 of 13 races in 2012.

Trainer Richard Norman told Harness Racing Communications that Bee A Magician has been an easy student this year. "Last year you had to be careful around her, but she is simple to work with now," he said. "She doesn't need a lot of work; we just try to keep her happy."

To Dream On's sophomore season has not been perfect. The Credit Winner filly won two qualifiers but then suffered a small setback.

"She was acting up in the trailer when we were shipping to the Meadowlands to qualifiers and she bumped herself, and then she stepped on herself, so we had to deal with that," said trainer Jimmy Takter. "She's a very sensitive filly. She doesn't like anything unpleasant."

To Dream On also has been known for her tendency to get "hot" in a race, and Takter said that caused her to break stride in an Empire Breeders Classic elimination at Vernon Downs on Sunday, June 2.

"I wasn't planning on racing her in the Elegantimage, but she made that break. She was too hot in the last turn at Vernon and she took a bad step. She seemed to get hot because the pace was high in the beginning of the race, then she got jammed up," explained Takter.

The second Elegantimage elimination features the Chocolatier-sired Shared Past, who has shown she is on top of her game in just two starts this season, winning out of posts 8 and 9 at the Meadowlands in 1:53.4 both times. Her June 1 score came in the \$150,000 New Jersey Sires Stakes final. — By Kathy Parker

Later Sunday night, New York's finest 3-year-old trotters will compete for nearly \$500,000 in the Empire Breeders Classic finals at Vernon Downs.

In the filly final, for a purse of \$237,600, returning elimination winners Perfect Alliance and Wygant Lady, both daughters of Credit Winner, will begin from posts three and four, respectively, chosen by their connections as a perk for their elimination wins.

Perfect Alliance led at every call in last week's race, lowering her record to 1:55.2 in the process for driver Yannick Gingras. Gingras turns the mount for Sunday's race to Ron Pierce, who was listed last week but unable to drive due to a racing accident the night before at the Meadowlands, when he was bruised and sore but otherwise uninjured.

Perfect Alliance races for four now as principal owner Jeff Gural (Little E, LLC) has taken on Jason Settlemoir, Dave Stolz and Art Geiger as partners in the filly since her win last week. Bob Bencal is the trainer.

Wygant Lady has won half of her eight starts this year for trainer Taylor Gower, who shares ownership of the filly with her

breeder, Alan Stull. She reduced her speed record considerably in last week's race, seizing the win with a furious late rally to score in 1:56.2 for Cat Manzi, who is also back for the final.

The colts will race for \$259,900 in their final and it is a deep, competitive group. Tirade Hanover scored in the faster elimination win, turning a perfect Vic Kirby drive into a 1:53.1 lifetime best in his first start of the season. He'll begin from post three, chosen for him by trainer Tyler Raymer and owners Leigh Raymer, Stephen Moss, Harold and Helene Solomon. The Crazyed gelding edged past the \$200,000 mark in career earnings with last week's win, his eighth in a dozen starts.

Jurgen Hanover, lightly raced at two, has been at it for awhile this season, boasting a perfect six for six record as a sophomore. After sweeping the Weiss series at Pocono, Jurgen set all the fractions in his EBC elimination to win in 1:54.1 and will start just outside his main rival for driver David Miller. Donna Marshall trains the Credit Winner colt, who sold for \$50,000 as a yearling, for Norm and Gerald Smiley and the TLP Stable.

Wheeling N Dealin Schools At Mohawk

Trainer Dustin Jones hopes the third time's the charm as he prepares the 2013 Hambletonian winterbook favorite and the undefeated Wheeling N Dealin for the \$1.2 million classic, which is scheduled for Saturday, Aug. 3, at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

There have been three undefeated freshman trotters in the past 11 years with serious Hambletonian aspirations—Broadway Hall, Cantab Hall and Deweycheatumnhowe. Only the latter kept his string alive, while becoming the first undefeated Hambletonian winner in 2008 at 15 in a row. Broadway Hall went nine-for-nine at two and never raced again due to injury. Like "Dewey," Cantab Hall also went 10-for-10 as a freshman, won his first two starts at three, but had to settle for second in the 2004 Hambletonian. Now, a son of Cantab Hall heads the list on the Road to the Hambletonian Top Ten.

Wheeling N Dealin, who is driven by Sylvain Filion, capped his unblemished 2-year-old campaign winning the \$600,000 Breeders Crown at Woodbine in 1:56 after winning his elimination in 1:55.1. The \$100,000 yearling, bred by William Weaver's Valley High Stable, also posted major wins in the \$475,860 William Wellwood Memorial in 1:55.3 at Mohawk, and the \$142,323 Champlain Stakes in a career best of 1:55, also at Mohawk. He bankrolled \$696,112 for Ecurie Synergie of Montreal, Que.

Wheeling N Dealin has gone through a smooth transition into his sophomore season for Jones. Under meticulous management, the colt is being readied for his comeback sometime this month before he heads for his first race in the US.

"We schooled him yesterday (Wednesday, June 5) after the qualifiers off the starting gate in 1:57.3 at Mohawk," said Jones, a 51-year-old from Sherbrooke, Que., now based in Campbellville, Ont. "He's been training back real good. We gave him three months off after the Breeders Crown. We

started jogging him again in January just after the Meadowlands Mixed Sale. It takes a little time to get him ready and we certainly haven't cut any corners.

"He's going to qualify next Wednesday (June 12) at Mohawk," Jones continued. "We're not sure if we're going to qualify him two or three times. Our plan is to race him in a few overnights at Mohawk, then maybe race him the week before the Hambletonian in a 3-year-old Open. He's eligible to the Stanley Dancer and the Yonkers Trot. We had a meeting the other day, and we decided he's definitely not going to the Yonkers Trot.

"Yes, it's all about peaking and timing it just right. If we get him ready too early, how are you going to keep him sharp all season? There's that big carrot out there, which is the \$1 million bonus for winning the Earl Beal Jr. Memorial, the Colonial and Breeders Crown, but that's awful tough. We're obviously going to key for the Hambletonian, then the Colonial, the Canadian Trotting Classic, the Kentucky Futurity and the Breeders Crown. Hopefully, we can keep him good for all of those races. That's tough enough."

With the return to heat racing for this year's Hambletonian, Jones is confident he has the type of horse that can handle it.

"He trucks good, so the travel is not a problem, and the heats shouldn't bother him," he noted. "He's a very relaxed horse. Heats wouldn't have been good for Prestidigitator (Jones' entrant in 2012) because he's so hard on himself on the track. On the other hand, Wheeling N Dealin is like two fingers to drive. In the paddock, he doesn't like to be bothered, and if you leave him alone he'll fall asleep in the crossties."

Jones has been to the big dance twice with no luck, yet he's thankful for the experience and looking forward to his best chance so far.

"I won an elimination in 2000 with Uhadadream (1:53.2, \$644,852) and got parked three-wide to the quarter and finished seventh in the final, only beaten four lengths," Jones recalled. "That horse could leave and I thought we'd be on top before we hit the first turn.

"Last year, with Prestidigitator (1:52.2, \$869,608), we got plugged up in the outer flow behind horses that didn't fire going off Lasix. Again, we were done around the first turn and finished eighth, placed seventh."

Prestidigitator is also on the comeback trail. "We gave Prestidigitator three months off over the winter because he had such a tough year," said Jones. "He was really beat up after last season. He won the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Final in his last start of 2012. He raced 17 times, but none of them were easy starts. He probably won't race him in a stake race before September.

Meadowlands May Handle Up 49.6 Percent

The Meadowlands Racetrack posted a May to remember and certainly got the Championship Meet off on the right foot. For the month, the Meadowlands showed a total handle increase of 49.6 percent. That figure included a 57 percent increase in the export wagering and an 8 percent increase in on-track wagering when compared to 2012. For the year, the Meadowlands overall handle has shown an increase of 31 percent.

"This season has been nothing short of extraordinary," said Jason Settlemoir, General Manager/C.E.O. of New Meadowlands Racetrack LLC. "The gains we showed in the winter were fantastic, but keeping that momentum throughout the month of May, which historically is not one of our strongest months, is a very encouraging sign."

As good as May was for the Meadowlands, the first day of June was even better. A packed house filled the East Rutherford oval for "Jersey-Fest 2013," an event offering live music, food, discounted drinks, and fun for everyone. Saturday, June 1, showed a 15 percent increase in live handle and 50 percent increases in both export wagering and attendance.

"Jersey-fest showed that event marketing works," said Settlemoir. "While we offer the best harness racing product in the world, we understand that our racetrack needs to do more than that. We need to make it a great experience for everyone. To see over 6,000 people packed into Paddock Park enjoying their evening with us was an inspiring sight. It has enhanced my belief that we are headed in the right direction and as we continue to come up with great events for our fans, I feel that that the best is yet to come as we get closer to moving into our brand new facility." (*Meadowlands*)

Campbell Fine On "Equuleus" Drive Upheld

At its monthly meeting on Wednesday (June 5), the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission voted to uphold a \$150 fine levied against driver John Campbell for his drive on Odds On Equuleus on Sept. 29, 2012, at The Red Mile, when the judges placed the horse from first to seventh. The judges ruled that Campbell took his horse up "abruptly...causing confusion among trailing horses."

Alan Leavitt, the only Standardbred representative on the 14-person Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, voted against the fine being upheld, but noted that voting about

the amount of the fine did not address the matter of whether or not the judges' action was correct.

"The only thing that could be considered by the commission for the vote, because of the statute, was whether or not the fine of \$150 was appropriate," said Leavitt. "Placings cannot be appealed in Kentucky. I realize it is a big deal to reverse a commission official, but this is the one case that should be re-examined. The Kentucky rule is that placings cannot be appealed and reversed."

At a hearing on Nov. 19, 2012, Campbell was issued a \$150 fine, which he subsequently appealed.

In April 2013, Robin Schadt, who trains Odds On Equuleus for Odds On Racing, said their attorney was preparing a motion that will be filed in Circuit Court in Kentucky to appeal the disqualification. (*harnessracing.com*)

Tioga's Cross Promotion Has Gingras Pitching

It was a home run for the sport of harness racing on Tuesday evening, June 4, 2013. Superstar driver Yannick Gingras has won many of the top races in his sport, but now he can cross off an honor in another sport: throwing out the ceremonial first pitch at a professional baseball game.

Gingras was the honored guest Tuesday night as the Binghamton Mets took the field against the Trenton Thunder at NYSEG Stadium in Binghamton, N.Y. Gingras walked to the pitcher's mound and delivered an almost perfect strike, then watched as the future stars of the New York Mets took the field, wearing a replica version of Gingras's recognizable green, yellow, and white driving colors.

After Tuesday night's game, the special edition uniforms were autographed by the baseball players and will be auctioned off during live racing at Tioga Downs on Sunday afternoon. All proceeds will benefit pancreatic cancer research, a cause which has personal significance to Gingras.

"I don't normally get nervous before a big race, but I have to admit, I was a little nervous out there on the pitcher's mound," said Gingras, a Quebec, Canada native and self-proclaimed baseball novice. "But I'm so honored to be part of this great event and really hope a lot of the baseball fans will come out to Tioga Downs and experience harness racing in person."

On Sunday, fans at Tioga Downs will receive a replica version of Gingras's racing colors for free while supplies last.

This promotion is part of a series of events leading up to the \$200,000 Roll With Joe and \$200,000 Artiscap, two of the premier races for pacers on Sunday, June 9. Gingras will drive top contenders in both races, Sweet Lou in the Roll With Joe and Rocklamation in the Artiscap. (*Tioga Downs*)

MTR Makes Final \$25 Mil Payment

MTR Gaming Group Inc. announced on Monday (June 3) the remittance of the second and final payment for its operating license to the Ohio Lottery Commission for its Scioto Downs Racino in the amount of \$25 million.

Scioto Downs, which opened June 1, 2012, was the first race track in the state to receive a license to operate video lottery terminals. The Las Vegas-style gaming property has been warmly received by both the community and its customers.

"Scioto Downs has performed above and well beyond what we initially expected," said Joseph L. Billhimer, MTR Gaming Group Inc. Acting President and Chief Operating Officer. "When we look back one year from now we were elated that this magnificent property opened ahead of schedule and well under-budget and now, a year later, we are ecstatic about the performance of the property and all of our team members at Scioto Downs."

The property's performance has exceeded the expectations of the Ohio Lottery too. The Ohio Lottery estimated that the state's share of revenue from Scioto Downs would be approximately \$3 million a month. Through April the casino has averaged \$3.7 million dollars a month in payments, or 23% more than expected and has contributed more than \$37 million dollars to state coffers. (MTR Gaming)

Simpson 2013 Delaware Wall Of Fame Honoree

James W. "Jim" Simpson, president and chief executive officer of Hanover Shoe Farm, has been selected as the 29th Little Brown Jug Wall of Fame honoree by the Delaware County Fair.

Like many of the greats in the sport, Jim Simpson followed his father John's footsteps as a successful driver and trainer. The younger Simpson handled such stars as Sugar-cane Hanover (1:54.3; \$1,706,465) and Noxie Hanover, whose speed record of 1:55 as a two-year-old filly trotter stood for nearly 20 years. He also trained many of the fillies who became noted producers in Hanover's star studded broodmare band.

In 1992, Simpson traded his maroon and white driver's colors for the orange and blue attire of Hanover Shoe Farms where he became vice president. The famed Hanover, Pennsylvania nursery has bred a record fourteen Little Brown Jug champions, ten Hambletonian winners and has been the world's leading Standardbred breeder every year for as long as records have been kept. Simpson was promoted to the position of president and CEO at Hanover in 1997.

Simpson is a director of the Hambletonian and Little Brown Jug Societies and achieved the pinnacle of recogni-

tion in the sport when he joined his father and brother John Simpson, Jr. in the Harness Racing Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY, in July of 2011.

Simpson will be presented the Wall of Fame jacket and ring during the 2013 Little Brown Jug week (September 15-19). (Delaware County Fair)
