

“War Of The Words” In North America Cup

Elimination winners Vegas Vacation, Fool Me Once and Captaintreacherous will start from posts two, three and four, respectively, in Saturday night’s \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup for 3-year-old colt pacers at Mohawk Racetrack.

The connections of the trio of elim winners earned the right to choose their post, which led to a “war of words” of sorts at the luncheon draw held Tuesday afternoon, June 11, at Mohawk. When asked by master of ceremonies Ken Middleton as to his chances to win Saturday night’s rich contest, Vegas Vacation’s driver Scott Zeron answered, “I think I’ve got the winner!”

Moments later Middleton asked Sylvain Filion, pilot of Fool Me Once, what he thought of the draw and his chances, to which Canada’s 2012 Driver of the Year replied, “I think Scott is wrong! We have the winner!”

While Captaintreacherous’s trainer Tony Alagna, who will also send out Wake Up Peter, second to Fool Me Once in the elims, did not attend the luncheon and did not have a chance to respond, driver Tim Tetrick also believes he is behind the soon-to-be NA Cup champion.

“It’s no gimme. My horse could get beat, that’s for sure, but I still think we have the best horse,” said Tetrick of Captaintreacherous, who is just \$26,000 shy of reaching the \$1-million mark in career earnings. “Every time everybody doubts him he shows up and wins races. I feel like we’re the favorite. It’s our horse’s race to win or lose. He’s done everything right so far.

“I feel very, very confident going into the race. We have a good starting spot that will give me options.”

With his career-best 1:48.4 win in the NA Cup elims, Captaintreacherous remained unbeaten in four career starts over the Mohawk racetrack, including last year’s \$1 million Metro final. The son of 2008 NA Cup champion Somebeach-

somewhere gave his connections an anxious moment in his elim when upstart Captive Audience came up alongside at the seven-eighths mark, but the bid was rebuffed by the reigning U.S. Pacer of the Year.

"Last week, at the seven-eighths as soon as that other horse got up next to him he grabbed right on and there was no question," said Tetrick.

Fool Me Once's 1:48.1 effort in his NA Cup elim is the fastest mile posted thus far in 2013 by a sophomore colt pacer. A son of Art Major, Fool Me Once has won four of five starts this year after a four-win freshman campaign that included a pair of Grand Circuit victories at The Red Mile. Fool Me Once advanced to the finals of both the Metro and Breeders Crown but post position eight in both contests pretty much sealed his fate of not earning a check.

"Everything is lining up so far," said Mark Austin, who trains the colt. "He had a couple issues last year, battling a virus and bad post positions. I'm a smaller operation where you are not going to gut your horse when you have a bad post, and you're trying to save the horse for races later on last year, plus this year. You're trying to protect him a little bit and it seems like it's worked good this year."

Austin shares ownership of Fool Me Once with Dan Smith, who was a co-owner of 1997 North America Cup winner Gothic Dream. It took some fast thinking by Austin and Smith at the 2011 Harrisburg yearling sale to buy Fool Me Once. Because the bidding fell just short of the reserve set by breeder Roll The Dice Stable, the pair was able to buy Fool Me Once immediately afterward.

"He went through the sale and there was a reserve on him for \$70,000," remembered Austin. "Dan and I saw that he wasn't sold, so we went back and saw (consignor) Bob Boni (of Northwood Bloodstock Agency) and we ended up buying him for \$70,000."

Fool Me Once is a full brother to the \$905,000-winning Feel Like A Fool, who started in the 2011 NA Cup elims but did not advance to the final.

As for starting from post three on Saturday, Austin said he is hoping for some déjà vu.

"It's the post we left from last week (in the NA Cup elims), and I think it's one of the better spots to leave from at Mohawk," said Austin.

Vegas Vacation, who won his NA Cup elimination in 1:49, is a perfect four-for-four in 2013 after gaining a "bridesmaid" reputation last year with six second-place finishes in 10 starts. The son of 2001 NA Cup champ Bettor's Delight is trained by Casie Coleman, who won the 2010 renewal with Sportswriter.

"There's a lot of front speed. Vegas is very versatile. We're lucky that way," Coleman told Woodbine media director Greg Gangle earlier this week. "He can blast off the gate, he can come first-over, come off the helmet. His best trip is if somehow Scott (Zeron) can get second-over. But it's going to be interesting for sure. He's coming into the race in great shape." — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Where Did The NA Cup Winners Start?

Taking a look at the most successful starting spots in North America Cup final history, it's been nothing but posts two, five and six the past decade. That includes the entire six-year history of the race since it moved to Mohawk in 2007, with three wins for post two, two for post five and once for post six.

You have to go back 10 years to 2003 to find a post other than those three that won the race, that being Yankee Cruiser, who started from post three at Woodbine.

In the 29-year history of the Cup, post five is easily the most successful with nine victories. Post five this year belongs to Twilight Bonfire, who landed a spot in the race only after winning the draw amongst the fourth-place finishers in the elims.

Post 10 has never sent out a NA Cup champion, while post nine has had just one (1999, The Panderosa).

Captaintreacherous, the morning-line favorite for this year's race, will also be bucking history when he starts from post four. The spot also has just one win to its credit, that coming back in 1998 when Runnymede Lobell won the race at Greenwood.

Eye On Mohawk

Saturday night's early Pick 4 on races 4-7 at Mohawk Race-track offers a \$100,000 guaranteed pool with a minimum 20-cent wager. The exotic starts with a conditioned pace and includes the Fan Hanover and Pepsi North America Cup, the latter race the concluding leg. Weekend Preview's Gordon Waterstone offers his selections:

RACE 4

SHIPPS XPECTANCY is stepping way up in class off two huge victories but appears able to handle the jump over an inconsistent field. IDEAL RACE had a tough trip last time out at this level as the betting favorite. DONAU, BARE NECESSITY, THE LADIES MAN and THE PANINSULAHOTEL appear best of the rest.

RACE 5

I LUV THE NITELIFE handled all of these except one (Jersey-licious) in the elimination, shouldn't have any trouble this time around either.

RACE 6

This will be the third start back for ALL SPEED HANOVER after missing all of 2012. Should be third time the charm for the 2010 Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace champ and the winner of the 2011 NA Cup consolation. The challenge will likely come from MYSTICIAN, who has hit his stride with back-to-back wins and TRANSCENDING, who was a half-length shy of the former as the toteboard chalk.

RACE 7

The NA Cup champ should come from one of the three elimination winners, and although I'd love to put Vegas Vacation on top simply because I just had a Vegas vacation, I believe FOOL ME ONCE will get the trip of a lifetime and land in the winner's circle. CAPTAIN TREACHEROUS is the obvious favorite and there's no reason to fault except to try and beat the chalk. And beware if VEGAS VACATION can turn the outside trip around and get cover.

From Safe Arrival To Sunshine Beach

Montreal owner Conrad Leber has waited 33 years to get another crack at a \$1-million purse. It'll finally happen Saturday when Sunshine Beach, a 3-year-old pacer that he co-owns with Hudson Standardbred Stable and Diane Bertrand, competes at Mohawk Racetrack in the Pepsi North America Cup.

Leber's last try for a million-dollar purse came in 1980 with Safe Arrival. He was up against the mighty Niatross in the Meadowlands Pace eliminations. Driven by Herve Filion, Safe Arrival parked Niatross early and the champion broke, but in one of his most remarkable performances, recovered and managed to finish fourth and advance to the final, which he won. Safe Arrival finished fifth in the elimination and wound up in the \$50,000 consolation, which he won.

"I haven't slept since the eliminations (where Sunshine Beach finished third to Captaintreachers)," said Leber, 88. "I want to get it over with, and at the same time I don't. It's making me feel 28."

Leber's last try for a million-dollar purse came in 1980 with Safe Arrival. He was up against the mighty Niatross in the Meadowlands Pace eliminations.

Safe Arrival's win in the \$250,000 Graduate final at Meadowlands was one of the biggest victories in the sport for Leber, a retired painting and decorating contractor who has owned Standardbreds since 1967. Another came with Amazing Dealer in a \$300,000 Coupe des E'leveurs final in Montreal.

Selling his condo in Florida left Leber with extra cash and he told trainer Mark Steacy that he wanted in on a good horse. Offered a quarter of \$85,000 yearling Sunshine Beach, he jumped at the chance.

Though he no longer drives, Leber will be exactly where he wants to be Saturday, trackside at Mohawk. "It took me 33 years to get in this position again. I hope it doesn't take 33 years until the next one." — By Paul Delean (*Standardbred Canada Trot Insider*)

Cup Contender Insights

David Miller, driving Twilight Bonfire (5): "Hopefully, he'll benefit from last week's elim and he'll be a little faster. It will be a race every step of the way. I'm sure someone from the outside is going to take a shot. The top horses will be trying to put themselves in the position to be the last one to the front, so it's going to be tough. I still give Captainteacherous the nod."

Ron Pierce, driving Wake Up Peter (6): "I like my post. The 6 is a great spot. A couple of horses on the outside will be getting out of there. They know they've got to get involved early. Ideally, I'd like to see the top boys get to the three-quarters in 1:18 and me be about four (lengths) off at the head of the stretch. If they mix it up enough early, no one can pace home as fast as my horse. But who knows, maybe I'll look over and see something and I'll be leaving. I'll take things as they come."


Chris Christoforou, driving Sunshine Beach (7): "He's going to need a trip. He's not very quick-footed; it takes him awhile to get going. But once he gets into high gear he's alright. They told me before I got on him the first time that he was a pacer but you have to drive him like a trotter. Any sudden movement he's not good with. That's why last week he would have been better, but he got jammed up in the last turn and then I had to baby him. But once I got him into gear he was OK, but by then the race is over. He's one of those horses that if he gets into the right spot he can do some damage."

John Campbell, driving Odds On Equuleus (8): "I was very happy with his race last week. He didn't have a good week the week before the elimination so I was very encouraged and happy with his race. He's having a much better week this week going into the final so I think he'll race even better than he did in the elimination. It's a detriment when you draw outside with all the horses to beat inside you; no question, it's not ideal. But there's no sense dwelling on that since there's nothing we can do to change that. We just have to work with what's available once the gate folds."

North America Cup History

The 2013 edition of the North America Cup is the 30th edition of the race. The Cup was raced at Greenwood from 1984-93, followed by Woodbine from 1994-2006. It was held at Mohawk Racetrack for the first time in 2007. The shortest-priced winners, at \$2.70, are Jate Lobell and Presidential Ball, while Goalie Jeff, in 1989, provided the highest win payoff, \$93.60. The first \$1 million Cup final was the 1987 edition, won by Jate Lobell.

NJ-Sired Fillies Set To Continue Rivalry In Fan Hanover

While Somwherovrainbow, the queen of the 2012 Two-Year-Old Filly Pacing division, is enjoying her regular life at trainer George Teague Jr.'s stable in Delaware, her contemporaries will be battling in the \$391,882 Fan Hanover final on Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack.

The race will feature another rematch between the New Jersey-sired fillies I LuvThe Nitelife and Jerseylicious. Those two fillies have raced against each other twice previously this year and each has beaten the other.

I LuvThe Nitelife will start with an advantage in the Fan Hanover. She won the single Fan Hanover elimination and thus earned the right to have her connections pick her post position, which will put her in post position 4. Jerseylicious took a bye for the Fan Hanover and thus was subjected to the luck of the draw and had little, landing post 8.

Chris Ryder, who trains I LuvThe Nitelife for Richard and Joanne Young, is confident about his filly's chances.

"Everything is lined up well," said Ryder. "We have a good starting post, she's eating well and seems fine. She went :26.4 to the quarter (when she made her move to take the lead) and :26.4 finishing, so that's pretty good, right? I think Jerseylicious and Belle Boyd are the top threats."

In addition to her win in the Fan Hanover elim, I LuvThe Nitelife has already proven she is comfortable at Mohawk

on big race nights. Last year she won the Eternal Camnation and She's A Great Lady Stakes at Mohawk, which comprised much of her freshman bankroll of \$689,530.

Jerseylicious, whose biggest win thus far came in last year's Sweetheart Pace on Hambletonian Day at the Meadowlands, enjoyed 10 days at home before trainer Wayne Givens loaded her up for the trip to Ontario on Tuesday morning, June 11.

"I tried to freshen her up a little," said Givens of Jerseylicious, who has 11 starts this year, when asked why he opted to skip the Fan Hanover elim and try to earn the right to pick his post position. "She doesn't need a lot of work between races though. I train her some, but not very fast—I might blow her out a mile in 2:20 is all."

Before the Fan Hanover final, Jerseylicious finished second in the \$150,000 New Jersey Sires Stakes final on June 1. With that race she increased her 2012 earnings to \$111,010 for Givens, who races as Legacy Racing of Delaware, and Pamela Curran, also of Delaware.

"Hopefully, we'll get some racing luck," said Givens of the outside post for the Fan Hanover Final.

Givens knows all about bad luck at Mohawk. Last year he learned after the She's A Great Lady that Jerseylicious was sick, which explained her poor performance. In 2011 he won an elimination of the North America Cup with Powerful Mist, but in the final "we were behind Big Bad John after he took the lead and then he just backed up," Givens recalled of his horse's sixth-place finish. — *By Kathy Parker*

Elim Winners Earn Respect, But Other Fillies Threats Too

Elimination winners Bee A Magician and Angies Lucky Star are morning line choices to win the \$364,266 Elegan-timage final for 3-year-old trotting fillies after they captured their eliminations in 1:53.3 and 1:53.1, respectively.

Bee A Magician has earned plenty of respect as the daughter of Kadabra is undefeated in four starts this year. Angies Lucky Star isn't undefeated but has been ultra consistent, winning two of four starts and finishing second and third in her other outings.

But there are other fillies in the race who have also shown the kind of speed it will take to win, most notably To Dream On, the 2012 Two-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year. Other fillies to watch are Mistery Woman, who took a mark of 1:53.3 as a 2 year old; Shared Past, who tacked two 1:53.4 miles on her resume this year in winning New Jersey Sires Stakes at the Meadowlands but suffered from being parked out in a :27.3 third quarter in her Elegan-timage elim; and Princess Lilly, who finished second to Bee A Magician in the Elegan-timage elim.

Yannick Gingras will be driving To Dream On, who set the pace in her Elegan-timage elim before fading to third, beaten 4 3/4 lengths by Bee A Magician.

"That :26.4 (opening) quarter might have taken a bit too much out of her," said Gingras a few days after the race. "I still think she's the best horse in the division. Nifty's filly

(Bee A Magician, trained by Richard "Nifty" Norman) is a great filly, but I've got confidence in my filly too.

"I think she's going to be better in the final," continued Gingras. "At Vernon, she just wasn't 100 percent and then she got doubled up. She probably needed that race last week."

Another filly who can't be counted out is Mistery Woman, who starts from post 1. David Miller will be driving Mistery Woman, who his wife, Misty, owns in partnership with Millstream Inc., William J. Donovan and Aldebaran Park Inc.

Mistery Woman took a mark of 1:53.3 last season and in addition to her fourth-place finish in her Elegan-timage elim, she shows a win and a second thus far this year.

Miller said he is hopeful she'll step up her game in the Elegan-timage final, and a big help will be their inside starting post.

"I think she's definitely a horse who will benefit from last week's race. I think she's going to be better in the final," said Miller. "This filly has the speed. Last week in the elim the horse I was following let go in the last turn and backed up, so I think that hurt her."

Jonas Czernyson trains Mistery Woman and Shared Past, who drew post 9 for the Elegan-timage final. Although Shared Past has a solid resume of speed this season, her outside starting post puts her at a significant disadvantage with Bee A Magician, Angies Lucky Star, To Dream On and Mistery Woman all inside. — By Kathy Parker

ONES TO WATCH

The stakes weekend gets underway early with 3-year-old pacing colts who are just a notch below the North America Cup contenders competing Friday in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes at Harrah's Philadelphia. Post time at Harrah's is 12:40 p.m. and the Sires Stakes will be Races 3, 5 and 11.

New York-sired 3-year-old pacing colts will be in action at Yonkers Raceway Friday night. The four divisions include Art Rooney Pace winner **Doctor Butch** (Race 7).

Also on Friday night, the \$122,000 Maywood Filly Pace will feature Illinois-breds. The 7-5 morning line choice is **Auniquequisition**, who is trained by Donna Lee Ozment, the mother of horseman Tony Alagna. The Maywood Filly Pace is Race 7 on the Maywood card, with first post 7:10 p.m. (CDT).

Also on Friday night, the Pennsylvania Stallion Series for 3-year-old trotting colts at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs has attracted enough horses to fill six divisions (Races 2, 4, 6, 8, 15 and 16). The card also will feature **Hurrikane Kingcole** in the \$25,000 Preferred Pace (Race 10) and **Guccio** in the \$25,000 Preferred Trot (Race 12).

When the dust settles at Mohawk Racetrack Saturday night following the contesting of the five major stakes on the card, there is still the 11th race, the \$100,000 Gold Cup Invitational. The Ron Burke-trained Foiled Again and Won The West scored victories in the race in 2011 and 2012, respectively, and the continent's leading trainer will aim for a three-peat with a pair of entries in **Fred And Ginger** and **Camaes Fellow**.

Fred And Ginger, who finished sixth in the 2010 North America Cup, starts from post two after a hard-fought victory in the TVG FFA on June 1 at the Meadowlands. He also

enters the race just \$6,010 shy of the \$1-million mark in career earnings. As for Camaes Fellow, who starts from post 10, the 5-year-old son of Mach Three was a private purchase in April and after finishing second in his first start in the Burke barn, he has won three straight, including a 1:48.1f effort June 1 at Pocono Downs that equaled the world record for older geldings on a five-eighths mile track.

Also in the Gold Cup is **Warrawee Needy**, who is three-for-three in Canada earlier this year at Woodbine but has made his last four starts in the U.S. Saddled with outside posts, Warrawee Needy's best finish was a second in the Meadowlands Maturity. The Carl Jamieson-trained 4 year old didn't fare any better at the post draw on Saturday as he starts from the nine hole.

On Sunday, stakes action continues at Pocono Downs and Tioga Downs. Tioga races in the afternoon (first post 1:30 p.m.) and the card will include Historic Stakes for 3 year olds (Races 1, 3, 5 and 7). Also of note, 2012 Breeders Crown champion **Heston Blue Chip** will make his second start of the season in the \$16,000 Open Pace (Race 6).

Sunday night at Pocono, three divisions of Pennsylvania Sires Stakes for 3-year-old trotting colts are slated. They feature **Creatine**, a 1:52.2 winner this year, and **Dontyouforgetit** in Race 10, while last year's Peter Haughton Memorial winner **Aperfectyankee** and **Celebrity Maserati**, who has a 1:53f sophomore mark, will square off in Race 12. In Race 11, **Romantic Moment** will start from post 4 to take on the tough trifecta of **Economy Terror**, **Drop The Ball** and **Bettor B Lucky**, who will be starting from posts 7, 8 and 9, respectively, in the \$25,000 Preferred Pace for mares.

Baby Races At Meadowlands Saturday

Once again, baby races will be held at the Meadowlands on Saturday morning, June 15, beginning at 10 a.m., with 19 races. Among the rookies will be 17 offspring from the first crop of Muscle Hill, the 2009 Horse of the Year.

Through Wednesday, June 11, three pacers had taken 1:55 marks in baby races to lead that gait's speed parade: Somesizesomestyle (Somebeachsomewhere-Honey Bunny, by Precious Bunny) and Somestarsomewhere (Somebeachsomewhere-Lovely Assistant, by Art Major), both trained by Ron Burke, and Always A Miki (Always A Virgin-Artstopper, by Artsplace), trained by Joe Holloway. The Burke rookies were \$50,000 (Somesizesomestyle) and \$110,000 yearlings while Always A Miki was bred by owner Joe Hurley's RollThe Dice Stable. The fastest of the trotters through June 11 was Lifetime Pursuit (Cantab Hall-Queen Of Grace, by Yankee Glide), bred and owned by Brittany Farms and trained by Jimmy Takter.

Peace Corps Dead At 26

Peace Corps 3,1:52.4 (\$4,137,737), the five-time (1988-1992) divisional trotting champion, died in Mallorca, Spain, in November 2012 at the age of 26, it was learned Thursday, June 13, from her owner, John Bootsman of Boko Stables.

"You take care of them and give them dignity, but at the end, that was not possible and you have to take care of them," said Bootsman. "She had a good life on Mallorca (an island off the coast of Spain)."

Peace Corps, who raced from 1988 to 1994, was the top money-winning female Standardbred in the world until overtaken by Moni Maker. Early in her career, she was trained by Tom Houghton and started in the 1989 Hambletonian, which was won in a dead heat by Park Avenue Joe and Probe. Peace Corps was third to that duo.

The race was expected to be a much anticipated showdown between Peace Corps and Valley Victory, both dominant in their gender divisions that year. The Meadowlands, anticipating the event, had 5,000 buttons printed for fans that said, "I Like the Colt - Valley Victory," in blue and "I like the Filly - Peace Corps" in pink.

Peace Corps' buttons were distributed; Valley Victory's were not. Valley Victory became ill before the final, did not race again and went on to become an important sire. Peace Corps registered six foals in the U.S. for owner Hans Enggren; three raced, but did not vaguely approach their mother's accomplishments.

Her first foal, a filly by Mack Lobell named Meadowbranch Macki, was born at Castleton Farm in Kentucky. The filly's birth was marked by press coverage that included the front page of the state's largest newspaper, the Louisville Courier-Journal, as well as major European outlets. It prompted an

inquiry from the founder of the Peace Corps, the late Sargeant Shriver, as to the etiology of the name. No other foal of any breed had parents with earnings to surpass Meadowbranch Macki's at a combined \$8,055,331.

Peace Corps also won the Breeders Crown four times — in 1988, 1989 and as a mare in 1990 and 1992, the later years for Swedish horseman Stig H. Johansson.

Driving Tourney To Vercruysse

On Thursday (June 13), in Mauquenchy, France, Pierre Vercruysse locked up victory for the home team, guaranteeing himself enough points to win the World Driving Championship for France.

"It's a great challenge," said Vercruysse. "It looks easy but everybody really wants to win it. You have to stay concentrated. All the other drivers are good. What makes an advantage for me and Bjorn (Goop) of Sweden is that we are used to French horses. They are very different gaited."

Heading into the final race of the event, to be held at Vincennes in Paris on Saturday, Vercruysse holds a commanding points lead over Bjorn Goop of Sweden and Erik Hoitomt of Norway. With 19 points for a win, the battle is on for third place, with six drivers, including Bartlett, vying for the position.

The day did prove to be better for both U.S. rep Jason Bartlett and Trevor Henry of Canada.

Bartlett picked up his second victory of the 20-race, week-long competition when he guided Val des Malberaux to a wire-to-wire score in the day's third race, while Henry grabbed a runner-up finish in the last race of the day.

"The trainer said to keep him as calm as you can because he gets all wound up," said Bartlett. "Everything worked out exactly how we wanted it to. I warmed him up away from horses, turned him to the gate and let him get out of there easily. We just floated to the front and he was two fingers the whole time. He was getting a little tired in the stretch, but we managed to hold on."

Bartlett also picked up a second-place finish in the fifth race with Unika Sereda.

Bartlett and Henry once again drove several long priced horses on the afternoon, some of which hadn't had a flat race line in several weeks.

In the afternoon's final dash, however, driving 5-year-old Un Eclat de l'Ante, Henry left quickly off the starting gate and rushed to a hard fought lead. He held the front for most of the 2150 meter race, before being caught in the final strides by Spain's Antonio Frontera Pocovi.

"The trainer told me to go to the front," said Henry. "We got a breather and then they came at me in the backstretch. I could see him (Frontera Pocovi) coming way on the outside. I tried to get my horse to the wire, but we just got beat."

"It makes a big difference to get a decent horse," added Henry. "It feels good to have power. It's really tough getting so many horses that can't do anything."

Wheeling N Dealin, Thinking Out Loud Win Qualifiers

On Wednesday morning, three days before this year's 30th renewal of the \$1 million Pepsi North America Cup at Mohawk Racetrack, the 2012 champion Thinking Out Loud made his first appearance of 2013 a winning one as he captured a qualifier at Mohawk in 1:53.2. Also scoring qualifying victories Wednesday were Canada's 2012 Horse of the Year and Little Brown Jug winner Michael's Power and Wheeling N Dealin, the 2-year-old colt trotter divisional champion in both the U.S. and Canada last year who went undefeated in nine starts.

Thinking Out Loud was driven by Randy Waples for trainer Bob McIntosh. The son of Ponder was settled in fifth early but was quarter-pole moved to the lead, taking control by the half in :56.4. Drawing clear, Thinking Out Loud coasted to the wire 4 3/4 lengths ahead of his rivals.

A winner of \$1.2 million last year for owners Robert McIntosh Stables, CSX Stables and Al McIntosh Holdings, Thinking Out Loud's career-best 1:47.4 effort came in the North America Cup, which carried a purse of \$1.5 million last year.

Michael's Power, who already has a qualifying victory under his belt in 2013, romped home a 6 1/4-length winner in 1:52.3 for driver Scott Zeron, who was in the sulky for trainer Casie Coleman. The 4-year-old son of Camluck led gate to wire, closing out the mile with a final quarter of :27.1. Finishing second was the McIntosh-trained Dapper Dude, last year's Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champion.

Wheeling N Dealin, whose freshman season was capped off with a Breeders Crown victory, sat a pocket trip for driver Sylvain Filion before edging out in deep stretch to score by a half-length in 1:55.3. Dustin Jones trains the son of Cantab Hall.

Lederman Calls A Different Kind Of "Race"

Larry Lederman is from Manhattan, but until last Friday had been to Grand Central Terminal only once in his life.

Trip No. 2 was memorable, and not only for Lederman. The longtime race-caller, who has curtailed his workload in recent years as he battles an inoperable brain tumor, was in Grand Central Terminal's Vanderbilt Hall calling "races" for a dozen hours on June 7 as part of the festivities leading up to the Belmont Stakes.

Lederman, best known for his work at Freehold Raceway, called races between competitors who propelled mechanical ponies around in the train station. He called more than 100 races for the day.

"We had a few glitches along the way, but we kept it going and had a good time," Lederman said. "We had an international flavor, like Japan versus Norway versus Brooklyn. The person from Norway won; I said they won by a herring. The people were really good about it. It was a lot of fun."

Bugler Ryan Resky and Lederman did their best to entertain travelers passing through the station, as well as attract attention for the Belmont Stakes and activities in Grand Central Terminal.

"I told Ryan that if we didn't make noise no one would know we were there," Lederman said, adding with a laugh, "And who better to make noise than a bugler and me."

Lederman also was proud to have touted Belmont Stakes longshot winner Palace Malice. Trained by Todd Pletcher, and racing without blinkers after a 12th-place finish in the Kentucky Derby, Palace Malice won at odds of 13-1.

"I told people that if the trainer in a million-dollar race can change the (horse's) blinkers, then a bettor could afford to bet a few dollars," Lederman said. "I'm finally right after about 40 years."

On Monday, Lederman was at Gaitway Farm in central New Jersey, not far from his current home, calling qualifiers. He plans to return each of the next two Mondays when the training center hosts the races, primarily for 2-year-old horses getting ready for their career debuts.

In July, Lederman is set to call races at Tioga Downs in up-state New York. He would like to do more, but is limited by his illness.

"I get tired here and there, but we're doing the best we can," Lederman said. "I'm just following the medication. Some days get frustrating, some get even more frustrating. It's all about fate. There's nothing I can do about it anymore. I just go for MRIs every two months and so far it's been no change. I wish things weren't like this, but we have very little control."

Lederman peppered his race calls at Gaitway with a blend of humor and wit that has made him one of racing's most popular announcers. After handling the morning's 15 races,

he said he was grateful to all the people in the sport—and the fans—for their support and well wishes.

“I’d like to be more active, but I can’t take long drives or plane rides,” Lederman said. “Do I miss it? Absolutely. Do I love it? Absolutely. But you can only do what you can do. I’m just happy to be here.” (HRC)

Full Fields Driving Handle At Meadowlands

While there was nothing extraordinary about the racing program this past Saturday night at the Meadowlands, the end result provided a conclusion long thought to be true.

Despite the vast majority of the Meadowlands drivers being north of the border for The North America Cup eliminations and despite the Meadowlands program being filled with young and lower-level condition horses, the total handle for the card was \$3,039,973.

When evaluating the reasons for the success of the Saturday card, all arrows point in one direction, full fields. After scratches, a total of 122 horses went to the gate for the 13-race Saturday card, for an average of 9.4 horses per race. While stakes races often provide the most exciting racing of the meet, there are times when those fields are shorter than one would hope. As an example, the first race this past Saturday was a non-winners of one race for 3-year-old pacers, with 10 horses. The race handled \$210,108. One week earlier, the first race was a division of the Golden Girls, featuring the best pacing mares in the country. That stakes event contained a field of six horses, with a handle \$195,216.

In addition, this past Saturday the 11th race was the opening leg of the Summer Survivor Series for 3-year-old pacers meeting the non-winners of two condition. The race handled \$239,844. The week earlier, the 11th race was the \$150,000 New Jersey Sires Stakes final for 3-year-old filly pacers, with a field of seven. The race handled \$195,236.

“Coming into this racing season, it was a goal of the Meadowlands not only to post strong numbers, but to learn and understand what it is that our customers want the most,” said director of racing operations Darin Zoccali. “In a perfect world, every race would be 10 of the best horses in racing. But it is apparent that 10 horses lining up behind the gate, regardless of class, is the most important factor for our customers and we thank our horsemen for supporting us and giving us the opportunity to provide these larger fields.” (Meadowlands)

RMTC Accredits First Labs

The University of California-Davis Kenneth L. Maddy Laboratory and HFL Sport Science Inc., Lexington, Ky., became the first two fully-accredited laboratories under the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium’s (RMTC Laboratory Accreditation program.

“The accreditation of these two laboratories marks the culmination of many months of effort by each of these laboratories to demonstrate that they meet the strict standards of expertise and proficiency required by the program,” said Dr. Robert Lewis, chairperson of the RMTC board. “The accreditation process is an important step forward in protecting the welfare of our equine and human athletes as well as the integrity of horse racing.”

In addition to granting full accreditation to the above laboratories, the RMTC’s Horseracing Testing Laboratories Committee also recommended the Ohio Department of Agriculture for Interim Accreditation status as they have satisfied the initial review and External Quality Assurance Program (EQAP) requirements and are awaiting a site inspection from RMTC.

Dr. Lewis also pointed out that five other laboratories have applied for RMTC Laboratory Accreditation:

- Truesdail Laboratory (Tustin, Calif.)
- Dalare Associates (Philadelphia, Pa.)
- New York Drug Testing and Research Program (Morrisville, NY)
- Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory (West Chester, Pa.)
- Industrial Laboratories (Wheat Ridge, Colorado)

The eight laboratories that have applied for RMTC Accreditation represent 26 of the 34 jurisdictions responsible for pari-mutuel horse racing in the United States.

“The goal is to have 100 percent of the laboratories testing horse racing samples RMTC accredited,” said Dr. Dionne Benson, Executive Director and COO of the RMTC. “We encourage these laboratories and all horse racing testing laboratories to continue to pursue RMTC accreditation. The purpose of the RMTC accreditation process and Quality Assurance Program is to ensure that all laboratories are operating at the same high level of proficiency.”

Running Aces Sees Fastest Card Ever

With six of the nine races timed in 1:54 or faster, the Tuesday night, June 12, program at Running Aces was the quickest in its brief history. With 72-degree temperatures, little if any wind, and just a couple very brief rain showers, track superintendent John Betts and his staff had the Minnesota five-eighths mile oval in tip-top condition throughout the night.
