Elliott Looking To Get A “Smoother Ride” Into Beal Final

Twenty-four 3-year-old male trotters have been divided into a trio of eliminations Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs for the \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial Trot, scheduled for Saturday, June 29.

One of the favorites in the second of the three Beal eliminations is Smoother Ride, who is one-for-two this year after a nearly perfect freshman season in 2012. Smoother Ride finished fifth in his career debut as a 2 year old but then rattled off

six consecutive victories to complete his rookie campaign. The streak included a sweep through the Pennsylvania Stallion Series that culminated in a season-best 1:56.3 in the \$40,000 final Sept. 6 at Harrah's Philadelphia.

“He’s a June foal and we raced him easy last year,” said trainer Steve Elliott. “Just babied him and let

him go where he wanted to go. I kept him in the Stallion Series. I just let him learn how to be a horse.”

Elliott and Angelo Frassetto, who died June 2, purchased Smoother Ride, a son of Yankee Glide out of the Andover Hall mare Mazda Hanover, as a yearling for \$15,000. Elliott said the colt’s small stature doesn’t diminish his potential.

“He’s a small horse, but he’s very big-gaited for a small horse,” said Elliott. “He’s tough. He has that will; he likes to win. He’s a happy horse.”

After a pair of qualifying wins at Elliott’s winter base at Spring Garden Ranch in Florida, Smoother Ride won a qualifier at Harrah’s Philadelphia as a final tune-up for his sophomore campaign. Moving up into the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) this year, Smoother Ride won his debut at The Meadows on June 10. With a gap between races, Elliott qualified Smoother Ride at Gaitway Farm, with the colt scoring a 1:59 victory on a sloppy track for driver Brian Sears.

Sears then directed Smoother Ride to a second-place finish on June 16 in a PASS contest June 16 at Pocono Downs, which ended his seven-race win streak but brought his career earnings to \$114,743. Sears will again drive Smoother Ride in the Beal eliminations, leaving from post five.

“Brian qualified him in the mud and I told him he was welcome to drive him in the Sires Stakes because he drove him

in the mud. Brian said he liked him so he would,” Elliott explained. “He needed the (June 16) race since he hadn’t raced in almost a month. A 1:59 qualifier is the same as a training mile; you can’t really tighten them up off that.”

Smoother Ride is eligible to the Hambletonian, but Elliott said a start in the trotting classic will depend on how he performs against open company.

“He’s eligible and if he shows he belongs there, we’ll go there. If not, we’ll go elsewhere,” said Elliott. “He’s definitely going to be a nice trotter for years to come. He’s great gaited, he’s versatile, he has great gate speed, and he’s sound.” —By Gordon Waterstone

Minor Is Smilin About Smilin Eli

With a perfect nine-for-nine season it was no surprise Wheeling N Dealin was a runaway winner in voting for 2-Year-Old Colt Trotter of the Year honors in both the U.S. and Canada last year, which in turn led to his status as winter-book favorite to return in 2013 and again be at the top of the class.

While the Canadian-based Wheeling N Dealin has made just a pair of qualifying starts thus far this year, including

most recently a 1:57.1 nine-length romp on Wednesday, June 19, at Mohawk Race-track, a pair of upstart trotters have quickly made a name for themselves in the U.S.

Both Smilin Eli and Jurgen Hanover are undefeated this year, but something will have to give—barring a dead heat for first—this weekend as they have drawn in against each other in one of three eliminations for the \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial Trot Saturday night at Mohogan Sun at Pocono Downs. While Jurgen Hanover is the 5-2 morning-line favorite from post six, Smilin Eli is second choice at 3-1 while leaving from the outside post eight.

When the calendar turned to 2013 nobody—except for their connections—had even heard of Smilin Eli or Jurgen Hanover. Smilin Eli was unraced last year while Jurgen Hanover made just two late-season starts and has since changed barns.

Entering the Beal elims, Smilin Eli is three-for-three, including a division-best 1:52.1 score in the \$150,000 New Jersey Sires Stakes final at the Meadowlands. Jurgen Hanover goes into the Beal a perfect seven-for-seven, including a 1:53.4 victory in the \$259,900 Empire Breeders Classic at Vernon Downs, which brought his seasonal earnings to a division-high \$178,950.

Bred and owned by Nicholas Cimino, Smilin Eli is a son of Muscles Yankee out of the Enjoy Lavec mare Gerri’s Joy, the 18-1 upset winner of the 2006 Merrie Annabelle final at the Meadowlands.

“He was a big, growthy colt and it was just best for (Cimino) to shut him down,” trainer Deshawn Minor explained of Smilin Eli’s absence on the 2-year-old scene. “They had worked him in 2:15 and then decided to wait on him.”

The New Jersey-based Minor said Smilin Eli's first qualifier at the Meadowlands on May 4, when he finished third, didn't make any impact, but a wire-to-wire 1:56 victory one week later told a different tale.

"Before his first qualifier I would have told you to not count him out, but it was a big reach until I saw a little more," said Minor. "After the second qualifier it would have been a completely different answer. It looked like he was going to be something."

With Tim Tetrick driving, Smilin Eli swept the New Jersey Sires Stakes, scoring a 1:54.4 victory in the first leg that was finished off with a third-to-first last-quarter move in :26.4. After winning the second leg in 1:54.2, Smilin Eli dazzled in 1:52.1 in the June 1 final as he brought his earnings to \$108,500.

"When he came home in :26.4 in that first leg and came out of hole, he never wanted to go until Timmy gave him the word," remembered Minor. "When Timmy gave him the word the show was on, and that really, really impressed me—just as much as when he won in 1:52.1."

As for Smilin Eli's future, Minor maintains a realistic approach.

"He's so green he doesn't know what he's doing," said Minor. "So you can do what you want with him. After five or six starts we'll see what kind of horse he's going to be." — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Lynch Elims Show Depth In Pacing Filly Division

I LuvThe Nitelife easily captured the \$391,882 Fan Hanover final at Mohawk last Saturday night, winning by 5 3/4 lengths in 1:49.1, but the event was missing 2012 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year Somwherovrainbow, who skipped the race. The two fillies will face each other for the first time this year in an elimination for the James Lynch Memorial on Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

Somwherovrainbow was eligible to the Fan Hanover, but George Teague Jr., the filly's co-breeder, co-owner and trainer, opted to skip it because he didn't want her to race nine straight weeks, which would have been the case if she had raced in the Fan Hanover and then went on to the Lynch. So instead she raced on June 4 in a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes at The Meadows, winning handily in 1:51.4.

With I LuvThe Nitelife's strong Fan Hanover victory, and with Somwherovrainbow going into the Lynch elim off of an 18-day layoff, I Luv the Nitelife is certain to be favored to win the second of the two Lynch elims.

The first Lynch Memorial elim looks like more of a draw on paper. The seven-filly field includes New Jersey Sires Stakes champion Ms. Caila J Fra and the filly she beat in the New Jersey final, Jerseylicious, along with the five-time winner Shebestingin.

Trainer Steve Elliott is confident his filly Ms. Caila J Fra will be a contender in the Lynch.

"She's just a good filly," said Elliott. "They had trouble with her tying up, but I got her up here and on a program that seems to work for her. We drew a good spot with the five hole and we'll get a good trip in there because she's so handy."

Jerseylicious and her regular driver, Corey Callahan, have raced and beaten both of their top elim foes, but their battles have been close. Jerseylicious defeated Shebestingin by a neck in the Weiss final at Pocono on April 23. She also beat Ms. Caila J Fra in a New Jersey Sires Stakes leg, but was edged by a neck in the NJSS final.

Callahan said Jerseylicious was not at her best in the Fan Hanover final.

"I got the trip I wanted in the Fan Hanover—that's the trip I worked out in the New Jersey Sires Stakes final too—and I had a lot of pace in the last turn, but then she just came up short," said Callahan of leaving fast from post 8 with his filly and dropping in second before moving to the front and then yielding to I LuvThe Nitelife.

"I think the week off hurt her," Callahan added, noting that trainer Wayne Givens had opted to take a bye and not race in the Fan Hanover elimination. "I don't think anybody was going to beat (Chris) Ryder's mare (I LuvThe Nitelife), but my mare wasn't nearly as sharp as she was in the Jersey final."

David Miller will be driving the Joe Holloway-trained Shebestingin, who has five wins in six starts this season and is coming into the race after an easy New York Sires Stakes victory at Tioga Downs on June 9.

"I think a lot of this filly," said Miller. "She hasn't really been pushed yet and she's pretty versatile. She can race any way you want." — *By Kathy Parker*

Improving Lonewolf Currier Ready For Hempt

For most people a “Sears Charge” means a credit card for one of the world’s largest department store chains. In the \$275,000 Art Rooney Pace final June 1 at Yonkers Raceway, there was a different meaning for the phrase as the Brian Sears-driven Lonewolf Currier charged from 8 1/2 lengths behind in eighth at the half to a second-place finish, beaten just a half length.

Lonewolf Currier’s “Sears Charge” with driver Sears came following a slow start from post seven. He paced an unofficial back half in :53.4, with the son of The Panderosa closing out his runner-up finish with a final quarter of :26.1.

Lonewolf Currier followed up his Rooney final effort with a career-best 1:49.3 score in a Pennsylvania Sires Stakes division on June 14 at Harrah’s Philadelphia, which in turn has led the Kevin McDermott trainee to be installed the 5-2 morning-line favorite in the first of three eliminations of the \$500,000 Max Hempt Memorial Pace on Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.


“He had a couple bad post positions at Yonkers so I took him off the gate, but he really seemed to agree with it and really showed some good kick home,” said Sears. “He’s been pretty sharp the past few starts. He can really sprint for a ways; he has a really quick engine and can go fast for a piece. That race (Rooney final) was pretty impressive because not too many can do that.”

Owned by Fran Azur, Lonewolf Currier was a \$110,000 yearling purchase from breeder Hanover Shoe Farms. Originally named Lonewolf Hanover, the colt is a full brother to the \$405,000-winner Lookout Hanover. His dam, the Cam’s Card Shark mare Ladyking, is a half-sibling to several star performers, including the 2007 Miss New Jersey winner Current Hanover. Lonewolf Currier enters the Hempt elims with six wins in 10 career starts and \$194,244 in earnings.

Lonewolf Currier will start from post two in his elim, taking on a field that includes 2012 New Jersey Sires Stakes champ and 2013 runner-up Johnny Rock, and more impor-

tantly perhaps, doesn’t include newly-crowned North America Cup champion Captaintreacherous, who starts in the third elimination.

“It looks like he drew a pretty spot so hopefully it works out,” said Sears, who will also drive NA Cup elimination winner Vegas Vacation in that third elim and could have a choice of mounts to make if both horses advance to the final. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Start No. 2 For Market Share In TVG FFA

Market Share, the New Jersey-sired son of Revenue, will step up to the starting line in the 10th race on Friday night at the Meadowlands, facing nine others in the \$50,000 TVG/Meadowlands Free for All Trot.

Market Share, driven by Tim Tetrick and trained by Linda Toscano, won the 2012 Hambletonian on his way to 3-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year honors. This will be his second start of the year. He won his 2013 debut on May 31 in 1:51.1.

Coupled in the wagering with Wishing Stone, the winner of the Maxie Lee at Harrah’s Philadelphia, Market Share is rated the 8-5 favorite from post eight.

Lifetime, Market Share has 16 wins, five seconds and three thirds from 26 starts for a bankroll of \$2,052,655. (SBOANJ)

Arch Madness Returns For TVG FFA Trot

After facing some of the best trotters in Europe in last month's Elitlopp, Arch Madness is back in the States and ready to tackle another tough group.

The 9-year-old Arch Madness, who was second in the Elitlopp for the second consecutive year, faces nine rivals in Friday's third round of the TVG Free For All Championship Series for older trotters at the Meadowlands Racetrack. The top point-getters in nine preliminary rounds will return for a \$500,000 final on Nov. 30 at the Big M.

Friday's race includes Maxie Lee Memorial winner Wishing Stone, currently the No. 2-ranked horse in harness racing's Top 10, as well as Cutler Memorial champ Sevruga, last season's champion 3-year-old Market Share, and recent world-record-setters Uncle Peter and Guccio.

Arch Madness missed the first two rounds of the TVG series because he was overseas. Prior to heading to Europe, he was third behind Wishing Stone and Sevruga in a free-for-all handicap on May 3 at the Meadowlands, beaten by 1 1/2 lengths in a race timed in 1:51.2.

He was scheduled to race in the Oslo Grand Prix, but was scratched after tying up prior to the race. Two weeks later at Solvalla Racetrack in Sweden, Arch Madness finished fourth in his Elitlopp elimination and returned later in the day to finish second to Nahar in the final despite starting from an outside post.

"I was pleased with the final result, but he still never really got a chance to show his true potential," said trainer-driver Trond Smedshammer. "He wasn't as good there as he was his last start here before I shipped him. He tied up and I had



to scratch him (in Norway) and it was three weeks between races. When you're away from home it's tough. But the final result was good, so I'm not disappointed in any way.

"So many things have to go right for you to win those major races. To ship over there and win that race ... there have been outstanding American horses that have done it, so it certainly can be done, but it's tough."

Arch Madness has won 31 of 94 career starts and earned \$3.91 million for owners Marc Goldberg and Willow Pond. He will start Friday's TVG race from post 10.

"He seems good," Smedshammer said. "He's been in training; he hasn't been any fast miles. I'm probably going to train him a little bit quicker (Tuesday). He looks good and healthy. We'll see when he starts racing. It's a tough bunch of horses there. I don't expect him to beat them, but you've got to start racing him and getting him back in shape." (HRC)

Baby Races Saturday At Meadowlands, Mohawk

Once again, baby races will be held at the Meadowlands on Saturday morning, June 22, beginning at 10 a.m., with 18 races. Among the rookies will be 12 offspring from the first crop of Muscle Hill, the 2009 Horse of the Year.

Mohawk Racetrack will also be busy Saturday morning as 24 baby races are scheduled. Included among the starters is a 17-horse troupe from the Bob McIntosh Stable, among them 16 homebreds. Post time is 10 a.m.

Through Wednesday, June 19, speed-badge honors on the pacing side went to Unlocked, who has already embarked on the pari-mutuel trail at Balmoral Park. On June 16, Unlocked (Duneside Perch-Miss Major Power, by Fighting Major), was an eight-length winner in 1:53.3.

The fastest of the trotters through June 19 was the filly Lifetime Pursuit (Cantab Hall-Queen Of Grace, by Yankee Glide), bred and owned by Brittany Farms and trained by Jimmy Takter. Lifetime Pursuit won her debut in 1:57.2 and then followed that up on June 15 with a 1:57.4 victory. Sumatra (Muscles Yankee-Lola Seelster, by Credit Winner) is the fastest colt via a 1:57.4 victory June 17 at Gaitway Farm.

NY Plan For Casinos; Gural Says He'll Bid

New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo has reached a deal with lawmakers to license four Las Vegas-style casinos as a way to boost the state's upstate economy. Under New York law, casino gambling must be approved by the legislature in two consecutive sessions, and then passed by the public via referendum. Voters will have the final say in November.

According to reports, Cuomo's plan calls for two rounds of casino licensing—first for four updated facilities, then seven years later another three casinos in locations to be determined. On Thursday (June 20), Cuomo also announced the appointment of the New York Gaming Commission.

Cuomo also has struck a deal with Native American tribes, guaranteeing them exclusive areas for their casinos in exchange for a \$50 million annual tax payment to the state.

With the exclusives given to the Native American tribes, only three of six regions slated for full gambling licenses remain: the Saratoga-Capital District, the Hudson Valley-Catskills area and the Southern Tier near the Pennsylvania state line.

Tioga Downs is located in the Southern Tier region and track operator Jeff Gural said he will bid for a full casino license.

"I think I'll be OK in all of this," Gural told harnessracing.com. "We still have to see the bill that's actually passed. The way it looks right now, for me the risk is that someone will come into my region and bid against me.

I think that's unlikely, and I remain optimistic, especially since I can open so quickly. I already have an open facility, permits, and the people of the area are ok with gaming where we are at."

Gural said that while Vernon Downs will not be eligible for a Vegas-style casino because it is located just down the road from the Oneida tribe's Turning Stone Casino, he believes Vernon's business could benefit from the deal Cuomo made with the Native American tribes.

"In the long run, I think this helps me that Turning Stone has to pay \$50 million in taxes. That could mean they won't have the money to be so competitive with me." —harnessracing.com

Decline Of Revenue To PA Horse Fund Continues

Warmer temperatures and the beginning of the summer race season were not enough to stave off the continued downward trend in racetrack casino slots revenues as another 2.8 percent decline was reported for the month of May, compared to the same month in 2012. The decrease in slots revenue caused funding for the state's Race Horse Development Fund—which supports live horse racing and breeding in the state—to decrease by approximately \$650,000 for the month of May compared to last year.

"Although the declines in revenue for May was slightly lower than previous months, we have seen steady declines for the Race Horse Development Fund in 10 of the past 11 months," said Pete Peterson, spokesperson for the Pennsylvania Equine Coalition. "This downward trend is very real and has major repercussions for horse racing in the state of Pennsylvania as competition from neighboring states continues to eat away at overall revenue."

The Pennsylvania Equine Coalition projects that funds to the Race Horse Development Fund—which are based on the performance of slots revenue at the state's racetrack casinos—will fall approximately \$15 million short of the Governor's revised FY 2013-14 budget projections, and \$26 million short of initial projections made by the Governor during the state budgeting process in February.

"It is clear that competition from neighboring states is negatively impacting revenues for Pennsylvania's racetrack casinos and will continue to do so," said Peterson. "These decreases will impact horse racing and breeding industry in Pennsylvania, forcing cuts in purses and breeders incentives." (PA Equine Coalition)

PA Drug Testing Gets \$700,000 For Equipment

Advanced equipment and supplies recently donated by horsemen's organizations have given the New Bolton Center at the University of Pennsylvania School of Veterinary Medicine important new tools. The Pennsylvania Harness

Horsemen's Association (PHHA) donated approximately \$470,000 to purchase a mass spectrometer. This highly sensitive equipment allows staffers to research protein-based drugs and peptides, and develop methods to better detect, identify and characterize medications that can enhance performance and/or cause potential harm to the horse. It can analyze changes in proteins that may be related to the administration of drugs and shock wave therapy.

"Plain and simple, we want a clean sport," said Sam Beegle, president of the PHHA. "This grant is part of our ongoing investments to ensure a level playing field, and keep horses healthy and safe."

In addition, two other prominent horsemen's organizations will provide hundreds of thousands of dollars in software, supplies and accessories for the research project. The Meadows Standardbred Owners Association (MSOA), which represents horsemen at The Meadows Racetrack & Casino, and the Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, which provides services for horsemen at both Penn National and Presque Isle Downs in Erie, have so far contributed over \$250,000 for the same goal.

New Bolton Center's Dr. Lawrence Soma said that while instances of positive drug tests are relatively low, the forensic laboratory can only test for known substances. "It's a moving target because new medications are constantly coming into use. These gifts are an essential part of our efforts to stay ahead of the curve," said Dr. Soma.

Racehorses are tested for prohibited substances under the authority of the Pennsylvania Harness and Horse Racing Commissions, which also employ a team of on-site investigators at each state racetrack. Samples are sent to the Pennsylvania Equine Toxicology and Research Laboratory (PETRL) under the direction of Dr. Cornelius Uboh for analysis. Positive test results are reported to the Commissions for enforcement. Repeat offenses and certain types of infractions can result in an individual being banned from competition. (PHHA)

Camels & Ostriches Headed To Tioga/Vernon/Big M

It will be a big weekend for camels and ostriches in New York and New Jersey as the exotic animals will be on the racetrack at Vernon Downs, the Meadowlands and Tioga Downs on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, respectively.

On Tuesday, June 18, the Meadowlands Racetrack held a camel and ostrich racing preview event with local sports-casters including Steve Overmyer of CBS2 and Dyrrol Joyner of PIX11. Both the camel and ostriches will be racing for charity between races on Saturday, June 22. The winning charities will receive \$1,000 courtesy of the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Tioga Downs will play host to a special kind of racing on Sunday afternoon, June 23, as the camel and ostrich races

come to town for the second straight year. Last year more than 3,400 people showed up to watch three ostriches and four camels race the length of the stretch.

This year the ostrich race featuring Dixie Chick, Big Bird, and Hen House Harry will take place after race number four on the 10-race card. The camels will take to the track after race number eight with My Lovely Humps, Humpty Dumpty, Lawrence of Arabia, and Pepi LePew going post-ward in non-wagering events.

Vernon Downs will host the camel and ostrich races on Friday night, June 21, after the fourth and eighth races on the card. (*Tioga/Vernon/Meadowlands*)

Larry Mallar Dies At 73

Lawrence N. "Larry" Mallar, longtime race secretary at Roosevelt Raceway and later general manager of the Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association, died Wednesday, June 19, in Florida. He was 73.

Mr. Mallar was born in Maine and graduated from American International College in Springfield, Mass. He saw duty as race secretary at Rockingham Park, Laurel Raceway, Foxboro Raceway, Scioto Downs, Green Mountain Race Track and then Roosevelt Raceway for 18 years. During that time, he also handled racing duties at Goshen's Historic Track.

Mr. Mallar's first job came at Rockingham Park in 1963 and it was six years later when he was named race secretary at Roosevelt Raceway. After the closing of Roosevelt Raceway in 1988, he went to Michigan and served as general manager of the Michigan Harness Horsemen's Association for 16 years, until his retirement, and moved to Florida.

In a story last August in the Orlando Sentinel, Mr. Mallar noted his tenure at Roosevelt Raceway was highlighted by the Roosevelt International Trot, which attracted the best trotters around the world.

"We even held the drawing for post positions for the International Trot at the United Nations," Mr. Mallar told the newspaper. "There was that much interest."

Mr. Mallar is survived by his wife, Gro; son, Larry F.; daughters, Shari Jo (Michael) Licitra and Kim Allison Mallar-Salsberg (Danny); grandsons, Michael Joseph Licitra and Daniel Joseph Salsberg; granddaughters, Bethany Marie Licitra and Lara Elizabeth Salsberg; step-children, Daniel (Tracey) Riordan and Monique (Todd) Caterina; and step-grandsons, Eric Caterina (Nicolas) and Patrick Riordan (Paige).

There will be a memorial service at Stonecrest Golf Club at 1 p.m. on Friday, June 21.
