Top Contenders Starting Behind Eight Ball On Sun Stakes Saturday

The gods of the open draw for the Sun Stakes card on Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs were not kind to a trio of elimination winners, all of whom drew post 8 in their respective contests.

Weeper will start from post 8 in the \$300,000 James Lynch Memorial final for 3-year-old filly pacers; All Bets Off will start from post 8 in the \$500,000 Max C. Hempt Memorial for 3-year-old colt pacers; and Father Patrick will start from post 8 in the \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial for 3-year-old colt trotters. Also starting from that same outside spot in the \$500,000 Ben Franklin final for older pacers is Captain-treacherous, who finished a close second in his elimination, making it a formidable quartet who will start behind the eight ball.

"It figures that one of the times you don't get to pick your post after winning your elimination that the draw for the final wouldn't be kind to you," said Kelly O'Donnell, trainer of Weeper. "I guess I'll hope they go like hell and we work out some kind of trip. Let them get tired and we have a little left."

Weeper overcame outside posts to win her first three starts this year at The Meadows, albeit against lesser competition. After a pair of close seconds, Weeper got back on the winning track in her Lynch elim, parlaying a two-hole trip behind Gallie Bythe Beach into a half-length score in 1:49, a career best for the daughter of Allamerican Native.

"She's been on the front every start this year except for last week," said O'Donnell. "I don't think that is going to be the way to go on Saturday because you know they are going to be flying, and you don't want to get stung in a :25.4 first quarter and not get anything. My filly can leave some but you hate to get stung. I guess I'll leave it up to the driver (Dave Palone), but he doesn't like racing from too far

back either. I don't know what's going to happen. It's going to be awful tough with all the best fillies in there."

The Ben Franklin is déjà vu for Captaintreacherous, who was beat up the inside passing lane in his Franklin elim by Domethatagain by a nose in 1:48. Captaintreacherous won his Hempt elimination last year and then drew the outside post 9 for the \$500,000 final, but he was able to overcome a "sloppy" racetrack and still post the victory.

"I leave it up to Timmy (driver Tim Tetrick); that's why he gets the big bucks," Alagna answered with a laugh when asked about race strategy. "He'll see what it looks like when the gate folds. I don't see us ducking to last, I wouldn't guess. But I never tell Timmy how to drive the horse and he'll see how it unfolds."

Alagna said he was happy with Captaintreacherous's runner-up effort in the Franklin elim, which came one week after the son of Somebeachsomewhere won his 4-year-old debut in the Meadowlands Maturity from the 10 hole in 1:49.2.

"He got carried a long ways past the quarter and he raced super and I couldn't have been more pleased," said Alagna. "He got nipped on the wire by a quick horse out of the pocket, which you'll see a lot at Pocono. I was happy with the horse's effort."

Alagna shrugged off the fact that trainer Ron Burke's four Franklin entries drew the inside four posts (Bettor's Edge, Allstar Legend, Foiled Again and Sweet Lou, respectively.

"That's the way it goes; you can't control it," said Alagna. "I drew the one-two-three in the Rooney, so I'll be the last person to complain about somebody drawing the one-two-three-four."

While Burke may have drawn as good as you could in the Franklin, he will be sending out All Bets Off from post 8 in the Hempt. Despite a race office error that led to the Hempt being re-drawn, All Bets Off landed post 8 both times. Burke will also send out Hempt elim winner At PressTime, who originally had post 1 but then received post 5 in the re-draw.

"He's top five; he's as good as any horse out there, I think," Burke said of All Bets Off, who will be driven by Matt Kakaley. "He had to be pulled to a stop at the top of the lane (in his elimination) and most of my horses if you pulled them to a stop like that they wouldn't fire again. And he did." — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Campbell Says Sometimes Said, Gallie Bythe Beach Ready For Saturday

Trainer Jim Campbell was in the midst of racing 11 two year olds in qualifying races at Harrah's Philadelphia on Tuesday when one of the caretakers in his stable delivered some bad news. Sometimes Said, the 3-year-old pacing colt he trains for Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms, had drawn post 9 in the \$500,000 Max C. Hempt Memorial final at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs on Saturday night.

But by the time Campbell finished racing and took a look at the draw for the race, his horse had moved inside to post 4. The Hempt final and consolation had to be redrawn because Allstar Partner was initially incorrectly drawn into the consolation. He had earned a ticket to the final when he was fourth-placed-third in his elimination.

"Needless to say, I like the four a lot better," said Campbell after describing the relay of the news about the post position. "He has been a tough-luck drawer. In last year's Breeders Crown final at Pocono he drew post 9, and then in the NA Cup final he had the 10."

The outside post at Pocono in last fall's Breeders Crown turned out ok as Sometimes Said used his gate speed and blasted to the lead, then yielded. He finished second to Luck Be Withyou, beaten a mere neck.

The North America Cup final did not turn out that well as Sometimes Said finished a badly-beaten 10th, but Campbell

said that despite starting from the outside post, the race developed in his horse's favor.

"In the NA Cup final he was getting a good trip since he was following Brian Sears and JK Endofanera (who started from post 9 and won). But he got too fired up and he shut his air off up the backside," explained Campbell.

Campbell added that he was happy with the Well Said colt's third-place finish in the Hempt elimination. "He came first-over, so he hung tough and I was happy about that," he said.

Campbell is also sending out Gallie Bythe Beach, who is one of the 40-plus horses presently in his stable, in the \$300,000 James M. Lynch Memorial. A winner of six of 10 starts last season, the filly by Somebeachsomewhere is winless in three starts thus far this season, although she was only beaten by one-half length in her Lynch elim, when she finished second after carving out fractions of :26.1, :54 and 1:21 for the field.

"She got a little tired, but she had to get a little tired to get tighter," noted Campbell. "I think that race sets her up well for the final." — *By Kathy Parker*

Cinamony Looks To Make Money In Lynch

While Fancy Desire and Weeper are attracting all the attention in the \$300,000 James Lynch Memorial final by virtue of their 1:49 victories in their respective eliminations last weekend, don't overlook Cinamony, who captured her elim in "just" 1:50.3.

"The other ones went in 1:49, but they did it on or near the lead," said driver Corey Callahan, who will start from post 6 with Cinamony in the Lynch final on Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs. "We won in 1:50, with a last quarter in :27, and did it the hard way, first-over."

A daughter of Art Official, Cinamony was just a \$3,500 yearling purchase by Michael Horn and Alexander Rice Sr., whose son, Alexander "Bobby" Rice Jr., is the trainer. Throat surgery early last year led to a light sprinkling of stakes payments being made. Racing in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) and overnights, Cinamony finished up her rookie season with three wins in 10 starts and \$38,244 in earnings.

Cinamony had two wins in her first seven starts this year, including a PASS score at The Meadows. Following a fourth-place finish in a PASS event June 12 at Harrah's Philadelphia, Cinamony was supplemented to the Lynch at a cost of \$15,000. She earned \$10,000 of that back with her elimination victory.

"The day after she raced in that Sires Stakes, they told me that since she doesn't have any races coming up for a while they were thinking about putting her in the Lynch elims," remembered Callahan. "I asked how much it was and they said \$15,000, and I told them that she had proven she could

go with them. I told them that I thought she could go with this group of fillies. I said she had made about \$60,000 up to that point so you're playing with house money, so put her in and see what happens."

Cinamony drew post 1 in the elim and after getting away fifth, Callahan moved her first-over at the half and she went on to draw clear by 2 ¼ lengths. Callahan said the 2013 version of Cinamony likely wouldn't have been able to go on so willingly.

"Look at some of her lines last year, like at The Meadows," said Callahan. "She went :26 quarters up the backside because when you moved her, she was gone. She had the speed, but you couldn't ration it out at all. I had to get her to learn to relax."

Callahan admits he and Cinamony are in a tough spot on Saturday from post 6.

"I wish we had drawn a little better for the final," he said. "At Pocono it's all speed, and you almost have to go for the lead. Hopefully, enough of those guys go and take shots. I really think her best game is first-over but I don't think we will be able to get to that. Hopefully, they'll get a little crazy and she'll be all right."

Cinamony is out of the Western Ideal mare Armbro Cinnamon, whose family includes the 1998 Two-Year-Old Filly Pacer of the Year Mattaroni, Armbro Bombay, Mattropolis and Pretty Discreet.

"I don't know why she brought only \$3,500," trainer Bobby Rice told Ken Weingartner of Harness Racing Communications. "She was a long-legged filly and a little fat, but she didn't look bad."

Armbro Cinnamon—in foal to Dragon Again—sold at last year's Harrisburg mixed sale for \$15,000. Forty-seven hip numbers later, her weanling colt by McArdle named McSinner Son—a half brother to Cinamony—sold for \$9,000 to Horn.

"Michael Horn called me from the sale and said he was thinking about buying Cinamony's brother," said Callahan. "He said that if Cinamony has the year we think she can this year, we won't be able to afford this colt as a yearling. He's a nice-looking colt." —By Gordon Waterstone

Less Is More For Sweet Lou

It might run counter to trainer Ron Burke's intuition, but less appears to be more with Sweet Lou.

Burke changed Sweet Lou's between-race routine and the 5-year-old male pacer has responded with a four-race win streak heading into Saturday's \$500,000 Ben Franklin Pace at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

It is Sweet Lou's longest streak since putting together six consecutive victories bridging his 2- and 3-year-old seasons. Sweet Lou was the 2011 Dan Patch Award winner as harness racing's best 2-year-old male pacer and earned more than \$1 million at age three, but endured a stretch of

just four wins in 31 starts prior to his recent surge. "We've backed off on him and he's become more like a Thoroughbred," Burke said. "I can't ask him to race four weeks in a row; I can't ask him to train in between when

he's racing. I just give him weeks now where he basically jogs and hangs out in the field.

"It kills me, because I'm thinking that he's getting unfit. But I've watched him and he just blows back up and starts to look strong again. Then I'll give him one hard fast work before he races and he seems to race great."

Sweet Lou, who won his Franklin elimination by four lengths over Bolt The Duer in 1:47.4 last weekend, drew post 4 in the final. Three other Burke horses—Bettor's Edge, All-star Legend, and Foiled Again—will all start inside of Sweet Lou while Domethatagain, who edged Captaintreacherous by a nose to win the other Franklin elim in 1:48, got post 5. Captaintreacherous, the two-time defending Pacer of the Year, leaves from post 8.

"I was very impressed with the way (Sweet Lou) raced the other day," Burke said. "He's come back as the horse we always thought he would be."

Sweet Lou's win streak also coincides with Ron Pierce becoming his driver.

"Pierce maybe has a different strategy of how to race him and so far it's been good," Burke said. "Everything right now is working good, so we'll just keep doing it the same way until we need to make a change." (HRC)

STRETCH CALL

The Curious Case Of Canadian Drivers

Commensurate to population, Canadian-born drivers comprise a disproportionate number of the sport's best reinsman. So how does one explain the gap between the drivers' colonies in New Jersey and Toronto?

Each year, the Pepsi North America Cup brings with it some local hand wringing over the lack of local drivers that have success in Canada's biggest race despite having home track advantage and coming out of, arguably, the second best group of drivers in North America.

This year, the disparity seemed particularly acute. There wasn't one Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) driver in the 10-horse field, though three horses were driven by men born in Canada—Yannick Gingras, Scott Zeron and John Campbell. As is often the case, the predominance of horsepower came to the \$1 million race out of the U.S. So, it's only natural that those horses will be driven by U.S.-based drivers. But there's more to it than that.

Northwood Bloodstock's Bob Boni, who has been in attendance at the Meadowlands regularly for the past 25 years, thinks it might be a case of nurture trumping nature. Canadians who move to the Meadowlands early in their careers—Campbell, Mike Lachance, and others—have done very well on the stakes circuit. Canadians who stay at Mohawk and Woodbine, despite the talent pool being deep, haven't fared as well at the Grand Circuit level.

"Traditionally, (the Toronto) circuit is a more conservative, gentlemanly driving circuit. You get out of there at 100 miles an hour, everybody sits in and then you sprint from the five-eighths or three-quarters on home," Boni said.

By comparison, the Meadowlands and the best tracks in the neighboring states of New York and Pennsylvania simply produce better drivers regardless of nationality. Generally, there's more attacking and cut-throat action in the mile than there is at Mohawk or Woodbine.

Boni said it's been that way since the dawn of the catch-driver era some 30 years ago. He remembers being stumped as to why Toronto's talented driving duo of Doug Brown and Steve Condren never fared particularly well at the Meadowlands during their heyday despite putting up gaudy numbers at home in the 1980s and '90s. On the flip side, the Meadowlands-based drivers seem just as dominant away from New Jersey. Case in point, Brown has

never won the NA Cup. Condren won it once with the recently-departed Goalie Jeff.

Though 23 of 31 NA Cups have been won by Canadian-born drivers, only 11 of those victories came from reinsmen actually based in Canada for the bulk of their careers. That means U.S.-based drivers have produced two-thirds of the victories in Canada's biggest race. To some degree local drivers have done better in the NA Cup in recent years, with five victories in the last eight times the race was contested, but the same can't be said for the WEG drivers' success rate in the U.S. on the Grand Circuit.

Clearly, the Meadowlands is a key factor in the development of talented drivers. Perhaps that is because many of the best drivers in North America have gravitated toward New Jersey. Maybe it's a border issue because fewer of the sport's best drivers have been drawn to Toronto.

Which brings us to the curious case of Luc Ouellette. The Quebec native put up Hall of Fame numbers racing at the Meadowlands and Yonkers early in his career. Ten years ago, at the top of his game, Ouellette moved to Toronto. There was every reason to expect he would dominate the WEG circuit. While Ouellette has put up good numbers since he moved to Ontario—more than \$40 million in purses and nearly 2,000 victories—they aren't what they were in the U.S., and he hasn't dominated the WEG colony.

"I think a lot of it is driving style, and what has been engrained (at the Meadowlands) for years is a much more aggressive style of racing," noted Boni. "The one thing you hear everybody say, 'At the Meadowlands you're racing the full mile. There's no breathers.' You're going great guns every part of the mile. It's great drivers. They drive that way."

That isn't to say WEG doesn't have a deep and talented pool of drivers, just that as a group, they can't match the Big M guys, even on Canadian soil.

Sebastian K On Fast Track To History

No trotter in history has recorded four winning miles of 1:50.3 or faster, but on Saturday night Sebastian K will try to accomplish the feat in only his fourth start in North America.

Sebastian K is among the seven horses in Saturday's \$100,000 Sun Invitational for older trotters at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs. The field also includes Market Share, who is history's only other trotter with three winning miles of 1:50.3 or faster.

Last weekend, Sebastian K and trainer-driver Ake Svanstedt won for the third time in as many starts since arriving in the U.S. from Sweden. They captured the third round of the TVG Free For All Series for older trotters in 1:50.3 at the Meadowlands, beating Archangel by two lengths and third-place Market Share by 4 3/4 lengths.

Sebastian K won his U.S. debut in a world-record-equaling 1:50.1 on May 10 and followed that performance with a 1:50.2 victory in the \$175,000 Arthur J. Cutler Memorial final.

"It's an amazing story," said Bjorn "Bernie" Noren, who is Svanstedt's assistant. "Of course we were hoping he was going to do great, but this is – I don't want to say a surprise, really – but a good feeling that the horse can do like he's done."

Sebastian K drew post 7 in the Sun Invitational, which also includes Arch Madness, Sevruga, Amigo Ranger, Archangel, and Modern Family. Arch Madness, one of the richest trotters in history with more than \$4 million in purses, and Sevruga also are among history's 15 trotters to win with at least a 1:50.3 time.

Arch Madness, who has won twice in his career with a time of 1:50.2, Market Share, Sebastian K, and the retired Chapter Seven are the only trotters in history to win in 1:50.3 or faster multiple times. One of Market Share's 1:50.3 miles came last year in a qualifier. Earlier this year he trotted 1:50.2 at Harrah's Philadelphia, the fastest time ever on a five-eighths-mile track.

Pocono Downs is a five-eighths-mile track known for its speed, so that mark could be in jeopardy Saturday. Depending on how the race unfolds, a sub-1:50 mile might not be out of the question.

"It's not out of the possibility," Noren said. "It depends how the race unfolds. If they get to three quarters and everybody still has something in the tank, it could happen. If you go too much in the [first] half, of course you're going to go a little slower the last half. That's the way racing is. But that's a fast track. If the weather is good, they're going to have the track in top shape." (*HRC*)

Post-Breeding Stint, Wishing Stone Ready To Race

After a stint in the breeding shed, 7-year-old trotter Wishing Stone is ready to make his 2014 racing debut in a conditioned handicap Friday at the Meadowlands.

Wishing Stone received post 10 in the race and is 9-2 on the morning line. He enters the race off one qualifier, a 1:55.2 effort on June 20 with Yannick Gingras driving for trainer Ron Burke.

Wishing Stone stood as a stallion at Deo Volente Farms in New Jersey. He fulfilled contracts for 331 doses of frozen semen overseas as well as being bred to some 30 mares in North America.

Although it is common for trotters overseas to breed and race in the same season, that is not the case in North America. Some well-known successes abroad include Ready Cash, who is France's richest trotter in history in addition to being a popular sire, and Cocktail Jet and Mack Lobell, who both won the prestigious Elitlopp after performing stud duties.

"It's a fun experiment and I think it's going to work," said Mike Gulotta, the CEO of Deo Volente Farms and head of the Wishing Stone Syndicate ownership group. "Actually, the first part of it has worked. We're excited."

Wishing Stone is well known in Europe, having competed there at ages four and five; he won the French trotting race Grand Prix du Sud Ouest at 1 5/16 mile and also the King's Trophy in Sweden. A year later, he captured the Copenhagen Cup in Denmark at a distance of 1 1/4 mile. He returned to the U.S. in August 2012.

Lifetime, Wishing Stone has won 21 of 69 races and earned \$2.23 million. He has won multiple stakes in the U.S., including the 2010 Kentucky Futurity.

"We'll see now how he races," Gulotta said. "He looks good. I think he's gained weight and grown up a little, actually, which may be helpful to him. We're happy." (*HRC*)

Newman Named Chair Of PA Harness Commission

Jonathan Newman, whose parents own an interest in such greats as Nihilator and who has owned and bred horses himself, was sworn in as chairman of the Pennsylvania Harness Racing Commission on Tuesday at the

commission's June meeting at the new hotel and convention center at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

Newman was nominated by Gov. Tom Corbett and was confirmed by the state Senate on Monday. He takes over the commission chairman seat previously held by Roy Wilt, who resigned. Newman previously served as a member of the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission, which regulates Thoroughbred racing in the state.

Newman told the Wilkes-Barre Times-Leader "harness racing is home for me. I love the sport of harness racing."

Newman, of Bryn Mawr, Pa., is an attorney and was once a Republican Congressional candidate. His mother, Sandra Newman, is a former Pennsylvania state Supreme Court Justice. His father, Dr. Julius Newman, became well-known as a plastic surgeon.

Ohio Breeder-Owner Jerome Osborne Sr. Dies

Jerome T. Osborne Sr., the founder of Osborne Companies Inc. and self-made entrepreneur, businessman and philanthropist, of Mentor, died peacefully on Saturday, June 21, surrounded by family and his beloved dog Drummond. He was 92.

Mr. Osborne was a prominent owner at Northfield Park and in Ohio. He is a member of the honorary Distinguished Owners that is awarded to one individual every three years at Northfield's Wall of Fame banquet. He has owned two horses that have been inducted into Northfield Wall of Fame (Osborne's Gypsy and Majestic Osborne).

Mr. Osborne has owned multiple Ohio stakes winners and champions. Most of his horses have raced under the "Osborne" name. Even at his time of death, he owned horses. Eric Hamlet has been his long-time trainer.

Mr. Osborne's granddaughter, Kimberley, is married to Northfield Park owner and Chairman, Brock Milstein.

A Memorial Service will be held at 11 a.m. on Saturday, June 28, at Andrews Osborne Academy, 38588 Mentor Ave., Willoughby, Ohio 44094. The family also invites friends to offer condolences and celebrate his life from 9:30-11 a.m. and 3-5:30 p.m. that day at the same location. Interment will be in Mentor Cemetery.

Tony Chiaravalle Dies At 78

Antonio "Tony" Chiaravalle, who campaigned such notables as 1993 Pacer of the Year Presidential Ball, his blazing-fast stablemate Riyadh, and the top free-for-allers Dream Maker and Lime Time, died Monday, June 23, at the age of 78. While involved with the construction industry, Mr. Chiaravalle invested heavily in horse ownership for decades.

Before Presidential Ball gave Mr. Chiaravalle a top sophomore stakes contender, Dream Maker and Lime Time put him in the winner's circle for the sport's most prestigious races for older horses. Dream Maker defeated Rambling Willie, Le Baron Rouge, Senor Skipper and Governor's Skipper and won the 1978 Provincial Cup at Windsor and the 1978 Canadian Pacing Derby at Greenwood Raceway. He was voted Canada's Aged Pacer of 1977.

Lime Time gave Mr. Chiaravalle his second Provincial Cup trophy when he won the 1981 edition of the race. A son of Race Time—just like Dream Maker—Lime Time's triumph in the Provincial Cup was his 16th of his 1981 campaign. He also traveled to compete in the sport's top free-for-all events and won at the Meadowlands and included Rambling Willie, Royce and Justin Passing among his vanquished foes.

Mr. Chiaravalle's horses were trained by Bill Robinson and in later years, also by Monte Gelrod. Presidential Ball p,3, 1:50 (\$3,021,363) won the 1993 North America Cup and Meadowlands Pace and then finished third in the Little Brown Jug. Riyadh, his stablemate and contemporary, earned \$2,763,527 during his racing career. He won the Messenger along with an elimination of the Meadowlands Pace, finishing third in the final, and heats of the Adios and Jug, finishing second in both of those finals, with Life Sign taking the Jug.

Meadowlands/SBOAN Implementing NJ-Sired Bonus Program

Together with the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey, the Meadowlands will be implementing a bonus program for several of its overnight races for New Jersey-sired horses. The program will begin on Friday, Dec. 5, 2014. Beginning with that date, races meeting the condition of non-winners of one, two, three or four pari-mutuel races will carry a 60 percent bonus to the purse for New Jersey-sired horses. The bonus program encompasses both sexes of horse as well as gait.

The purse structure will be as follows: Non-Winners of 1: \$10,000 (Plus \$6,000 for NJ-Sired horses); Non-Winners of 2: \$12,500 (Plus \$7,500 for NJ-Sired horses); Non-Winners of 3: \$15,000 (Plus \$9,000 for NJ-Sired horses) and non-Winners of 4: \$17,500 (Plus \$10,500 for NJ-Sired horses).

Therefore, a New Jersey-sired horse will race for \$16,000 in a non-winners of one event, \$20,000 in a non-winners of two event, \$24,000 in a non-winners of three event and \$28,000 in a non-winners of four event. (*Meadowlands*)

Schadt Named Director Of Racing At Cal Expo

Watch and Wager LLC, the operator of harness racing at Cal Expo, has announced that Robin Schadt is the new Director of Racing.

The 2014-2015 meeting is set to begin on October 4 and will run through May 4, with plans to expand to three nights of racing a week during the winter months.

Schadt has extensive experience in the harness racing industry, including working as an assistant to Chicago director of racing and U.S. Trotting Association president Phil Langley in the 1990s at Sportsman's Park, and as the lead trainer and manager for the successful stable Odds On Racing for 13 years.

"My goal is to produce a racing program where every horseman gets their horses raced on a regular basis for decent money and to provide the betting public with competitive fields on which to wager," said Schadt. I'm confident I can do both."

In 2000, Schadt teamed up with owner Dana Parham to create Odds On Racing. She was responsible for conditioning a stable of more than 100 horses and for managing and maintaining a state-of-the-art training facility located in Crete, Ill. As well, she headed up the breeding arm of the operation, known as Odds On Nourrir, which was a key player at the leading yearling sales and in Grand Circuit events. (*Cal Expo*)

Supreme Court Rejects NJ's Bid For Sports Betting

Any hope of sports betting being allowed at racetracks and casinos in New Jersey were dashed on Monday when the U.S. Supreme Court announced it had declined to hear the

case and instead let stand a lower court ruling that if allowed it would conflict with a federal law that permits sports betting in just four states.

In 2011, New Jersey voters overwhelmingly approved amending the state constitution to allow sports betting, and lawmakers passed a law allowing it. The NBA, NFL, NHL, MLB and NCAA banded together in a lawsuit to block the law, saying it would be harmful to the integrity of their sports. New Jersey Gov. Chris Christie then appealed to the Supreme Court the ruling that the Court said would conflict with a 22-year-old federal law that allows sports wagering in just Nevada, Delaware, Montana and Oregon.

Despite Monday's Supreme Court ruling, state Sen. Raymond Lesniak, who sponsored the original legislation, introduced a bill that would repeal all laws prohibiting sports wagering in New Jersey. Lesniak said he hopes the bill would pass the state legislature despite Monday's decision.

"I plan on placing my first bet at Monmouth Racetrack on Sept. 8 for the Giants to beat the spread against the Lions on Monday Night Football," Lesniak was quoted as saying.

Wheres The Beach, Dam Of SBSW, Dies

WheresThe Beach, the dam of the great Somebeachsomewhere, died on Friday, June 13. The 16-year-old mare was humanely euthanized at Ohio State University Equine Hospital following colic surgery.

Owned by Stephanie Smith-Rothaug of West Jefferson, Ohio, WheresThe Beach foaled a Well Said weanling earlier this year and was bred to A Rocknroll Dance prior to passing.

"It was certainly a sad day," Smith-Rothaug said. "'Beach' was like part of the family and she certainly has been a life changing mare for me and for that I'll forever be grateful. She had tremendous presence to her and took care of her babies very well. She will be missed."

Although never stepping foot on the racetrack, WheresThe Beach, a \$20,000 yearling, proved to be much more valuable in the breeding shed.

Her fourth foal, Somebeachsomewhere, is arguably the greatest pacer of all time as he suffered defeat once in 21 career starts and was inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame just nine months after his final career start. His lone defeat came in the 2008 Meadowlands Pace to Art Official, which was arguably 'The Beach's' best race.

WheresThe Beach has stamped herself as one of the games top broodmares.

She has produced a number of \$100,000+ yearlings, including Myrtle Beach (2006 - \$100,000), Star On The Beach (2007 - \$150,000), Someheartsomewhere (2008 - \$210,000), Someofthebeach (2010 - \$430,000) and Bring On The Beach (2012 - \$155,000).

Smith-Rothaug confirmed that WheresThe Beach has been cremated. (*WEG*)
