

Post Position Draw Could Be Huge Factor In Hempt

An open draw for post positions injected a huge dose of suspense into the \$500,000 Max C. Hempt Memorial Pace, set to be contested Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

Captaintreacherous, winner of the \$1 million North America Cup and his Hempt elimination, drew post 9 in the 9-horse field.

"With the open draw, that shakes up things quite a bit," said Tony Alagna, the trainer of Captaintreacherous, who is still the 5-2 morning line choice. "The track had a huge speed bias the other night, which Pocono normally does, but even more so than normal. The track was very much playing speed. Regardless of where he draws he's going to have to be forwardly placed off the gate."

Last weekend, Captaintreacherous won his elim by a neck over Vegas Vacation in 1:48.4. Starting from post 4 with regular driver Tim Tetrick, he reached the lead by the halfway point and paced the final half-mile in a sharp :53 flat. He was one of 12 winners on last Saturday's 14-race card that was racing first or second after the opening quarter-mile.

"He was very good," Tetrick said. "He only won by a neck, but that's all you have to win by. He did everything I asked him to do. He got a nice first and second quarter and then finished up the mile very strong."

"Everybody is out to beat him, but I'd rather be the favorite going into the race than not."

Although Captaintreacherous's charted line states he was still parked out second at the first quarter-mile mark, the replay of the race shows he had cleared and broke the beam at the quarter pole in :27.1. His first start of the season was at Pocono as well and in that race, starting from post 7, Tetrick stayed wide in the first turn before swooping to the front.

Although Vegas Vacation came close to beating Captaintreacherous in the Hempt elimination, he also has drawn an

outside post, starting from the seven after leaving from the rail in the elimination.

The two other Hempt elims were won by the Alagna-trained Emeritus Maximus, who will start from post 5 in the final, and Sunfire Blue Chip, who drew post 8. Both of those colts also started from post 1 in their eliminations.

Two Hempt contenders who will be starting from better posts in the final than they did in their elimination are Martini Hanover (starting from post 1 after post 6 in his elim), Word Power (moving in to post 2 from post 7), Evenin Of Pleasure (sliding in one slot, from post 4 to post 3), and Rockin Amadeus (moving left from post 8 to post 4).

Takter Has Chances To Win Beal, Hempt Finals

Although the Hambletonian is still more than a month away, the \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial Trot for 3 year olds is a Hambletonian preview as all but one of the nine starters (PictureThis) are eligible to the Aug. 3 classic at the Meadowlands.

JimmyTakter has two colts on the road to the Hambletonian, Dontyouforgetit and Corky, and both have solid chances to win the Beal. They drew favorable post positions (2 for Dontyouforgetit and 4 for Corky) and also are coming to the Beal after winning their eliminations for the race.

“These two horses are a little different, but both are handy, leave the gate well, and you can race them any way you want,” said Takter. “Dontyouforgetit is a little guy, but no one tries harder than he does.”

While stuck in traffic en route to Manhattan to have dinner with his wife, Christina, Takter said both Dontyouforgetit and Corky are going into the Beal in good shape, as evidenced by their elimination victories, with Dontyouforgetit winning by a neck over Possessed Fashion in 1:52.1 and Corky scoring by one length over Royalty For Life in 1:52.4.

Also in the field is the third Beal elim winner, the undefeated Smilin Eli, but he drew post 9 in the Beal final.

“It’s tough to win a race from post nine there,” said Takter. “They open up very fast the first quarter there, so you have to use your horse pretty hard to get in position.”

Takter’s horses in the Hempt final did not both draw well, but with Captaintreacherous drawing post 9 in that race, he said he expects the action to be “steaming” from the start. “There’s going to be high speed, that’s for sure,” said Takter.

While Takter’s colt Rockin Amadeus is a known commodity, winning last year’s Breeders Crown 2-Year-Old Colt Pace, he also has a second Hempt contender in the somewhat unknown Sunfire Blue Chip.

Rockin Amadeus competed in a North America Cup elimination but tired late in the race, finishing fifth and failing to make the cut for the final. Takter said the colt was battling a couple of afflictions.

“He got hurt a little bit when we got up there. He scraped skin off a knee, and I was debating scratching him, but when you pay an \$8,000 entry fee and you don’t really see too much, you go ahead sometimes. But after the race we took blood and his white count had climbed up, so obviously he was bothered,” explained Takter. “He raced OK (in a Hempt elim, when he finished third behind Captaintreacherous and Vegas Vacations), but hopefully he’ll be better this week.”

Sunfire Blue Chip, a son of American Ideal, is a full brother to \$1.4 million winner Heston Blue Chip. Al-

though the Hempt final will be his third major stakes appearance, he’s been racing under the radar since he has yet to win a stakes.

“He’s the real deal,” said Takter of the colt, who he bought for \$75,000 as a yearling. “He had a hairline fracture in a hind leg last year early, so we stopped with him,” he revealed. “He’s a very nice horse.”

Takter will be racing three other horses from his stable on Saturday night at Pocono—High Bridge, Source Of Pride and Uncle Peter. He also gave an update on his filly To Dream On, the 2012 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year.

After winning eight of nine starts last year as a freshman, To Dream On has yet to win a race this year and finished a tired seventh in the recent Elegantimage at Mohawk.

“Yannick (Gingras) told me that in the last turn she was full of trot and then he had nothing,” said Takter of the filly’s form in the Elegantimage. “She scoped a little bit bad and was sick, but I have trained her and she’s already better. I sure hope she’s back to her old self.” — *By Kathy Parker*

Fanning Hopes To Be In "Fashion" In Beal

Post five is the winningest starting spot at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs this year, scoring at a 15.8 percent clip. Possessed Fashion drew the advantageous starting spot in Saturday night's \$500,000 Earl Beal Jr. Memorial for 3-year-old colt trotters, one of four major stakes finals on the card.

Possessed Fashion comes into the Beal final off a second-place finish in his elimination last Saturday, falling a neck

short of Dontyouforgetit after what trainer Tom Fanning termed a "short first-over move" around the final turn.

Also with a third and fourth in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes action, Possessed Fashion's two wins this year in seven starts include a career-best 1:53.4 effort in a conditioned trot on May 3 at the Meadowlands.

In his Beal elim, Possessed Fashion sat third until the final turn when he was tipped to the outside by driver John Campbell. Although Possessed Fashion trotted home in :27.2, he couldn't overcome the pylon rally by the Yannick Gingras-driven Dontyouforgetit, losing out in the photo finish.

"I was glad John pulled him because I wanted him to give him a shot," said

Fanning. "Our horse raced good."

A son of Donato Hanover, Possessed Fashion was originally a \$55,000 yearling purchase by Jules Siegel's Fashion Farms from breeder Fair Winds Farm. Possessed Fashion is out of the Self Possessed mare Lady Marian, a half sister to the 2010 New York Sires Stakes 2-Year-Old Filly Trot champion Some Girls. His second dam is Emotional Rescue, who finished second in the finals of the 2010 Breeders Crown and Merrie Annabelle.

Campaigned as a 2 year old by trainer Jim Campbell, Possessed Fashion won once in 10 starts, that coming in a Pennsylvania Stallion Series division at Harrah's Philadelphia. He closed out his rookie season with a second-place finish in a Bluegrass division at The Red Mile, bringing his seasonal earnings to \$108,008.

On behalf of Florida-based owner Joe Smith, a retired corporate executive in the pharmaceutical field, Fanning purchased Possessed Fashion for \$82,000 at the 2012 mixed sale in Harrisburg.

"Jim (Campbell) said he had a few others he liked better and they thought they could get a pretty good price," explained Fanning. "I think they were happy with the price and we spent exactly what we thought we'd spend. So it worked out good."

"I saw him race a few starts last year, and when I saw he was in the sale at Harrisburg I thought he might be worth pursuing. He was good-gaited, trots nice, so we decided to take a shot."

Fanning said he made an equipment change to an open bridle, also adding a cheek piece on the outside to "keep him focused." Fanning said he believed Possessed Fashion needed most to mature, and that is coming to fruition now.

"I thought he was a little immature mentally, more than anything, but if he grew up a little bit for his 3-year-old year he could be a lot better horse," said Fanning. "He's gotten better with his attitude in a race. He's still a little bit quirky but he's moving in the right direction. I think he's maturing a bit, accepting his job better."

While Fanning concedes Smilin Eli, who is a perfect four-for-four in 2013, is the one to beat in the Beal final, having that colt draw the outside post nine could be the equalizer.

"I think it's Smilin Eli and the rest of us, but I think he can trot competitively with the rest of the group," said Fanning. "Smilin Eli has the nine hole, so if he's not totally on his game there could be an upset."

Fanning said that while Possessed Fashion is eligible to the Hambletonian, a final decision on a start in the trotting classic has yet to be made by he and Smith.—By Gordon Waterstone

Teague Chases A Lynch Win With Somwherovrainbow

Somwherovrainbow found the pot of gold last year in her freshman season as she won seven of 11 races, including the Breeders Crown, on her way to earnings of more than a half-million dollars and divisional honors.

Although Somwherovrainbow has won twice in four starts in 2013, the 3-year-old filly pacer hasn't had observers oohing and aahing over her performances. One of the seldom-seen progeny whose sire and dam were both voted Horse of the Year, Somwherovrainbow finished fourth in her elimination for the James Lynch Memorial

and now comes into the final as a 6-1 morning-line outsider for the \$300,000 final on Saturday night at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

"The first start she wasn't any good as she tied up, but the other starts she was all right," said co-breeder, co-owner and trainer George Teague Jr. of the daughter of Somebeach-somewhere-Rainbow Blue.

Somwherovrainbow finished third in her season debut in a Simpson division May 3 at the Meadowlands, a race in which Teague said

she tied up, an ailment her mother, the 2004 Horse of the Year Rainbow Blue, also battled. While she then won back-to-back Pennsylvania Sires Stakes divisions, Teague said there were issues.

"When I raced her at The Meadows she was coughing pretty good, so I definitely didn't want to risk shipping her to Canada for the Fan Hanover," said Teague. "I was going to qualify her at Pocono nine days before the (Lynch) elims but she still wasn't healthy enough to do that."

With Teague's son, Montrell, driving in the Lynch elim, Somwherovrainbow took the lead past the quarter in :26.

The pace slowed with a :29.2 second quarter, but then picked back up with a third quarter of :27.2. Somwherovrainbow was then no match for the heavily-favored I Luv The Nitelife, who surged to the victory as she faded to fourth, beaten 2 ¼ lengths.

"I felt pretty good until he asked her to pace home and she didn't look like herself," said Teague. "That's racing. I hate excuses; that's not my style. We got beat fair and square."

An open draw for the final may have aided Somwherovrainbow's chances somewhat as she will start from post 6, two slots inside of favorite I Luv The Nitelife. Ms. Caila J Fra and Shebestingin, who finished first and second, respectively, in the second Lynch elim, will start from posts 3 and 5. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Nikki Beach Tops Alagna's Lynch Trio

Tony Alagna hopes there is no sophomore slump for Nikki Beach as she gets ready for Saturday's \$300,000 James M. Lynch Memorial for 3-year-old female pacers at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

Last year, Nikki Beach hit a midseason swoon before rebounding to set a track record at Indiana Downs and come within a nose of a three-race win streak. This season, she opened the campaign with a victory in a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes, but finished off the board in her next three starts.

Alagna, though, is hopeful the filly is returning to top form after she finished second to I Luv The Nitelife in her Lynch elimination last weekend. He also thinks her performances prior to the elim were not evidence of a slump.

"She was tremendous her first start back this year and then she had a rough second start at the Meadowlands; she was parked the whole mile against aged mares," Alagna said. "That took a lot out of her. I knew it was going to take a couple starts to get her back to where she was. She showed back up the other night. She went through this a little bit last year. She hit a little midseason slump, but came back and was better than ever at the end of the year. She's done it before so I wasn't too concerned. If she didn't have that bad start at the Meadowlands in her second start (this year) I think she would have had some more consistency."

Nikki Beach will start the Lynch final from post 1 with Ron Pierce driving. She is 12-1 on the morning line and is one of three horses from Alagna's stable in the race. The others are Authorize, who is 15-1, and 20-1 outsider Mattie Terror Girl.

Multiple-stakes-winner I Luv The Nitelife, who has won three races in a row including the Fan Hanover final on June 15 at Mohawk Racetrack and her Lynch elimination last weekend, drew post 8 in the nine-horse field but was still made the morning line favorite at 5-2.

"She was very good," driver Tim Tetrick said. "We got a great trip. When I got out in the passing lane she just exploded. In Canada she was super, super good and in her elimination she was tucked in, braved up and finished strong."

Shebestingin, who has won eight of 10 career starts and was second by a head and a neck in her defeats, is 3-1 while Ms. Caila J Fra, who won the other Lynch elimination, is 4-1. Charisma Hanover, who has won five of six starts this year, is 9-2 and Somwherovrarainbow, who was voted last season's best 2-year-old female pacer, is 6-1.

Nikki Beach, owned by Brittany Farms, has won six of 16 career starts and earned \$297,233. Last year she won divisions of the Reynolds, Kentuckiana Stallion Management, and Bluegrass Stakes. She was second by a neck to Jersey-

licious in the Sweetheart Pace and second by a nose to Parlee Beach in a division of the International Stallion Stakes.

Her 1:52.1 victory in the Kentuckiana Stallion Management set the track record for 2-year-old filly pacers at Indiana Downs.

"I think she has the best shot," Alagna said. "She can leave, she can get in position, and that track kind of favors a horse like her that can get off the gate well." — *By Ken Weingartner/Harness Racing Communications*

Happy 50th To The Meadows!

A three-day celebration of its 50th anniversary will culminate at The Meadows on Friday night as the racetrack will recognize a number of pioneers—horsemen and horsewomen who have worked there throughout its 50 years—on the Golden Anniversary date of its opening back in 1963.

On Friday, the track will roll back prices (on selected food and beverage items) to their 1963 levels and conduct a nine-race program beginning at 8:20 p.m. as a tribute to The Meadows' schedule on June 28, 1963. For the first two races, The Meadows also will roll back its wagering menu to feature those betting options—win/place/show and daily double—available on Opening Night.

The festivities began on Wednesday and include a cookout in the Miller Tent, music from the 1960s and videos of Meadows "magic moments" on the infield matrix board. In addition, fans will participate in "1963 Trivia," with hats, tee shirts, concert tickets and 1963 track photos as prizes. Each fan will receive a special Golden Anniversary Commemorative Journal, produced by the Keystone Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association.

10-Horse Fields At Yonkers In Jackpot Next Door Series

There are horse trailers, there are trailing horses...and, in the case of Yonkers Raceway Friday night, there are going to be horse trailers with trailing horses.

That's because the opening round of Yonkers' debuting "Jackpot Next Door" Claiming Series has produced overloaded fields.

The five-Friday series, for \$20,000 claiming pacers of both sexes, has proven quite popular. Seven of the evening's baker's dozen races are "Jackpot Next Door" events, and all but one of those events have second-tier starters. All races during all four prelim rounds carry a \$20,000 purse.

ONES TO WATCH

FLANAGAN MEMORY, **TOOCOOL FORSCHOOL** and **GOTTA SECRET**, who respectively completed the trifecta in the \$225,276 Goodtimes final June 15 at Mohawk Race-track, all return for Ontario Sires Stakes Gold eliminations on Friday night. Flanagan Memory overcame post eight to score the 9-1 upset in the Goodtimes, and in his OSS elim he will start from post nine with Chris Christoforou again in the sulky. Gotta Secret will start from post three, with the field also including **MURMUR HANOVER**, last year's Well-wood Memorial runner-up and Breeders Crown show finisher making his season debut. Also drawing into that division was Creampuff MacDaddy, who was scratched as a result of a positive test June 10 at Mohawk.

Another horse making his season debut this weekend at Mohawk is the 2012 North America Cup champion **THINKING OUT LOUD**, who starts from post 2 in Saturday night's \$34,000 Preferred Pace. The Bob McIntosh trainee brings a career bankroll of \$1.27 million into the race following a pair of solid qualifying wins, posting 1:53.2 and 1:52.4 scores, respectively, on June 12 and June 19 at Mohawk.

New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) for 2 year olds get underway this weekend at the Meadowlands, with the trotters starting it off on Friday. **DEEPDISH**, the highest-priced filly trotter sold at auction last year with a bid of \$320,000, makes her debut in the first of two NJSS divisions, with the five-horse split going postward as a non-bettor at 7 p.m. A daughter of Muscle Hill, the Jonas Czernyson-trained Deepdish is out of the award-winning mare Pizza Dolce, who has already produced three winners of more than a quarter-million dollars, including the \$865,000-winner Miss Paris and the \$730,000 winner Bella Dolce. In all 14, sons and daughters of first-year sire Muscle Hill will go postward on Friday.

Three New York Sires Stakes divisions for 2-year-old colt pacers are on tap Friday at Saratoga Raceway. The strong morning-line choice is the 6-5 **FORTY FIVE RED** in the second division (race 7). The highest-priced son of If I Can Dream sold last year for \$105,000. Forty Five Dream comes into the race off a pair of qualifying victories at Gaitway Farm for trainer Ron Burke. Starting from post one in the first NYSS split (Race 4) is New York Bets, a rare pacer in trotting specialist Trond Smedshammer's barn. The son of Bettor's Delight was a \$50,000 yearling purchase and comes into the race off a pair of second-place efforts in Gaitway qualifiers. Angel Park, the second dam of New York Bets, won the 1994 Bluegrass 3-Year-Old Filly Pace at The Red Mile.

New Jersey-sired pacers take to the Big M track on Saturday night, again with an early division for the colts and one on the betting card. The second split is Race 4, with post 1 belonging to **IN THE CLEAR**, a \$50,000 yearling purchase who won both his baby races in preparation for his NJSS debut. A gelded son of Western Ideal, In The Clear is out of the Life Sign mare Orchid Island, a full sister to the millionaire Island Fantasy.

Among the 16 fillies lining up behind the gate in two divisions is **I NEED HOTSTUFF**, who starts from post 3 in the second split (Race 11). Sold as Wendurance, I Need Hotstuff was the fifth highest-priced filly pacer to go through the ring, bringing a bid of \$107,000 from owners Richard Young and Joanne Young. A daughter of Rocknroll Hanover, I Need Hotstuff is a half sister to the 2003 Woodrow Wilson winner Modern Art. I Need Hotstuff's dam, Wendy M Hanover, is a full sister to Western Hanover.

Kicking off the \$2 million Sun Stakes card at Pocono Downs on Saturday is a \$25,000 Preferred Trot. Handicapped with the outside posts five and six, respectively, are world champion **UNCLE PETER** and **ARCH MADNESS**, making his second start back after his 2-4 finishes in the double-heat Elitlopp at Solvalla Racetrack.

Empire Breeders Classic winner **LOLA DE VIE** will line up behind the gate in post three in the third of three New York Sires Stakes divisions for 3-year-old filly trotters on Saturday night at Tioga Downs. The Chris Ryder trainee was a 2:02.2 winner on a sloppy track last time out in NYSS competition at Buffalo Raceway. While Lola De Vie is the richest of the 26 NYSS entrants with \$161,498 in earnings this year, second-place laurels go to the Smedshammer-trained **PROCLAIMING APRIL**, who was 3p2 in the \$237,600 EBC final. Proclaiming April starts from post four in the first NYSS split, carded as Race 1.

The second leg of the Miss Versatility Series for older mare trotters on Monday night has 13 entries divided into a pair of divisions. The newly-minted millionaire MAVEN, who is three-for-three in 2013 including a division of the opening round of the Miss Versatility and the Armbro Flight final, lines up in post 5 in the first split (Race 2) against five rivals, including **BEATGOESON HANOVER**, who also scored a win in the first leg of the series. The well-balanced field of six in the second division (Race 11) includes Breeders Crown champion **CEDAR DOVE**, who also surpassed \$1 million in career earnings last time out via her Armbro Flight runner-up finish.

Illinois Purses Get \$4.9 Million; No Increase Expected

The purse accounts at Balmoral Park and Maywood Park were boosted more than \$4.9 million on Tuesday when the Illinois Racing Board (IRB) formally allocated \$23 million in funding from money held in escrow from revenue generated at the state's casinos.

The legislation to allocate a percentage of the casino money was approved years ago but had been placed in an escrow account because the legislature never took action on appropriating the funds. The fund had grown to \$115 million, but the racing industry agreed to accept \$23 million, with the other \$92 million going to a school infrastructure fund.

"Because the state of Illinois has financial difficulties, especially with education, a compromise was reached to pay the tracks a one-time fee, with the rest earmarked to education," Balmoral Park general manager Jim Hannon told harnessracing.com on Wednesday morning.

According to the IRB, the Balmoral Park purse account will receive \$2,998,450, with the Maywood Park purse account receiving \$1,925,762. Despite the influx of dollars, Hannon, who also serves as simulcast director at both Balmoral and Maywood, said purses wouldn't immediately increase.

"We received money through a settlement a few years ago regarding legislation from three percent of money from the highest grossing casinos. That was significant and dispersed, and we've been using that money for purses currently now," said Hannon. "There is an overpayment of purses currently, and this money will be added in to that so we can try and maintain similar purse levels.

"We want to maintain purses going forward...and there will be an agreement reached between the tracks and the horsemen of the allocation of the purse money over time," added Hannon.

With the total money divided equally between the tracks and the purse accounts, Balmoral Park will receive \$1,618,490, with Maywood Park receiving \$2,066,115. Hannon said the money will be used for operating expenses.

"We're still awaiting slots and purses are still at an overpayment, and the purses aren't significant enough to keep the top trainers, drivers and owners from leaving our state and going out east where purses are significantly higher," said Hannon. "We are still trying to pursue legislation for slots at the racetracks so we don't need a subsidy, we can do it on our own, and if that happens we could become the number-one harness track in the country and probably attract the best drivers, trainers and owners in the business with the purses we would be able to offer."

While Hannon did not provide exact numbers, he said on-track business at Balmoral and Maywood suffered during the recent Stanley Cup playoffs, which concluded Monday

night with the Chicago Black Hawks taking home the coveted trophy.— *harnessracing.com*

NJSS Opens Up To Outside Stallions; Bill Heads To Christie

One week after the New Jersey Assembly passed a bill 74-0 that will help the state's Standardbred breeding industry, the state Senate gave its approval on Tuesday by a vote of 40-0. The bill, which allows the progeny of mares who have resided in New Jersey for at least 150 consecutive days between the date of conception and the date the foal is born in New Jersey, now goes to Governor Chris Christie for his signature.

The bill creates a Standardbred Development Program that expands the Sires Stakes program to include horses sired by stallions standing in other states, as long as the mare resides at a New Jersey breeding farm for the 150-day minimum. The bill is similar to one that was earlier this year passed in Kentucky, which that state's regulations calling for a 180-day mare residency minimum.

Retirement Foundation Awarded \$25,000 Grant

The Standardbred Retirement Foundation (SRF) announced that it has been awarded a \$25,000 grant from the American Society for the Protection of Animals (ASPCA). The grant is part of the ASPCA's "Retraining Racers" program and is to be used exclusively for the assistance needed to secure new careers and homes.

"We are very grateful that the ASPCA has recognized the importance of transitioning racehorses to a new career and the considerable expense that comes with that effort," said Paula Campbell, president of the SRF. "With the current large number of horses under our complete care, we are in need of new assistance to further enhance and expand our training and adoption efforts that we would not be able to do without this help." (SRF)
