

Toscano Confident Market Share Ready For Maple Leaf Trot

Market Share's 1:50.3 victory in a qualifier at the Meadowlands on July 13 was impressive, but no one believes it means he has a win in Saturday's \$543,000 Maple Leaf Trot already sewed up, not even his trainer, Linda Toscano.

"It's a very good group of horses," said Toscano. "It'll be a tough race."

Toscano planned to ship Market Share from her New Jersey base to Ontario on Thursday night. "If we leave earlier in the day, it would be like putting my horse in an oven," she added.

The Maple Leaf is full of speedsters, with half of the eight-horse field showing either career best marks or lines in 1:50 and change. Market Share is one of the sub-1:51 trotters in the race, taking a 1:50.3 mark last year at The Red Mile.

While surprised by the time, Toscano said she couldn't be upset when driver Tim Tetrick returned to the paddock.

"I didn't yell at Timmy, which is what I would have normally done," laughed Toscano. "Before the race I had told him don't do anything stupid, but make sure he's tight. These other horses in the qualifier all had more starts than us, more seasoning, and we were going to be facing them in Canada.

"The conversation Timmy and I had after the race was about what a damn shame we had to go that much in a qualifier. It's sad to see a field with that depth in a qualifier," continued Toscano. "That should have been a race for money, but I understand that they (racetracks) have to have enough betting interests. My horse has had only one (parimutuel) start in six weeks."

Among the well-primed threats Market Share will face in the Maple Leaf is new world record holder Uncle Peter, who set a 1:50.3 standard at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs on June 29. He competed in Market Share's qualifier at the Meadowlands. Trainer Jimmy Takter had David Miller in the sulky and they finished second. The Takter-trained Guccio finished fourth in the qualifier.

"My horses both qualified well that day, Uncle Peter and Guccio," said Takter. "Uncle Peter was not even asked at all."

While Market Share covered his last panel in the qualifier in :26.4, Guccio was flying too, buzzing home in :27 flat.

Maple Leaf contender Wishing Stone finished third in the Meadowlands qualifier, a couple of lengths behind Uncle Peter.

Mister Herbie, the defending Maple Leaf champion, is back for the 2013 edition and will start from post 2. He comes into the race off of a 1:53.3 win at Mohawk on July 1, which was his first start after a layoff.

"He's had a hoof issue, which was been well documented so we're not really as fit as we'd like to be," trainer Jeff Gillis told Mohawk publicist Greg Gangle. "He's a good horse and has won after long layoffs before. His hoof issue right now is under control and right now it's just catching up."

Gillis said he expects the race to be tough to win. "I would say the competition is deeper and maybe more evenly matched than last year. Last year it seemed like it was us and Chapter Seven," said Gillis. "This year there is no Chapter Seven, but there is a bunch of others that all seem to be able to go. A lot of 4 year olds have returned very well and from good connections. It's going to be a very exciting to race in it and for the fans." — *By Kathy Parker*

Will Monkey On My Wheel Ride In Roses Are Red?

When Monkey On My Wheel won the 2011 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace final at Woodbine Racetrack in a stakes-record 1:49.3, it was the crowning achievement for Ontario-based trainer Travis Umphrey, who also co-owns

the daughter of Mach Three. While 2012 wasn't the best of seasons for Monkey On My Wheel as she made the transition racing against older horses, she finished her campaign on a strong note with three consecutive wins in Preferred company at Woodbine. The good fortune con-

tinued in 2013 as she won her first four starts, but after finishing third in an April 28 race at Woodbine she came up sick and missed the next two months.

After a pair of qualifying wins in late June and early July, the now 5-year-old Monkey On My Wheel returned to the racetrack on July 13 where she finished fifth in a Roses Are Red elimination at Mohawk. Monkey On My Wheel will start from post 1 in Saturday night's \$323,500 final.

This is the second consecutive year Monkey On My Wheel made it to the Roses Are Red final; last year she finished fifth in her elimination and then 10th in the final.

"She struggled a little bit last year against those top mares, being 4 years old she had quite an adjustment," said Umphrey, who shares ownership with Mac Nichol and Tim Kane, a longtime client who purchased a small interest in early 2012. "She's been good with the mares here in Ontario, but she's just mid-range against the others like Anndrovette, Camille and the other ones.

"We had some health issues with her the last two months," continued Umphrey, who is based at First Line Training Center near Mohawk. "She had a high white count

and her differentials were reversed. We couldn't get on top of it and she eventually got over it on her own."

Monkey On My Wheel also drew post 1 for her Roses Are Red elim and after sitting third through the first half, was moved first-over by driver Keith Oliver against Anndrovette, who went on to score in 1:48.4. Despite pacing first-up into a back half of :54.1 and last quarter of :26.3, Monkey On My Wheel finished just 2 3/4 lengths behind.

"She was first-over against Anndrovette and that's pretty tough after being off two months...but at least she's back and hopefully she'll get a little piece in there on Saturday," Umphrey said of the winner of more than \$1.2 million.

Umphrey said he was content with Monkey On My Wheel drawing the rail in Saturday's final.

"It's not maybe the first spot you'd pick as it's a little tougher to leave from the rail, but she's probably better off getting away mid-pack anyway and we'll see it how it goes from there," said Umphrey. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Adios Elims On Saturday Night; Dew N Doughnuts Among Local Contenders

Sunfire Blue Chip and Vegas Vacation have been installed as 2-1 and 3-1 favorites, respectively, in Saturday night's eliminations for the \$500,000 (est.) Delvin Miller Adios at The Meadows. The final goes the following Saturday afternoon.

Sunfire Blue Chip won an elimination of the Max Hempt Memorial before finishing a close-up third in the final behind Captaintreacherous and Vegas Vacation. Vegas Vacation took a three-week vacation following two narrow losses to division leader Captaintreacherous in the Hempt.

There are four locally-based contenders, including long-shot Dew N Doughnuts, who starts from post 1 in the first elimination. While he's facing tough odds, that is nothing new for the 3-year-old pacer.

Bred and owned by Tom Klosky Jr., the colt needed two surgeries to his left hock because of joint and cartilage issues that threatened to end his racing career before it began. Dew N Doughnuts recovered successfully though and is ready for action in Saturday's Adios eliminations.

Dew N Doughnuts is a son of Klosky's stakes-winning mare Arbitration. Mike Wilder will drive the colt for trainer Norm Parker.

"He's been a nice horse for us considering we weren't sure he was going to get to race," said Parker, who has been based at The Meadows since following his father Dwane into the business in the early 1990s.

"We're reaching into the pot a little bit putting up the money for this, but it's here and he's not staked to any other big races down the road except the Little Brown Jug.

"The rail shouldn't be a bad spot for him because he's pretty handy off the gate. He should be able to protect

enough to stay in the race without hurting himself too bad. I think we're in a spot where we have a fair chance."

Dew N Doughnuts, by the stallion Real Desire, is Arbitration's first foal. Parker's second trainer, Terry Brewer, looked after Arbitration on the road when she was racing and Dew N Doughnuts' name is a reference to his love of cinnamon donuts, which he often shared with Arbitration, and Mountain Dew.

Arbitration won the 2004 Lynch Memorial Stakes and was second to Kikikatie in the 2004 American National and 2003 She's A Great Lady (losing by a nose). Parker trained Arbitration and co-owned the horse with Klosky during the early part of her six-year career, which concluded in 2008 with 32 wins and \$727,129 in earnings.

"She was just a pleasure," Parker said. "She was very laid back, but she gave us her all every race. He's a lot like her. He trained down exactly like her, kind of laid back, and never really showed you he was going to be a speed horse. I was prepared for that because of training her. I worked with him to make sure he knew what he was supposed to be doing."

Dew N Doughnuts was no worse than second in his first nine starts this year, with four wins. He then headed to the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes (PASS), where he drew outside posts in his first two races and finished seventh both times. He bled in the second one, so he was put on Lasix for a June 14 PASS start at Harrah's Philadelphia, and finished fourth.

He followed that race with a fourth-place finish, beaten a length, in a condition race at The Meadows. After a two-week layoff, Dew N Doughnuts won a qualifier in 1:53 at The Meadows on July 12.

"We're giving it our best shot," Parker said. "You never know what might happen in a horse race. Hopefully we'll have some luck." — *By Ken Weingartner/Harness Racing Communications*

Takter Has Big Chance For Fourth Yonkers Trot Win

The 59th edition of the Yonkers Trot is set for Saturday night, July 27, and two eliminations, set for July 20, will determine the field for the final, which will carry a purse of \$450,000. The first four finishers in each elim return for the final.

Anything can happen with trotters, especially on a half-mile track, but trainer Jimmy Takter appears to have the early favorite in Dontyouforgetit, a homebred with three wins in six starts this season. He will compete in the second elimination.

Dontyouforgetit is the fastest Yonkers Trot contender with a lifetime mark of 1:52.1f and also has experience on a half-mile track, finishing second in the Dexter Cup at Freehold this year.

Takter has won three editions of the Yonkers Trot, taking home the spoils three straight years from 2009-2011 with Judge Joe, On The Tab and Leader Of The Gang.


Dontyouforgetit will be facing a field that includes Detour Hanover, a winner of two of three starts this year and a 1:54.2 mark. The Yonkers Trot elim will be his first stakes appearance.

In the first of the two eliminations, Canadian-invader Creampuff MacDaddy will start from post 1 and comes into the race after finishing third in 1:54.3 at Mohawk on July 12. He was entered in the \$105,910 Canadian Breeders Championship at Mohawk Saturday and drew post 3, but when the Yonkers Trot attracted enough entries for eliminations, he was scratched from the CBC so as to chase the bigger pot at Yonkers. Also in the first elim is

Foiled Again Favored To Win Battle

Foiled Again, the sport's richest pacer with earnings of \$5,176,444, drew post 2 in Saturday's \$120,500 Battle of Lake Erie and has been named the 2-1 morning-line favorite by Northfield Park executive VP/director of racing Dave Bianconi.

Foiled Again will appear in the Battle an unprecedented five times and Saturday's 11th race will reveal if he is successful in becoming the first horse in Northfield Park history to win this event three times. The 9-year-old son of Dragon Again (2000 Battle champion) won in 2009 and 2011, joining Jaguar Spur (winner in 1988-89), Peruvian Hanover (winner in 2002-03) and Maltese Artist (winner in 2005, 2007) as the only four horses to win the Battle of Lake Erie twice.

Age does not seem to be slowing Foiled Again. He has paced his last five races in under 1:50.

Superfecta wagering has been added to Saturday's 11th race as well as a \$10,000 guaranteed Pick-4 pool. Saturday's Pick 4 will conclude with the Battle of Lake Erie.

More than \$1.1 million in purses will be up for grabs Saturday night at Hoosier Park, with the 14-race card highlighted by a quartet of \$200,000 Indiana Sires Stakes (INSS) Gold 3-year-old finals, four \$40,000 Silver 3-year-old finals, a pair of \$50,000 INSS finals for older horses (horse pace and mare trot), and four \$18,000 series finals.

The first of the four INSS finals is Race 3 for filly trotters, with the Dan Shetler-trained entry of Playful Innocence and ABC Crown Me Queen listed as the 3-1 morning-line favorite.

Starting from post 4 and the stronger half of the entry is Playful Innocence, a multiple-time winner last year on the INSS Silver circuit, who made a break in his INSS gold debut this year. Since that time she has a pair of seconds and, most recently, a career-best 1:55.2, wire-to-wire score on July 10. Bred by Shetler and his wife, Jo Anne, the daughter of Justice Hall is out of Mr. Vic mare American Graffiti, who finished second in the 2004 American National 3-Year-Old Filly Trot at Balmoral Park.

ABC Crown Me Queen starts from post 6 and comes into the race off a third-place finish in her most recent INSS preliminary. The daughter of ABC Garland was a three-time winner last year but is winless in five attempts in 2013.

Race 9 is the INSS final for colt pacers, with Night Pro marked as the 5-2 favorite from post 6 with Jason Dillander driving. The Dale Decker-trained son of Pro Bono Best is out of the \$750,000-winning mare Midnight Jewel. Unraced at two, Night Pro won the first eight races of his career this year before posting back-to-back second-place finishes. Night Pro got back on the winning track last time out on July 13 with a career-best 1:50.1 score in an INSS division.

The INSS final for colt trotters is Race 12, with Red Hot Herbie getting the nod of the oddsmaker at 5-2. Trained by Byron Hooley and driven by Derek Hooley, Red Hot Herbie has won half his eight starts this year, including a career-best 1:54.3 last time out in an INSS split. A son of Here Comes Herbie, Red Hot Herbie's second dam is the Ohio Sires Stakes champion Six Point.

The Ron Burke-trained entry of Hoosier Chinna and Mandy's Mattjesty is the 2-1 choice in Race 13, the INSS Gold final for filly pacers. Hoosier Chinna, who finished second and third in last year's INSS Gold finals at Indiana Downs, has a win, two seconds and a fourth in INSS action this year. Dillander drives from post 4. Mandy's Mattjesty, who was unraced in 2012, hasn't missed the board in seven starts this year, including a career-best 1:51.3 score last time out in an INSS contest. Sam Widger will drive from post 5.

ONES TO WATCH

Friday night there are plenty of 2 year olds in action to watch. At Mohawk, the Ontario Sires Stakes Mid Summer Challenge for colts and fillies is on the card, with \$150,000 finals and consolations. There are quite a few offspring from the first crops by Mister Big and Shadow Play competing (Race 5 for fillies; Race 7 for colts).

Tioga Downs also is using its five-eighths mile oval as a stage for 2 year olds with Geers Stakes. A full brother to \$1.5 million winner See You At Peelers is in Race 1 with Yannick Gingras driving. The Geers divisions are Races 1, 3, 6, 7, 8 and 9.

The first race at Mohawk on Saturday night is a Hambletonian preview to watch as 2012 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Colt Trot champion **WHEELING N DEALIN** will make just his second start. Trainer Dustin Jones entered the Cantab Hall colt in an overnight and he will start from post 7 against a field of mostly older horses, but among the exceptions is the 3-year-old Kadabra colt **FLANAGAN MEMORY**, a winner of the Goodtimes.

In addition to the Maple Leaf Trot and Roses Are Red, also on the Mohawk card are Canadian Breeders Championship finals for 3 year olds, a Preferred Pace (Race 11) with 2012 Little Brown Jug winner **MICHAEL'S POWER** (who won

the Preferred in 1:48.4 last Saturday at Mohawk), and an overnight (Race 4) which includes 2011 William Haughton Memorial winner **ALEXIE MATTOSE**, who will be making his first pari-mutuel start of the season.

Before the Meadowlands turns on the lights Saturday night, baby races and qualifiers are slated, and Hambletonian hopeful **SMILIN ELI** has been entered. However, because of his scratch from the Stanley Dancer Memorial due to questions about who was really training him, the New Jersey Racing Commission stewards must approve him before he can race, even in a qualifier.

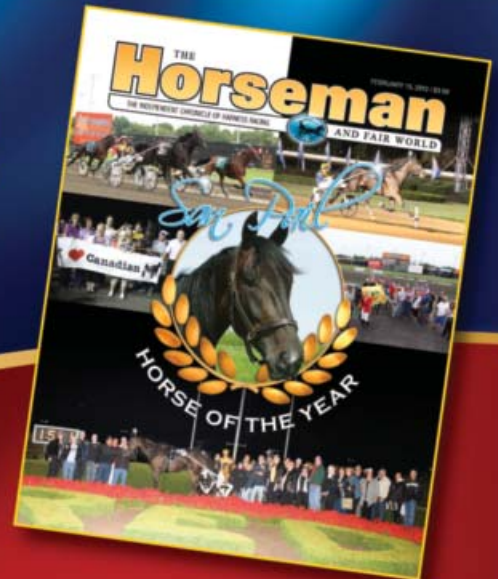
At the Meadowlands on Saturday night, 2012 Dan Patch 3-Year-Old Filly Trot champion **CHECK ME OUT** will make her first start of 2013, and it is a tough assignment in Race 6. She drew post 10 and will face Maven and Personal Style, who finished on the wire together in a Miss Versatility leg at the Big M the previous week.

At The Meadows, in addition to eliminations for the Adios, the track will feature 2-year-old pacing fillies in Pennsylvania Sires Stakes. In Race 4, **GALLIE BY THE BEACH**, who is undefeated in all three of her career starts, will be handicapped a bit by post 8.

Hambletonian Eligibles Sweep PASS Divisions

Seventeen Hambletonian-eligible 3-year-old trotters were in action at Harrah's Philadelphia on Thursday afternoon in a trio of \$79,416 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes (PASS) divisions, with all three splits won by horses heading to the trotting classic on Aug. 3 at the Meadowlands. The races were contested under sweltering conditions, with a post-time temperature of 96 degrees and a heat index of 107 degrees.

Race 4 kicked off the PASS action and what was pretty much a single-file-the-entire-distance race resulted in a 1:54.4 victory by Hambo-eligible Creatine, driven by Mike Lachance for trainer Bob Stewart and breeder-owner Diamond Creek Farm. Lachance sat the two hole until the top of the stretch before tipping Creatine out and past Its Complicated to win by 1 ¼ lengths.

Creatine finished second in a Reynolds division July 5 at the Meadowlands, but a post-race scope revealed a throat issue, which led to surgery.

"He had been racing well, but not as well as we thought, so we scoped him after he was second, so he had throat surgery done the Monday after," said Stewart. "Mike said he was very strong today and that's what we were looking for. It was good because Mike didn't have to move him until he wanted to, so it was an easy race for him. He responded well so we're very happy."

In the second PASS division, favorite All Laid Out appeared on his way to a victory turning for home for driver Dave Palone, but he made a break, with High Bridge, who was sitting second, not able to get out of the way and also going offstride. That led to an easy path to the finish line for the 2012 Peter Haughton Memorial winner Aperfectyankee in 1:54.1.

Owned, trained and driven by Jim Oscarsson, Aperfectyankee began to range up first-over past the half and was still holding his ground on the outside through the final turn. When the top twosome made their stretch breaks, Aperfectyankee was able to trot on to his third win in five starts this year. Vibe Blue Chip was second, with Major Athens, a multiple winner on the PASS circuit last year, finishing third after working his way along the pylons midway through the race.

Spider Blue Chip and Possessed The Fashion, driven by Ron Pierce and John Campbell, respectively, sat one-two in the third division and that's the way they finished, despite a valiant stretch bid by the latter. The heavily-favored Spider Blue Chip crossed the wire in 1:53, holding off Possessed Fashion by less than a length, with Bloodstockshalltab finishing third to complete an all-Hambo-eligible trifecta.

Chuck Sylvester trains the winning son of Andover Hall, who was second by a head in last weekend's Stanley Dancer Memorial final.

WEG's Eaves: No Harness At Woodbine A Bad Idea

Nick Eaves, CEO of Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG), recently discussed the Ontario Horse Racing Industry Transition Panel plan and told Dave Briggs of The Canadian Sportsman that he has serious problems with some of its recommendations.

His number one objection is the panel's proposal that WEG share its revenues with other members of the racing industry. Eaves told Briggs WEG has, "no interest in...moving into a new model which has us transferring our hard-earned economics somewhere else."

WEG takes in about 77 cents of every dollar wagered on harness racing in Ontario (and about 73 cents of every dollar bet in the country). WEG has also made substantially larger investments in racing than other companies in the province with its premier online and telephone account betting system (HorsePlayer Interactive) and an extensive, physical teletheatre network in the Greater Toronto Area.

Eaves also said he doesn't agree that harness racing should be discontinued at Woodbine, as the Transition Panel proposes. "I think it would be a mistake to take live Standardbred racing out of the Toronto market where the vast majority of people are," Eaves said. "I don't think a customer suggested that. I don't think anybody said, 'Live racing at Woodbine in the Toronto market is failing. The total pools don't cut it.' I don't think a full assessment was undertaken."

Bob Burgess Gives His Take On Ontario Panel's Plan

In a letter penned on July 16, Canadian Horse Racing Hall Of Famer Robert Burgess provides the Ontario Horse Racing Industry Transition Panel with his take on their draft plan.

"This opening statement as the Panel's basic and fundamental premise for their current analysis of the Ontario Racing Industry is itself both completely false and very misleading," wrote Burgess.

Drop The Ball has won multiple stakes races during her career, set a world record and earned more than \$1 million. If she only had a little luck on her side, her list of accomplishments might be even more impressive.

"She's had a pretty good career, but she hasn't had the best of luck in the big races," trainer Tony O'Sullivan said as he preps Drop The Ball for Saturday's \$323,500 Roses Are Red Stakes for older female pacers at Mohawk Racetrack.

"She never gets an easy trip. It seems the race always works out where she's doing the road work for everyone else.

"You've got to make your own luck at the top level. It would be nice to see her get the perfect trip and for things to go in our favor this time."

DropThe Ball and Anndrovette won the Roses Are Red eliminations last weekend. DropThe Ball won by two lengths over Bettor B Lucky in 1:49.1.

"She was super," said O'Sullivan, who trains DropThe Ball in Canada while Ross Croghan handles the conditioning in the States. "She did it easy and paced strong right through the wire."

The 5-year-old DropThe Ball has won 18 of 42 career races and earned \$1.07 million for owners Let It Ride Stables, Dana Parham and Robert Cooper Stables. In 2011, DropThe Ball won the Mistletoe Shalee, Bluegrass and Matron stakes as well as a division of the Shady Daisy.

She finished second in the 2011 Breeders Crown for 3-year-old filly pacers and was second again last year after moving into the mares division. She also was second in last year's Roses Are Red and Golden Girls.

"She deserves to win a big one," O'Sullivan said. "It's going to be tough. There are so many good mares in this division that with the right trip on any given day can win." (HRC)

Burnin Money Looks For Maple Leaf Upset

Burnin Money is considered a longshot for Saturday's \$543,000 Maple LeafTrot at Mohawk, but conditioner Carmen Auciello doesn't mind being an outsider.

Burnin Money, a 5-year-old son of Cash Hall, has banked \$124,760 this season and will face the toughest task of his career against seven of the finest trotters in North America in the 61st edition.

"I know we're considered a longshot, but I also know what my horse is capable of," Auciello said. "It's a great group of horses this year and it's going to be a great race. With the right trip, I think we can hopefully get a piece of it."

Last time out, on July 8 at Mohawk, the 15-time winner put in an uncharacteristic break at the gate, which spotted the field 18 lengths. The speedy trotter then caught the field, using a :27.1 final quarter to finish eighth, defeated just 5 1/4 lengths.

"The start before we wanted to leave with him and Anthony (MacDonald) got him down to the quarter on top in :26.3 and we wanted to do that again," explained Auciello. "But, I think he just got too hot on us at the gate. He trotted his last three-quarters in 1:23 or close to it, so he was still impressive and couldn't be faulted for his effort."

Jonathan Drury, who has been racing in Pennsylvania this summer, will return home this weekend to team up with Auciello in hopes of guiding Burnin Money to a thrilling victory.

The \$543,000 purse will be the richest prize ever contested for both Auciello and Drury.

"He will have to come up with the biggest mile of his career on Saturday," Drury said. "He's facing off against the best trotters in North America and it's going to be a great race with honest fractions. Burnin Money has been racing well all year, we have the inside post and all we can do is hope for the best trip possible."

Drury, just 24 years old, is well aware of the rich history of the Maple LeafTrot.

"This race has been around for years and I've seen it live many times since I was a kid," he said. "You get the best horses, drivers and trainers. To be a part of it is such a great feeling."

Owned by Wheelhouse Racing, Burnin Money has banked \$205,136 with a mark of 1:52.4. (WEG)

"Zeke" Parker Drives 11,000th Career Winner

There's an old adage that says, "save the best for last," and that's exactly what Billy "Zeke" Parker Jr. (right) did Tuesday, July 16, when he reined Topgun Raider to a 1:56.3 victory for his 11,000th career win in the 13th and final race at Monticello Raceway.

"I'm really glad I won my 11,000th with Bobby Merton's girlfriend's horse," Parker said during the blanket presentation ceremony. "When I had a big stable Bobby worked for me for over 10 years."

Parker, who's not known to be very emotional, had to wipe tears from his eyes when he was joined by family, friends, management and some fellow drivers who came in from the paddock to be part of the winner's circle ceremonies.

Asked if he was nervous as he neared 11,000 wins, Parker unashamedly admitted, "Yeah, I was. I was pushing a little at the end at the end. I'm glad it's over and I'm proud, 11,000 is a lot of wins."

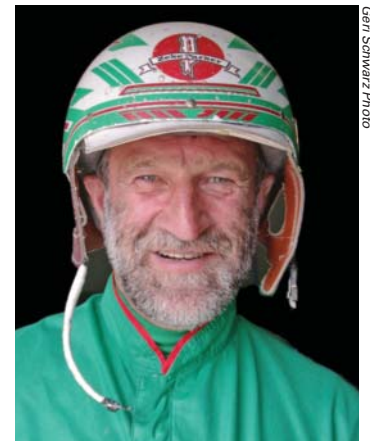

Driver Tim Tetrick told harnessracing.com that he didn't get home until 6:30 a.m. following Saturday night's card at the Meadowlands, but it wasn't because he was out celebrating his wins with Captaintreacherous in the \$635,750 Meadowlands Pace and I Luv The Nitelife in the \$184,250 Mistletoe Shalee.

There were plenty of traffic problems at the Meadowlands complex on Saturday night as the race card was contested at the same time as a Taylor Swift concert at adjacent MetLife Stadium. But it was limousine problems that led to Tetrick's adventurous trip home with his family.

Tetrick said he rented a limousine to take him and his wife, Ashley, and their children back home but mechanical problems not once, but twice, turned the approximate 100-mile journey to their home near Philadelphia into a trip that took several hours.

"We never even left the parking lot and it broke down, and we sat there for more than an hour waiting for another limo," said Tetrick by cell phone shortly after arriving at Harrah's Philadelphia for Sunday afternoon's race card. "We got the other limo and that one broke down on the turnpike. After waiting an hour and half for the tow truck, I got home at 6:30."

Tetrick added that he received a full refund from the limousine company.

Fourth Hole In One For Paula Campbell

Driver John Campbell finished second with Odds On Equuleus on Saturday night in the \$635,750 Meadowlands Pace at the Meadowlands Racetrack, and then on Sunday he and his wife, Paula, finished second in a husband-wife golf tournament at the Hackensack Golf Club in Hackensack, N.J.

While Campbell told harnessracing.com Monday afternoon that was pleased with both second-place finishes, the second came with an extra thrill as Paula made a hole-in-one on the 146-yard third hole.

"It was down a valley and up the other side, so it was on the ground, and once it came up the swale, it tracked right into the hole," said Campbell.

It was Paula's fourth career hole-in-one, and put her two ahead of her husband in that category.

Leo Burns, Famous For Driving In His 90s, Dies

Leo Burns, known for driving horses at age 97 and profiled in a 2010 story in *The New York Times* about his longevity, died Saturday, July 13, at the age of 98. On Sunday, July 14, a moment of silence was held during the opening post parade at the Wayne County Fair to remember Mr. Burns.

A resident of Albion, Ill., Mr. Burns drove twice in 2012 and won both races, including at the Albion fair with his horse Winsome Wyoming. At the time of his passing, he was still the oldest driver to win a harness race.

When he was driving in 2010, he spoke with the *Times* reporter about racing at the Effingham County Fair, where summers are known to be hot.

"As hot as it is now, I'm ready to quit," he said in a telephone interview last week. "It's just terrible. It's 100 here today."

Born in Iowa, Mr. Burns worked with horses at a young age and was driving a five-horse hitch by the time he was 14, working farm land for a neighbor. In his late teens he traveled west and worked on a ranch and for a division of the forestry department. When he returned to Iowa, he met Marjorie, and they married in 1946. Together they ran a restaurant and gas station.

Marjorie's father farmed and trained Standardbreds as a hobby, and before long Leo was helping with the horses. In the 1940s Leo and Marjorie started racing horses at the Chicago tracks, Fairmount Park, Louisville Downs, and the Illinois fairs.

When Marjorie became ill in the late 1990s, Mr. Burns was her constant caretaker and gave up their racing stable. When his wife passed away, Mr. Burns was left with plenty of time, and a desire to go back to the track.

Mr. Burns bought Winsome Wyoming in 2005 for \$2,600. The mare was tough to deal with, but had enough speed that he never gave up on her. Together they won 30 of 47 races and the mare earned more than \$55,000 in purses. Only twice did someone other than Mr. Burns drive Winsome Wyoming: on July 9, when his friend Leroy Moore won with her at the Martinsville fair, and in 2003, when Dave Magee drove her to a third-place finish at Springfield.
