Colonial Trot A Hambletonian Rematch

After a week off resting on his laurels of capturing the \$1 million Hambletonian on Aug. 6 at the Meadowlands, Marion Marauder will be back in action on Saturday in the \$500,000 Colonial Trot at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono.

The nine-horse field includes six who raced in the Hambletonian final, including Southwind Frank and Sutton, second and third, respectively, in the photo finish at the Big M.The field also includes Bar Hopping and Waitlifter K, who respectively finished fifth and fourth.

While Marion Marauder drew post 2, the race is interesting on paper as all the above-mentioned trotters drew the

outside starting spots.

Driver Scott Zeron said while having the two hole is a good thing, he will be looking hard to his right at the start to see what strategy his driving peers have in mind.

"It's a perfect spot. From the two hole we have options and I like it," said Zeron. "The only bad thing is that every one of their hands is forced and they have to

leave. At the same time, I am the one who can dictate where they get away. The whole field is going to be leaving on the outside which isn't a great thing. But I have faith in my horse; he can do anything. Hopefully we get away well."

Zeron said having Southwind Frank, who Marion Marauder edged by a nose in the Hambo final, in post 6 could work to his advantage.

"The only good thing is that they all know they can't outleave Frank," said Zeron.

Mike Keeling, who trains Marion Marauder along with his wife, Paula Wellwood, said following the Hambletonian the *Continues on page 2 >>>>*

trotter did not return to their home base in Cambridge, Ont., but instead remained at Magical Acres in New Jersey.

"When they get acclimatized to that heat, I think it is best just to stay there," Keeling explained. "I think the shipping is hard on them."

Marion Marauder's double-heat sweep of the Hambo brought him to six wins in seven starts this year, as well as catapulting the son of Muscle Hill past the \$1 million mark in career earnings for owners Jean Wellwood and Mike's son, Devin Keeling.—By Gordon Waterstone

Southwind Frank Looks To Atone In Colonial

Two weeks after coming up a nose short of capturing the \$1 million Hambletonian, Southwind Frank will be out to make amends in Saturday's \$500,000 Colonial for 3-year-old colt trotters. Southwind Frank drew post 6 in the field of nine and is listed as the 3-1 second choice on the morning line, behind the 5-2 favorite Marion Marauder (post 2), who

he was edged by in the Hambo photo.

Prior to the double-heat Hambletonian, trainer Ron Burke changed Southwind Frank's rigging from an open bridle to a blind bridle minus blinkers for the elimination. After Frank gave up a three-length lead in

the stretch and settled for second behind a late-closing Marion Marauder, Burke went back to the open bridle for the final.

In the final, driver Yannick Gingras and Southwind Frank took the lead from Sutton at the quarter pole but then yielded to Bar Hopping. Content to sit the pocket, Gingras found himself having to not only rate Southwind Frank but also attempt to keep him from making a break at the top of the stretch. As Marion Marauder closed fast on the outside down the lane, Gingras sent Southwind Frank up the inside, but the bid fell just short. Steps past the wire, Southwind Frank finally went on a break.

Trainer Burke said Tuesday (Aug. 16) that he doesn't anticipate any equipment changes for the Colonial.

"I think we'll go the way we are," said Burke.

Burke said he still can't determine exactly why Southwind Frank didn't appear 100 percent for the Hambletonian.

"I really can't put my finger on anything yet," said Burke. "He seems alright."

Burke said he likes post 6 for Southwind Frank, as well as post 1 for his second Colonial starter in Dayson, who has won three straight since trotting hobbles were added, including a seven-length romp in a New York Sires Stakes split last time out on Aug. 9 at Saratoga.

"At Pocono the six is a nice spot because you can race either way," said Burke.—*By Gordon Waterstone*



"Big Three" Among Colt Pacers Meet In Battle Of The Brandywine

For the first time since respectively finishing one-twothree in the \$1 million North America Cup on June 18 at Mohawk, Betting Line, Racing Hill and Control The Moment will meet up in Saturday night's \$500,000 Battle of the Brandywine at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. With Racing Hill having captured the Hempt Memorial and Control The Moment winning the Meadowlands Pace, the trio has thus far annexed the three richest races for 3-year-old colt pacers in 2016.

The Battle of the Brandywine is one of three major stakes events on the 14-race card, which includes consolations and a trio of invitationals carrying total purses of \$2,279,500. First race post time is 6:30 p.m., with former Pittsburgh Steeler Joe Greene, a member of the NFL Hall of Fame, signing autographs and posing for photos from 4-6 p.m.

Drawing post 1 in the Battle of the Brandywine is Betting Line, who gave driver David Miller and trainer Casie Coleman an anxious moment in the final turn of last Saturday's \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park. Betting Line made a break in the last turn while challenging first-over for the lead. Miller was able to gather his charge and Betting Line not only found his stride but he charged home and drew clear to a four-length win in 1:51.1. The win was Betting Line's eighth in a row, dating back to a May 21 conditioned race at Mohawk.

"Dave said to me he was pacing perfect and when he came with him he was going to blast to the front, but he could tell the driver in front (Kayne Kauffman, with Mr. Wiggle Pants) wasn't going to let him go real easy," said Coleman. "So he decided he would sit out there and rate him and take hold of him. When he took hold of him he started running in...and when he got around the turn he was babying him getting ready to launch him because he knew he had lots of horse. Whether he touched himself or what he did, he started running in and got sideways and obviously went offstride for a scary few moments. Dave said once he

corrected him and pulled the plugs he was just perfect. He paced right through the wire."

Coleman said a veterinarian checked Betting Line on Monday morning (Aug. 15) and she had a few minor things worked on.

"I haven't done much vet work on him since the North America Cup and he needed some touch-up work," said Coleman. "Nothing major, just a few things we needed to address."

Coleman said she plans on making one equipment change for the Battle of the Brandywine.

"I'm going to bring his hobbles in a little bit," Coleman said. "I gave him a pretty long hobble because he has such a long gait on him."

Coleman said the Milstein over the half-mile track at Northfield Park became a test run of sorts for the Sept. 22 Little Brown Jug at Delaware, Ohio.

"He doesn't really have an issue with the small tracks, just a few different things I need to do with his rigging," she said. "We know we can't take hold of him because he's even done it in the straightaway multiple times. He wants to rock and roll; he doesn't want you to take hold of him."

Coleman said she is looking forward to the match-up between her colt and Racing Hill and ControlThe Moment.

"This is the first time he'll meet them since the Cup and I think he's ready and I'm sure they're ready off the way their lines look," she concluded. "It should be a good race." —By Gordon Waterstone

Hambo Third-Place Finisher Sutton "Major Player" In Colonial

After seeing Sutton come within a photo finish of winning the Hambletonian earlier this month, co-owner-driver Andy Miller believes the 3-year-old colt can remain in the picture among the division's best trotters the rest of the season.

Sutton's next opportunity arrives Saturday when he competes in the \$500,000 Colonial at The Downs at Mohegan Sun Pocono. Sutton, trained by Miller's wife Julie, will start from post 7 and is 6-1 on the morning line.

"He raced super in the final of the Hambletonian," Andy Miller said. "I'm very happy with third, but to be that close, if things had gone a little differently maybe he could have gotten there. He got close to a win at least."

Sutton, who battled health and soundness issues earlier this year, has won four of 17 career races and earned \$280,306 for owners Andy Miller Stable, Jason Allen, and Doug Allen. Over his last five starts Sutton has posted a win, two seconds, and a third. His only off-the-board finish came in his Hambletonian elimination, where he was fourth.

"He's really been good his last three or four starts," Miller said. "He had a few issues earlier in the year but the last

month or so he's been on his game. He's been pretty sharp.

"I think he's a major player. I don't know if he's the best, but I think he's a major player in the 3-year-old ranks and might go on to be a nice aged horse after that. He's a fast horse, it's just a matter of keeping all the pieces of the puzzle in place."

Earlier this year, Sutton won a qualifier at the Meadowlands in 1:51.2. The time is tied for the fastest mile of the season by a 3-year-old trotter.

"Hopefully with a little racing luck we can be close somewhere and get a good piece of it," Miller said.

The Miller Stable also sends out Milligan's School in the Colonial.

Brian Sears is listed to drive the colt, who has won eight of 25 races and earned \$490,226 for owner Stroy Inc.

"He's a very nice horse," Miller said. "He's honest and goes about his work. He's close all the time. He almost always races very good." (HRC)



Wiggle it Jiggleit Makes 10-Hour Trip To Quebec For Prix d'Ete

Back on top in the weekly poll conducted by Harness Racing Communications, Wiggle It Jiggleit heads to Montreal for Sunday's \$200,000 Prix d'Ete at Hippodrome 3R. With Montrell Teague driving from post 1, Wiggle It Jiggleit is listed as the 5-2 morning-line choice in the race restricted to 4-year-old pacers.

Although the race conditions call for the richest eight entrants to make the field, just five will line up behind the gate, including the 2015 Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit.

Wiggle It Jiggleit has spent the last six weeks at number two in the poll since being bumped from the top spot by Always B Miki. But when WIJI bested Miki by a length in last Friday's \$325,000 Dan Patch at Hoosier Park, he received 26

-George Teague Jr. on Wiggle It Jiggleit being the richest Standardbred in North America in 2016 of 35 first-place votes in this week's poll, with Miki dropping to just four votes.

Owner George Teague Jr. says it feels so good to be reunited with the top spot.

"I think it's right to be number one, but a lot of people feel Miki should still be, and I can't blame them for that," said Teague.

With seasonal earnings of \$1,016,927, Wiggle It Jiggleit is the leading money-winning

Standardbred in North America this year. The 4-year-old pacing gelding secured the top position on the earnings leaderboard when he finished second in the \$225,550 U.S. Pacing Championship on Aug. 6 at the Meadowlands.

If Wiggle It Jiggleit holds onto the top spot on the money list at the end of the year, he would become the first non-3-year-old horse to take the earnings title since the 6-year-old mare trotter Moni Maker in 1999. That year Moni Maker earned \$1,494,972, slightly more than the 3-year-old pacer Blissfull Hall, who amassed \$1,326,819.

"It would be a nice honor," Teague said of WIJI possibly topping the earnings list. "There are more opportunities now for older horses, especially like him who shows up week in and week out, and to be that sharp. He's just a special horse."

Teague said Wiggle It Jiggleit—who went over the \$3 million mark in career earnings in the Dan Patch—will make the 10-hour ship to Hippodrome 3R on Thursday. Teague said he plans on flying in on Saturday for what will be his first-ever trip to Quebec.

Teague said Wiggle It Jiggleit and trainer Clyde Francis will then remain in Canada for the Canadian Pacing Derby eliminations on Aug. 27 at Mohawk Racetrack (final on Sept. 3).

"He trained as sharp as he always trains," said Teague. "He just does what he does. He is sounder now than he's ever been. The question is, can he stay fresh for the next three months?"—By Gordon Waterstone

Nuncio Scores In Jubilee Trophy To Post 33rd Win Of Career

Nuncio won the 49th race of his career on Wednesday night when he captured the Jubilee Trophy at the Solvalla track in Stockholm, Sweden.

Two weeks ago Nuncio was scratched from a race because he had developed a fever. But he showed no ill effects, and enjoyed a favorable trip in the race to win for trainer-owner Stefan Melander.

Spartan Kronos and the Melander-trained Volstead volleyed for the lead until less than a quarter of a mile remained in the 2,140-meter race (1.3 miles). Regular driver Orjan Kihlstrom tipped Nuncio from second-over and the 5-year-old Andover Hall stallion trotted away to win by a clear margin in a mile rate time of 1:53.4f, which was a Swedish record for the distance.


"He felt fresh and nice all the way," Kihlstrom told Swedish trotting publication Trav Ronden.

Nuncio has never finished worse than third in his career with 33 wins, 14 second-place finishes and two thirds.

French Laundry also won on the program for Melander while D'One, the winner of last year's Fresh Yankee on Hambletonian day at the Meadowlands, finished off the board in the European Championship for mares.

The program also celebrated Margareta Wallenius-Kleberg of Menhammar Stud in Sweden and Stoner Creek Farm in Kentucky. Mrs. Wallenius-Kleberg presented a trophy to French Laundry for winning the Big NoonTrot, a race named after the famous horse campaigned by her father.

Champions Set To Be Crowned On Kentucky Super Night

The Red Mile hosts Kentucky Super Night on Sunday, Aug. 21, with total purses of \$1.4 million offered. The program features eight Kentucky Sires Stakes (KYSS) finals for 2 – and 3-year-old pacers and trotters of both sexes, with each contest worth \$175,000.

The historic racetrack in Lexington will soon mark the oneyear anniversary of the opening of its new gaming parlor that houses 902 Historical Racing machines as well as a remodeled simulcasting area.

Last year's Kentucky Super Night was dominated by winning favorites and with two preliminary rounds already in the books and several dominating performances, it could lead to a repeat night of bettors' choices reaching the winner's circle.

There was no more dominant a winner in the early rounds than He's On A Mission, who looks to be an overwhelming favorite to capture the KYSS final for 2-year-old male trotters. Driven by Charlie Conrad for trainer and co-owner Stacey Ruddick, the son of Groton Hall has cakewalked to two victories, scoring by six lengths in round one and then romping to an 18 ½-length score in round two. He's On A Mission starts from the outside post 6 in Race 12.

Favored in the five-horse final for 2-year-old filly trotters is Mystic Stella, who had no problems in her first two KYSS starts with wins by 6 ¾ and 9 ¼ lengths, respectively. Tom Jackson drives the daughter of Groton Hall for trainer Pete Foley from post 4 in Race 3.

Prelim winners InThe Dark (Cambest) and Al-Mar-Got A Fever (Third Straight) are favored in the KYSS final for 2-year-old filly pacers (Race 6), while Kirsch (Cambest) and V Power (Prince Chablis) appear the ones to beat in the KYSS final for 2-year-old male pacers (Race 4).

A trio of 3 year olds are back to defend their KYSS titles of a year ago. The group includes Erica America (Northern



Kid), who starts from post 1 in the KYSS final for 3-year-old filly trotters (Race 2) after finishing 5p8 and second in her preliminaries. Erica America will take on the likes of leg winners Cash In My Genes (Groton Hall) and Sea Shore (Tsunami Ranger).

After two impressive victories in the opening two rounds, Barryscourt looks primed to defend his title in the KYSS final for 3-year-old male trotters. The son of Northern Kid will be driven by Josh Sutton for trainer Bobby Brower in Race 7. Lakeisha Hall, who is also two-for-two in the early legs, is the likely favorite in the KYSS final for 3-year-old filly pacers (Race 11) starting from post 5, but the Dave Palone-driven, Ron Burke-trained daughter of Third Straight will have to contend with two-time runner-up Bellatricks (Third Straight) who starts from post 1 for driver Ronnie Wrenn Jr. and trainer Virgil Morgan Jr.

A new divisional champ is sure to be crowned in the KYSS final for 3-year-old male pacers, with the contenders headed by Best To Hurst (Cambest) and Cracker Cam (Cambest), who traded one-two finishes in the first two legs.

Post time for the first race on Sunday is 7 p.m. (EDT). The Red Mile will also offer a Pick 4 on races 7-10, with a \$10,000 guaranteed pool.
