

Shadow Play's Sons Giving Moore More Thrills

Late in the summer of 2007, a big, muscular colt named Somebeachsomewhere announced he was a budding superstar by winning Mohawk's Metro in a world record 1:49.3.

Among the beaten contenders in the '07 Metro was a colt named Shadow Play, who had made it to the Metro final by finishing third in his elim, behind Somebeachsomewhere and Dali. But then he drew post 8 in the final and was never a factor.

In the summer of 2008, Somebeachsomewhere was harness racing's undisputed superstar, dazzling a big crowd at Mohawk when he won the North America Cup and then earning even more respect with a second-place finish in the Meadowlands Pace, when he endured racing's version of an assault, forced to try to fight off rival Art Official in a blistering pace.

While Somebeachsomewhere's every race and very presence were news, Shadow Play generated lesser headlines by winning the Adios, held away from its Meadows home at Pocono. He won the Little Brown Jug too, but like the Adios, Somebeachsomewhere was nowhere near. When Shadow Play finished second to Somebeachsomewhere in the Breeders Crown at the Meadowlands later that fall, that's pretty much where his stature stood—second best to a horse most considered to be one of the greatest pacers of all time.

This year Dr. Ian Moore, who owned and trained Shadow Play, is reliving the summers of 2007 and 2008 with two sons of Shadow Play, Arthur Blue Chip and Play It Again Sam. Both colts won divisions of the Nassagaweya at Mohawk on Aug. 17 and will be competing in eliminations for the Metro this Saturday at Mohak.

"I started with seven Shadow Plays in the barn out of nine yearlings, and out of all of the ones I've worked with, Play It Again Sam reminds me the most of him," said Dr. Moore, who is also a veterinarian. "He's just as tough."

Play It Again Sam will start form post 1 in Race 7 at Mohawk on Saturday. He won his Nassagaweya division in 1:52, racing as the pacesetter for more than half the mile.

"I've only had him a couple of weeks," said Dr. Moore of Play It Again Sam, a colt Wayne Webby of Nova Scotia bought as a yearling for \$25,000 from breeder Perretti Farms. "He's a solid, real rugged colt and he knows what it's all about when he steps on the racetrack."

Arthur Blue Chip, a \$135,000 yearling purchase by Dr. Moore from breeder Blue Chip Bloodstock, is also fast and tough. He also took a career mark of 1:52 with his Nassagaweya victory for the Shadow One Stable.

"Arthur was a really well developed yearling," Dr. Moore said of the colt. "He's always been nonchalant, kind of lazy. But recently he's been on the bit, especially when horses get alongside of him. I think he's just learning. He's a bit 'studdy' now too."

Dr. Moore said he is hopeful both colts will advance to the Metro final.

"This week there are more of the American horses, but there's no reason at this point to think we can't compete. Play It Again Sam has coughed a few times, so I'm hoping it's nothing serious. Their father gave me great thrills in '08, and now he's doing it again." — *By Kathy Parker*

Johansson Makes Equipment Change On Western Vintage

There will be three eliminations for the Metro Pace at Mohawk on Saturday night, and the middle split (Race 7) includes New Jersey Sires Stakes champion Western Vintage. The Western Ideal colt has drawn post 3 and should be a threat, especially since his trainer, Nancy Johansson, says his break in stride in the Nassagaweya was an anomaly.

"He was just all wound up and he over-paced himself," said Johansson, whose husband, Marcus, drove the colt. "He shipped up to Canada Thursday and he was wound up on Friday, and Marcus said he was wound up when he warmed him up. He was feeling too good, I guess."

Western Vintage, who is a winner of three of four starts this season, is owned by Perry Soderberg, for many years a yearling advisor/consultant for Jimmy Takter. While evaluating yearlings for Takter, Soderberg noticed Western Vintage at Britany Farms, which bred the colt, and liked what he saw. When the colt was in the ring at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and bidding was low, he decided to buy him for \$9,000 and gave him to Nancy Johansson, the daughter of Takter.

Nancy said she has made a couple of changes for the Metro elim to try to avoid any repeat of what happened in the Nassagaweya.

"We changed his driving bit; he's now wearing a crescendo bit, which is a little sharper for him but less than a mini-bit," she revealed. "I also trained him at Mohawk on Tuesday. I trained him two continuous miles with each in about 2:30 speed. I just wanted him to be relaxed there and have a good experience, and he did."

Western Vintage is a 5-1 morning line choice in his Metro elim and will be driven by Yannick Gingras, who drove the colt to his New Jersey Sires Stakes championship win. The morning line favorite in the race is Somewhere In LA at odds of 5-2. — By Kathy Parker

McIntosh Brings A Family Affair To Mohawk

It will be a family affair for trainer Bob McIntosh on Saturday night at Mohawk as his starters in the Metro elims for 2-year-old colt pacers and the She's A Great Lady elims for 2-year-old filly pacers are closely related to his two

starters in the Canadian Pacing Derby elims for older horses.

McIntosh has fellow Hall of Famer John Campbell in the sulky for all four of his starters in the eliminations for the trio of major stakes, including Lasting Appeal, who kicks things off in the first of two She’s A Great Lady splits, leaving from post four.

A daughter of The Panderosa bred and owned by Robert McIntosh Stables and Al McIntosh Holdings, Lasting Appeal is a full sister to 2012 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champion and North America Cup third-place finisher Dapper Dude, who is one of the two McIntosh trainees in the Canadian Pacing Derby eliminations.

Although Lasting Appeal has just five starts under her girth, she is well-traveled as Mohawk will be the fifth

different racetrack she has lined up behind the gate at (“Yes, she’s been around a bit,” laughed McIntosh). Lasting Appeal’s three wins have come at Grand River, Hiawatha Horse Park and Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs, the latter site being where she earned her career mark of 1:54 in a Pennsylvania Stallion Series division. Gate issues last time out on Aug. 14 at The Meadows led to an off-the-board finish.

McIntosh's Somewhere In LA will leave from post seven in the second of three Metro elims. A son of Somebeach-somewhere, Somewhere In LA is also a homebred of Robert McIntosh Stables, Al McIntosh Holdings and CSX Stables, who campaigned the dam, West Of LA, to more than a quarter-million dollars in earnings. West Of LA is a half sister to 2012 North America Cup winner Thinking Out Loud, who is McIntosh's second Canadian Pacing Derby elim starter.

Somewhere In LA has won three of six starts, including a career-best 1:52.2 effort on Aug. 12 in a Pennsylvania Stallion Series division at The Meadows. McIntosh said the year didn't start on a high note for Somewhere In LA, but things turned around as a result of being gelded.

"He was a bit unruly and didn't want to put out," said McIntosh. "We gelded him before he started and he's gotten nothing but better. "He's improved a lot."

Not only have Dapper Dude and Thinking Out Loud carved out their own stellar resumes, but they also are now the answer to a trivia question as the pair teamed up to win the late Daily Double on the final race card of 2013 at the Meadows before a new grandstand opens later this year.

"Thinking Out Loud took some time to get rolling, but he was good at the Meadowlands," said McIntosh, noting the 4-year-old son of Ponder's first win in five starts this year—a career-best 1:47.2—on the Hambletonian day program at the Big M. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

Seekman Seeks First Metro Victory

North America's top freshman pacing colts and geldings are about to step into the spotlight. The lucrative \$700,000 Metro Pace is slated for Saturday night, Aug. 31, at Mohawk, but first, a trio of eliminations is required on Saturday, Aug. 24.

Illinois-based Joe Seekman has yet to win the rich classic and has a chance with top-ranked pacer Let's Drink On It, who has a solid 3-0-2 record from five starts this season. Seekman, who has trained winners over \$17 million in his career, has had nothing but praise for his youngster since his early lessons.

"He's just a natural and everything you want a racehorse to be."

"Since the first day we broke him, he's been an absolute gentleman," Seekman said. "He's just a natural and everything you want a racehorse to be. I've had high hopes for him since we first bought him and so far he's living up to it."

Seekman purchased the son of Art Official for a mere \$12,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale last fall.

"Maybe he caught my eye at the sale because I trained his father (Art Official)," Seekman said. "He was a sharp looking colt with presence to him. He did have a curb (a condition which causes the swelling of the lower part of the hock), which was likely the reason we got him at the price we did."

So far this year, Let's Drink On It has banked \$97,417 along with a 1:51.3 career best for owners Martin Scharf, Larry Bond and Hal Hewitt.

The talented pacer has won three Pennsylvania Sires Stakes events including his most recent outing at The Meadows in 1:52 on Aug. 13.

"He's two fingers to drive and very versatile, but he's been put on the front recently or close to it," said Seekman, who has 1,104 wins as a trainer. "He raced very well in his latest and is coming into the Metro in great shape. There's nothing else we can ask of him right now. For a young horse, he just does everything right and often acts like an older horse."

Three divisions of the \$40,000 Metro Pace eliminations will take place with the top three finishers and one-fourth place finisher advancing to the rich final.

"After this weekend we'll have a better indication of who the better colts are," said the veteran conditioner. "Right now, it's too early to tell, but hopefully we're in the top group."

Jim Morrill Jr. will drive Let's Drink On It from post 4 in the third elim. (WEG)

The George Ducharme-trained, Brian Sears-driven, Royalty For Life overcame post 8 to win the Dancer Memorial and then was rewarded for winning his Hambletonian elimination from post 8 by drawing post 1 for the final. But he drew the outside post 8 again in the Colonial on Aug. 17, and a tough overland journey led to a seventh-place finish.

Smilin Eli, Royalty For Life's nemesis in the Colonial as driver Tim Tetrick kept his rival parked first-over before yielding to Spider Blue Chip's successful up-the-pylons trip in the stretch, drew post 3 and that could again be pivotal to Royalty For Life's chances. Spider Blue Chip will hope to

build on his world-record 1:52.2 Colonial win in the Zweig, starting from post five for driver Ron Pierce.

As for Corky, he followed up his Beal win with third-place finishes in the Hambletonian final and Colonial. He starts from post 7 in the Zweig for driver David Miller. If there was an upstart hopeful, that bid could come from the 2012 Peter Haughton Memorial winner Aperfectyankee, who was fourth in both the Hambo final and Colonial for driver/trainer Jim Oscarsson.

Also on the card is the \$150,000 Zweig for 3-year-old filly trotters. The field includes the 2012 Two-Year-Old Filly Trotter of the Year To Dream On, who has just one win in eight starts this year and is coming off a break in a Colonial consolation when she took on her male peers. Yannick Gingras will drive from post 7.

The 2012 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes champ Frau Blucher will start from post 9 for Pierce. She has won four times in eight starts this year, all in PA contests. Frau Blucher finished third in her Hambo Oaks elims and then made a break in the final.

While Frau Blucher is the richest in the field with \$222,152 in earnings, Mistery Woman stands second with \$166,023. She won her Hambo Oaks elim and then made a break in the final. She has won twice in nine starts this year, with third-place finishes in the Elegantimage and Delvin Miller Memorial. Due to common ownership, Mistery Woman is coupled in the wagering with Shared Past and Curtsy Hanover.

Tioga/Vernon Drivers' Championship Gets Underway Sunday

Harness racing's version of the All-Star Game returns to Upstate New York when North America's premier drivers compete in the 7th Annual Tioga/Vernon Drivers' Championship. The first round of the event takes place at Vernon Downs on Sunday night, Aug. 25. The leader after the Vernon round will receive \$10,000. The drivers and their accumulated points will then head to Tioga Downs on a special Labor Day card, Monday, Sept. 2. The overall winner of the event receives \$25,000.

The continent's top six money-winning drivers will participate, led by Tim Tetrick, whose mounts have earned more than \$9.2 million in 2013. Tetrick has led North America in earnings for an unprecedented six straight years; however, he's never finished first in the Drivers' Championship in six appearances.

This year's field will also include Hambletonian winning driver Brian Sears; two-time champion Yannick Gingras; defending champion Ron Pierce; David Miller; and first-time participant Corey Callahan, who will also be honored with a bobblehead giveaway during the event.

Those six drivers will compete against leading Tioga Downs driver Jimmy Marohn Jr. and leading Vernon Downs driver Rick Plano. Leading Canada-based driver Jody Jamieson will participate as a sponsor's exemption.

Gaming Revenue Distributed In Ohio, Little Brown Jug Gets Purse Increase

The Ohio State Racing Commission on Thursday, Aug. 22, approved the distribution of more than \$2.1 million from gaming revenue at the four casinos in the state, garnered from its three-percent take on gross casino revenue.

Also, it was announced \$290,000 from the video lottery terminal (VLT) escrow fund at Scioto Downs will go to purses

at the Delaware County Fair and to the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association (OHHA). Nine percent of revenue from the VLTs goes into the account because there is no contract between the OHHA and Scioto regarding percentages.

A total of \$170,000 will go to the Delaware Fair, with \$120,000 used to support purses and \$50,000 to enhance the purse for the Little Brown Jug. According to fair marketing director Phil Terry, if at least 16 horses enter in this year's Jug, the total purse will now be more than \$550,000.

The remaining \$120,000 will be used by the OHHA to administer its Horsemen's Health Insurance Trust.

The Standardbred Development Fund will receive \$402,680. Raceway Park will receive \$59,890 for purses, Lebanon Raceway will receive \$69,892 for purses, Scioto Downs will receive \$79,893 for purses, and Northfield Park will receive \$326,361 for purses. Tracks that are not connected to full-blown casinos—Lebanon, Northfield and Scioto—will each receive an additional \$79,476. The Commission will receive \$105,968 for administrative costs.

Pocono Outrider Terry Scott Injured In Accident

Terry Scott, the outrider at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs, is in serious condition in Geisinger Medical Center in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., after getting thrown and injured while trying to catch a loose horse in the track's barn area on Tuesday. He worked the big Super Stakes Saturday card at the track last weekend with a eye-catching horse named Gunner, but was riding a different horse in the barn area on Tuesday. That horse was spooked and threw Scott.

Round 2 Of Kentucky Sires Stakes For 3YOs Saturday At Red Mile

Offspring of Hambletonian champion Deweycheatumnhowe dominate the program on Saturday night, Aug. 24, at The Red Mile as 14 sons and 11 daughters of the 2008 Trotter of the Year will be on the track for the second and final preliminary round of Kentucky Sires Stakes for 3 year olds.

The 3-year-old colt trotters kick things off on Saturday with a pair of \$15,000 divisions comprising the early Daily Double. While first-round division winner Master Of Law sits the week out, Lauderdale, who captured his division in a career-best 1:54.1, will start from post 4 in Race 1 as the 7-5 morning-line favorite. Lauderdale, a son of Deweycheatumnhowe who finished sixth in this year's \$1 million Hambletonian final earlier this month at the Meadowlands, will be driven by Corey Callahan for trainer Jonas Czernyson.

The role of favorite in Race 2 goes to Dewycolorintheline, who captured this year's Yonkers Trot for trainer-driver Ray Schnittker. Runner-up last time out to Master Of Law, Dewycolorintheline will leave from post 1. Also starting in the second split is 2012 KYSS champion Mystical Dew, who will start from post 9 for trainer-driver Jeff Smith.

True Day Dream and My Chere Hall, who captured their respective KYSS round-one divisions for 3-year-old filly trotters, will square off on Saturday in the second of two splits. True Day Dream, who has four wins and five seconds in nine starts this year, won her KYSS opener in 1:55, while Ma Chere Hall led at every call in her opener to score in 1:54.4. The pair will line up next to each other on the starting gate, with True Day Dream in post 5 and Ma Chere Hall in post 6.

Rockin With Dewey, who finished second last time out to True Day Dream, has been tabbed the morning-line favorite in the opening KYSS contest for sophomore filly trotters. Hall of Famer Mike Lachance will drive from post 1.

The 3-year-old colt pacers will vie in a single \$30,000 division, with the field including round-one winners Bandolito and Blatantly Best, who will start from post 9 and 8, respectively.

Bandolito's 1:51.3 victory in KYSS action was the seventh straight for the son of Ponder. Co-owner Daryl Bier trains and drives Bandolito. Blatantly Best was a 1:51.4 winner in his KYSS opener, with the son of Cambest driven by Lewayne Miller for trainer Erv Miller.

Eleven 3-year-old filly pacers will cap off the night in the 13th and final race on the card. So Nice, who romped to a 10-length win in her KYSS opener in a career-best 1:52.1, has been tabbed the favorite with Peter Wrenn driving from post 7. KZ Beach Girl, who won the other KYSS division last time out in a career-best 1:53.4, will start from post 9 with driver Chris Page.

The leading point earners in each of the divisions for 2- and 3-year-old trotters and pacers will advance to the \$2 million Kentucky Super Night, featuring eight \$250,000 Sires Stakes finals, which is scheduled for Sunday night, Sept. 2, at The Red Mile. *(The Red Mile)*

Hoosier Announces 20 Percent Purse Increase

In the 20th season of live Standardbred racing, Hoosier Park continues to produce encouraging gains on all fronts. With the continuing success of the first-ever, all harness racing meet, Hoosier Park has announced purses will reflect a 20 percent increase, effective Friday, Aug. 23.

This 20 percent increase is the second purse increase implemented this season and will be felt most noticeably throughout the upper and middle classes on the condition sheet.

With a renewed focus on fresh marketing efforts, facility enhancements, specialty wagers, and an increase in overall quality of racing through the first 100 days of the meet at Hoosier Park, all-sources wagering has shown an increase of 25 percent over the previous year's figures. *(Hoosier Park)*

Regis The Horse Wins For Regis Philbin The Host

The crowd went wild—literally—on Monday's (Aug. 19) debut of Crowd Goes Wild on the new Fox Sports 1 network as they and host Regis Philbin watched as Regis The Horse won the first race at Harrington Raceway. The 81-year-old Philbin was surprised midway through the one-hour show with the news that a 2-year-old pacer owned and trained by George Teague Jr. had been re-named in his honor and that he would be able to see the horse compete live.

Although the race was technically Regis The Horse's first-ever start, the son of Shadow Play actually had already made three starts at Mohawk under the name Settlemoir Hanover. Show producer Vin Rubino had first looked at purchasing a Thoroughbred, but after finding how seldom that breed races and how hard it would be to find a spot for that race to fall during the show that airs Mondays through Fridays at 5 p.m., he looked at Standardbreds and contacted the U.S. Trotting Association.

Rubino, officials from the USTA and Harrington Raceway, and trainer Teague got together and found a horse they thought would be the perfect fit. Up next was the waiving of a USTA rule that prohibits a name change after a horse makes a start.

"We do not make a common practice of changing the name of a horse after he raced," explained U.S. Trotting Association director of registry and member services T.C. Lane, "but we felt that it was in the best interest of the industry to do so."

Regis The Horse was making his fourth career start, following three efforts in Ontario Sires Stakes Grass Roots events in Canada that led to just \$3,325 in earnings. Finding the competition much easier in Delaware, Regis The Horse, a son of Shadow Play, took home the winner's share of the \$5,300 purse as he returned \$3.20 for a \$2 win ticket.

Regis The Horse was driven by Montrell Teague and took the lead early and never looked back. After getting away second and then quickly moving to the lead, Regis The Horse was urged on by the cheering of "Regis! Regis! Regis!" by the live studio audience, Philbin and the other five panelists of his talk show. Using a split screen to show both the race and the excited host, Philbin was fist pumping and clapping while watching his namesake. When Regis The Horse crossed the wire 2 1/4 lengths in front in 1:56.4, Philbin exchanged high-fives with his TV peers as they all stood and cheered.

A taped segment that was filmed at Teague's farm was also shown. The video included a peek at Regis The Horse's stall that had pictures of Philbin as well as a number of memorabilia noting his backing of Notre Dame University sports teams.

"I'm overwhelmed," said Philbin, who was caught offguard by the surprise.

In 2013, Cahill was elected as a District 1 director for the United States Trotting Association.

"The Little Brown Jug is such a special event and I am touched to be named the Lady Pace honoree," noted Cahill. "I am proud to be a part of the rejuvenation of the sport within the state of Ohio." (*Delaware County Fair*)

Alberta Siring Legend As Promised Dies At 24

The cornerstone sire of Alberta's harness racing industry, the stallion As Promised, has died at the age of 24. For many years, As Promised excelled both on the racetrack and in the breeding shed.

Purchased by Keith Clark, Blaine Dickson, Robert Carswell, and Charles Campbell in 1990 at the Kentucky Standardbred Sale, the son of Abercrombie-Promised Princess was well-bred but a less than perfect individual.

"I went to Kentucky and I was just looking at him out of interest as there was a brother to him racing in Alberta, a real nice horse—a half-brother (On To Royalty)," Clark told Standardbred Canada's Trot Insider "He should have brought around \$100,000 because he was bred that way. He had a crooked hind leg, kind of a curby-looking hind leg but being around lots of curbed horses and seeing lots of them, I thought he might sell a little cheaper.

"I hung around to watch him sell and I ended up with him for \$16,000."

As Promised won nine of 10 races as a freshman and \$32,800. The colt came close to dying in California early in his 3-year-old year but recovered to dominate the Alberta circuit with neither sickness nor his bad leg being an issue.

Clark campaigned As Promised through the age of seven when he retired with 71 wins, multiple stakes titles, and earnings of over \$669,000 before retiring to stud duty. Clark stood the horse himself, breeding small books of mares, and then decided to sell him.

"I ended up selling him because he was getting busy as a stud and I just didn't have time for him with racing a ton of horses," said Clark. "He bred and bred, and raised tons of good ones. He was good to me all the way through."

Dr. David Dyrholm's Sky West Farms purchased the stallion in late 2000. In 2003, As Promised was the leading sire

of 3 year olds in North America in the category of average earnings with \$71,238.

As Promised has sired Alberta's Horse of the Year on multiple occasions, and numerous provincial divisional champions. He was Western Canada's first stallion to produce a Breeders Crown champion with 2000 Aged Pacing Mare winner Rons Girl, also campaigned by Clark. As Promised has sired 102 \$100,000 performers from 735 starters with total progeny earnings in excess of \$35 million (Can.). (*SC*)
