

Outside Posts Make For Competitive American-Nationals

Saturday night's card at Balmoral Park is loaded with eight American Nationals, including two for 2-year-old pacers of both sexes, two for older horse pacers and trotters, and four encompassing all divisions for 3 year olds.

Several horses coming off wins during the second week of the recent Grand Circuit meet at The Red Mile are scheduled to start Saturday, including Allerage Farm Open Trot winner Creatine, Allerage Farm Open Pace champion State Treasurer, Glen Garnsey Memorial division winner Act Now, Kentucky Filly Futurity champ Shake It Cerry, and Tattersalls division winner JK Endofanera.

Post 9 has a win average of 11 percent this year at Balmoral Park, which is higher than post 2, post 7 and post 8.

What makes the night especially interesting is that several top contenders drew outside posts, which Balmoral Park oddsmaker Tom Kelley said made his work a bit harder.

"With some of those top horses drawing outside, it makes the races even more competitive," said Kelley. "It also made it tougher to set a morning line as the outside posts really balanced things out, although for some reason, despite the short distance into the first turn, post 9 has done really well this year."

Two American National starters who landed in post 9 are JK Endofanera in the \$227,000 race for 3-year-old male pacers and Shake It Cerry in the \$150,000 event for 3-year-old filly trotters. Kelly listed both as the 3-1 favorites in their respective races, noting that post 9 has a win average of 11 percent this year at Balmoral Park, which is higher than post 2 (9.6 percent), post 7 (10.3 percent) and post 8 (9.3 percent).

JK Endofanera is one of four Ron Burke-trained starters going postward (all separate wagering interests) and he'll have one stablemate, Little Brown Jug winner Limelight Beach, who won a Bluegrass division the first week at The Red Mile but was not eligible to the second-week Tattersalls, to his left in post 8. Yannick Gingras, who has been directing

both sophomore pacers, will remain behind Limelight Beach, while Ron Pierce gets the drive on JK Endofanera.

Burke's other two starters are Somesizesomestyle and At Press Time, from posts 2 and 3, respectively.

"Limelight Beach has the 8 versus the 9, and also he has a lot of gate speed, where JK Endofanera does not as much," Gingras explained of his decision. "It's tough for both of them, but I feel Limelight Beach gives me a little bit better chance. JK Endofanera might have a tough time getting involved. He might sweep them all from last, but I don't think he's going to rush right over (at the start)."

Shake It Cerry brings a five-race win streak into her American National heat, which besides the Filly Futurity includes the Elegantimage, Zweig and a Bluegrass split. Driven by Pierce, Shake It Cerry is one of two Jimmy Takter trainees

going postward, along with Lifetime Pursuit, who starts from post 1 with Gingras driving.

Lifetime Pursuit parlayed her upset win in the Hambletonian Oaks in early August into a six-race win streak that came to an end in a Bluegrass division Sept. 28 at The Red Mile when she was unable to fend off the late rally by Cee Bee Yes. There was no dishonor in the head loss by Lifetime Pursuit though as it took a world-record 1:50.2 effort by Cee Bee Yes to win the photo. Both filly trotters received the second week off in Lexington, and Cee Bee Yes also returns for the American National, starting from post 3 with Scott Zeron driving for trainer Julie Miller.

Foiled Again fared a bit better in the draw for the \$179,000 Am-Nat for older horse pacers. This is the fourth time Foiled Again has raced in the American National at Balmoral Park, winning in 2011, finishing seventh in 2012, and then second last year. The 10-year-old gelding, who will be driven by Gingras as one of four Burke-trained entries (Ultimate Beachboy, Clear Vision and Bettor's Edge), is the 5-2 morning-line favorite; he has been sent off the bettors' choice in each of his three prior Am-Nat appearances.

The 7-2 second choice in the race is State Treasurer, who prevailed in a blanket finish at odds of 8-1 last time out in the Allerage final, besting runner-up Foiled Again by a head. The draw again wasn't kind to the Bob McIntosh-trained Thinking Out Loud, who drew post 9 after finishing ninth in the Allerage after starting from post 10.—By Gordon Waterstone

Is Meant Tobe Shooter Meant To Be In ISS Super Final?

Hoosier Park Racing & Casino will play host to eight \$75,000 Indiana Sires Stakes (ISS) finals Friday and Saturday, with several of the horses entered battling for a bigger prize. These events serve as the last point-scoring opportunities for the trotters and pacers involved prior to Super Night, slated for Oct. 18, where finalists will compete for \$200,000 purses in each division.

Sophomore pacing colt MeantTobe Shooter is one of the horses currently on the outside looking in. Through four previous rounds of ISS eliminations and finals, the son of Sand Shooter has managed only one point. Although the Joe Putnam-trained 3 year old impressively paced to a 1:51.3 score in a \$25,000 consolation on Sept. 6, the victory didn't help his Super Final cause as points are earned only in the \$75,000 finals.

MeantTobe Shooter has proven consistent for his trainer and co-owner, hitting the board in 11 of 16 starts, including five trips to the winner's circle. Despite his consistency, he has fallen short in ISS action. In four previous elimination starts, the gelding has twice finished fourth and is most recently coming off a third-place effort. In his lone finals appearance Aug. 9, he finished ninth, pacing in

1:52.3 as Always B Miki won the event in a Hoosier Park track-record 1:48.4.

"He's just been right there knocking at the door," Putnam said. "He's drawn some bad post positions and we're hoping for some luck."

Currently ranked 12th in points, MeantTobe Shooter could lock in a spot in the Super Final for Putnam and co-owner Sam Young by finishing in the top three Saturday night. In fact, he could still get in by finishing fourth if certain other starters do not improve their points tallies. This requirement is made easier by the fact that after two starts in Lexington, Always B Miki will not line up behind the gate Saturday.

"Obviously, that horse is the best of the group. Without him here I think it will change the flow and open the race up," Putnam offered. "My horse has heart and he just needs a little luck. With a nice trip he can hang around for a piece."

With a solid performance this weekend, Putnam's charge will get his chance at the \$200,000 Super Final purse. Defeating the likes of Always B Miki and some of the other top 3 year olds in the program may be asking a lot, but with the way the Indiana Sires Stakes program is structured, just lining up behind the gate and finishing sixth through 10th earns the connections \$4,000.—*By James Platz*

Hometown Hero Looks For American National Upset

Al's Hammered is used to being the underdog story. He's been an underdog from his humble beginnings, coming from the obscure pedigree of his sire Droppin'thehammer and dam Albert's Magic, an Albert Albert mare. As a yearling in the Illini Classic sale, Bob Phillips purchased him for a mere \$2,000.

After a phenomenal 3-year-old campaign where he dominated his Illinois rivals, he took on the underdog role once again when he tore two tendons in the same leg early in his 4-year-old season. Phillips' prized colt nearly ended his career due to the severe damage to the tendons in his left front leg.

Despite an ominous prognosis, Al's Hammered has come back from the injury better than ever. The 5-year-old gelding has dominated the open ranks in Illinois all year en route to 14 wins across 21 starts and earnings of \$171,440 to date, and he is currently on a hot streak of finishing no worse than second in his last five starts. Al's Hammered has totaled \$480,667 over his career including a 1:48.4 lifetime mark as 3 year old.

Trainer and owner Bob Phillips is confident in his hometown hopeful heading into the \$179,000 American National for aged pacers Saturday night at Balmoral Park.

"He's really good right now, as good as he's been all year," Phillips said.

While Phillips is confident, Al's Hammered will play the underdog card once again as he is 10-1 on the morning line against a star-studded field.

This will be Al's Hammered's first test against the top pacers in the country, but Phillips feels optimistic despite the accomplishments of the rest of the field.

"Those pacers just went 1:48.4 over The Red Mile, and Al has been going 1:49 over Balmoral, so I don't think speed will be an issue," Phillips remarked.

Al's Hammered received the luck of the draw as he will start from the rail in the 12th race of the action-packed card. A quality trip is Phillips' hope in order to shock the likes of Foiled Again, State Treasurer and Bettor's Edge.

"He can leave the gate 100 miles per hour, but I would like for him to get off fourth or fifth. I don't want him to get stuck in a speed battle against the Burke horses," Phillips said.

Avoiding the speed duel makes sense for Al's Hammered, who is widely known for his wicked last quarters to pick off foes in the stretch.

Al's Hammered will certainly have the local crowd behind him. He is the only Illinois-bred in the race, and he is a local favorite with his dominance amongst the top pacers in the state.

Will Al's Hammered have a home track advantage? "I sure hope so," Phillips added. — By Jay Hochstetler

Jamieson Looks To Win Super Final With The “Look,” Or Some “Luck”

Eight \$250,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Super Finals will be contested on Saturday night at Mohawk Racetrack, with Canadian Hall of Famer Carl Jamieson sending out a pair in the race for 2-year-old male pacers. Jamieson's starters are Sporting The Look, one of six sons of first-year sire Sportswriter lining up behind the gate in the 10-horse field, and Make Some Luck, a son of longtime sire Camluck.

Make Some Luck returned to the races after a month off and finished second in an OSS Gold race at Georgian Downs. After a fourth-place finish he then lowered his career mark to 1:53 in OSS Gold action at Mohawk, and then last time out he was sixth after starting from the outside post 10, finishing 7 ½ lengths behind the winning Drachan Hanover, who starts from post 8 in the Super Final.

“He had the 10 hole last week and Jody took him back to last, and that didn’t help any when they went in 1:51,” said Jamieson. “This week he has a chance from the two hole.”

Purchased for \$19,000 as a yearling by Jody Jamieson’s 1140545 Ontario Ltd., Make Some Luck has earnings of \$57,339 from his five career starts. Carl Jamieson raced Make Some Luck’s dam, Mustang Kensley, as a 2 year old. Mustang Kensley’s dam Diamond Dawn won the American National at Sportsman’s Park and Matron at Pompano Park in 1995, and is a half-sister to Western Maverick, who won a Bluegrass division for 2-year-old pacers in 2001 at The Red Mile.

“Jody bought this one for himself and he’s turned into a pretty good-looking colt,” said Jamieson.

As for Sporting The Look, Jamieson admits the colt has his work cut out for him from the outside post.

Make Some Luck will start from post 2 with driver Jody Jamieson—who owns the gelding—while Sporting The Look will start from post 9 with Mario Bailargeon in the sulky.

Make Some Luck won his career debut on July 8 at Mohawk, scoring in 1:55.2 in an OSS Grassroots division. Plans called for Make Some Luck to then race in an OSS Gold at Grand River, but the gelding was scratched.

“He got a little off on us there when a blacksmith caught his feet and got high nails in him, so we had to scratch him,” explained Carl. “It took him two weeks to get his feet back right again, and after that he’s been racing pretty good.”

“He got the nine hole and that cuts his odds down a little bit,” he said. “But he has a shot and should be there anyways.”

A \$72,000 yearling purchase by Jamieson, who sold back an interest to breeders 30 Plus Stables (Tim, Andy and Stan Klemencic), Sporting The Look has four wins in 10 starts, three coming in OSS Gold contests (including a career-best 1:53 on Sept. 16 at Mohawk) and the other in his elimination of the Battle of Waterloo at Grand River (he finished second in the final). With earnings of \$164,401, Sporting The Look is the richest male pacer in Sportswriter’s first crop on the track this year.

Jamieson added that the Super Final will be the last start of the year for both Make Some Luck and Sporting The Look.

Jamieson also has a third OSS Super Final starter in Danielle Hall, who lines up in post 2 in the 2-Year-Old Filly Trot with Jody Jamieson driving. A daughter of Deweycheatumhowe, Danielle Hall is out of the 2007 Kentucky Sires Stakes champion mare Debbie Hall. She has six wins in nine starts this year with nearly a quarter-million dollars in earnings.— By Gordon Waterstone

Bax Brings Five Into OSS Super Finals

In 2001 John Bax enjoyed one of his best years ever as a trainer, culminating with an O'Brien Award as Canada's Trainer of the Year. One of the highlights of that season came on Nov. 10 at Mohawk Racetrack when he started four trotters in the Ontario Sires Stakes Super Finals and came away with three wins and a second.

On Saturday night Bax has an opportunity to add more Super Final trophies to his case as he'll send out five starters in the eight finals worth \$250,000 each. Like 2001, he has two starters and the probable favorite in the rookie trotting filly division, Stubborn Belle and Juanitas Fury.

Stubborn Belle comes into Saturday's contest riding a two-race winning streak which includes the Peaceful Way final. The Taurus Dream daughter has five wins and a second in nine tries to date this year, bringing her career earnings to more than \$350,000.

"My son Marshall renamed her and she is her name," noted Bax. "She has a mind of her own, that's for sure. She's getting better the more experience she gets. She's tough and she's strong. She doesn't look like a 2-year-old filly, she looks more like a 4-year-old horse. She won't win any runway model contests.

"She has the right combination of stride, speed and fight and she's using it the right way. She's not a push-button horse by any means but it makes it easier to deal with her quirks when she races the way she does."

Stubborn Belle has drawn post 1 in the first Super Final of the evening, Race 2, with her regular pilot Paul MacDonell at the lines. Her stablemate, Juanitas Fury, has post 8 in the same race with Steve Condren in the sulky. A daughter of Kadabra,

Juanitas Fury has played the bridesmaid's role somewhat this year with a summary of 3-4-1 in nine tries for \$227,000 earned.

"If it wasn't for Stubborn Belle she'd likely be the best in the barn," Bax said. "I was a bit nervous about her when she was training down in Florida. She did everything right but was just content to follow the rest around. Once she got to the track though she got much better. She's a totally different filly than Stubborn Belle, she's easy on herself and nice to be around."

If one of those fillies is successful, it will mark Bax's second straight victory in that division as his Riveting Rosie won last year's Super Final for this class on her way to being named Canada's 2-Year-Old Trotting Filly of the Year. She's had a slower start this year due to a few injuries, but has been on fire lately.

Riveting Rosie will look for her second straight Super Final victory in the eighth race on Saturday where she's drawn post 9. MacDonell will be driving as usual. Rosie comes into the contest off two impressive Gold victories which she's won by open lengths.

"Right now she's at the top of her game again, she's feeling really good," Bax related. "She's got a great gait, she's tough and she's game."

Bax considers his other Super Final contenders longshots "but that's why we race them, you never know what will happen." Amityville Lindy drew the rail in the 2-year-old trotting colt final, race five, with Steve Byron listed to steer. Verdi is Bax's other starter in the final for the sophomore trotting colts. *(with files from OSS)*

Meadows Offers Record \$50K Pick 5 Guarantee Friday

On Friday, The Meadows Racetrack & Casino will offer a \$50,000-guaranteed pool—the largest such guarantee in track history—for its Pick 5 wager as part of the U.S. Trotting Association's Strategic Wagering Initiative. The Meadows added the "instant" guarantee after Wednesday's Pick 5 was uncovered, resulting in a three-day carryover of \$17,142.70.

Minimum wager for the Pick 5 (Races 11-15) is 50 cents. Since Pennsylvania law requires a minimum per-race wager of \$2, a player wagering at the 50-cent level must bet at least four tickets.

First post for Friday's program is 12:55 p.m. (*The Meadows*)

Trio Of Drivers Drop Jug Week Kicking Appeals

Drivers Yannick Gingras and David Miller told harnessracing.com Thursday morning that they have dropped their appeals to the Ohio State Racing Commission for penalties imposed for kicking during the Grand Circuit meet at the Delaware County Fair. Driver Brett Miller has also dropped his appeal, according to Gingras and David Miller.

The three drivers were originally each fined \$500 and suspended for two days—Oct. 2 and Oct. 3—for their infractions. By appealing the sanctions, the three drivers were able to compete those days during Grand Circuit racing at The Red Mile. David and Brett Miller will now take their two days on Oct. 15-16, while Gingras will sit out on Oct. 22-23.

Gingras's infraction came with Allstar Rating, Brett Miller's with Charmed Life, and David Miller's with McWicked in the Little Brown Jug. David Miller also received a 10-day suspension from the track judges at The Red Mile for a violation of the rule prohibiting drivers taking their hands out of the handholds while driving Parnu Hanover to a win in a \$10,000 late-closer on Sunday, Oct. 5. Kentucky rules provide for a hearing to be held between the judges and Miller before the penalty is imposed and the exact dates of the suspension given, but no date has yet been scheduled.

Southwind Roulette Gives Goose Bumps

She might be best known for once bursting through a gaggle of geese on her way to victory at The Meadows, but co-owner Howard Taylor hopes that by the end of the season people recognize Southwind Roulette for her talent.

Southwind Roulette, who has won five of seven starts this year, races in the third of three Historic-Debutante Stakes divisions at Harrah's Philadelphia on Friday. Her victories include the Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championship and her \$284,448 in purses rank No. 2 to undefeated JK She'salady among 2-year-old female pacers.

"She's a really nice filly," said Taylor, who owns Southwind Roulette with Brad Grant. "She's real long gaited. If you watch her stride, she really reaches out.

"And she wins," he added with a laugh. "And she wins a lot of money. There's nothing not to like about her."

Southwind Roulette is a daughter of 2008 Horse of the Year Somebeachsomewhere out of the stakes-winning mare Southwind Rio. She was purchased as a yearling for \$30,000 at the 2013 Lexington Selected Sale. She started the year with trainer Doug Lewis before moving to the barn of Ron Burke in July.

"I have a friend who has a real good eye for yearlings, Mike Hall," Taylor said. "Mike picked her out. He always finds holes in the sale, cheap horses for the breeding. He found her and told me I should buy her."

Southwind Roulette began her career by winning a division of the Pennsylvania All Stars and then finished third in a division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes.

In her next start at The Meadows, in another PASS division, she and driver Yannick Gingras won despite having to go through a gaggle of geese on the track just prior to the final turn.

"I talked to Doug afterward and told him I didn't believe what I saw there," Taylor said. "He told me that the farm they're on has geese. She'd seen that before and gone through them before, so she didn't think anything of it. Of all the horses in the race, she's probably the only one that would have done that. Yannick said she didn't even bat an eye. He was worried, but she wasn't."

Southwind Roulette followed that win with two more victories in the preliminary rounds of the sire stakes before capturing the championship on Sept. 6 at Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs.

She enters the Historic-Debutante after a seventh-place finish in a division of the Kentuckiana Stallion Management Stakes at Hoosier Park, where she got parked in an opening :25.3 quarter-mile. (*HRC*)

Camluck Retired From Stud Duty

Seelster Farms, along with owners, New Destiny Stable and Al McIntosh Holdings Ltd., announce the retirement of Camluck from active stud duty.

As a racehorse, Camluck himself earned more than \$1 million and took a time trial mark at the age of five of 1:48.4 at Lexington more than 22 years ago. Camluck was inducted into the Horse Racing Hall Of Fame in 2003 and was also the first Canadian horse to be inducted in the United States Harness Racing Hall Of Fame in 2008.

Camluck has total progeny earnings of more than \$215 million (C), according to Standardbred Canada, which ranks him first all-time for pacing sires. Camluck's earnings are \$198 million according to U.S. Trotting Association statistics, which places him second behind Western Hanover.
