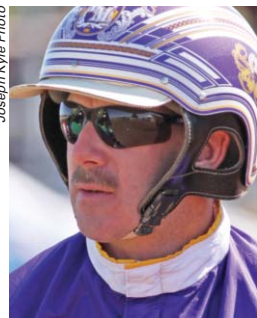


A Rocknroll Dance Looking For Turnaround In Windy City

With a third-place finish in his Little Brown Jug elimination on Sept. 20 at Delaware, Ohio, A Rocknroll Dance went past the \$1-million mark in seasonal earnings, a number bolstered substantially by his wins in the \$600,000 Meadowlands Pace and \$500,000 Battle of the Brandywine.

Mulinix and the rest of the connections have forged on in the hopes of a late-season turnaround.

In his last start in the \$415,820 Messenger at Yonkers, David Miller got the drive for the first time, but found himself hung first-over through the middle half and settling for fourth. Mulinix said Miller has recommended a couple of changes that the driver believes will help the horse in the Windy City.

"I suggested things just to change him up because I think he's been in a little bit of a rut," said Miller. "He made so much money the way he was hung up that he wasn't hung up wrong, I just think that since he's gone the other way it might help to change some things."

Mulinix said he was receptive to Miller's suggestions.

"David said he watched him all summer...and he thought we could keep him a little calmer by opening him up," Mulinix said of changing to an open bridle. "And he said to stick some earplugs in him. I'm not sure he needs the earplugs, but I guess if you do pop them that maybe he'll get the idea it's time to go."

"He's never been that aggressive. At home he loves to follow horses, it's almost hard not to make him follow. He just loves to get in behind because then he likes to go up and bite the guy in front of him on the back, just messing around."

Since the Jug elim—including a sixth-place finish in the second heat—A Rocknroll Dance has been stuck in neutral as he has managed to take home just two minor checks in six starts, adding just \$41,393 to his bankroll. Now with 2012 earnings of \$1,044,729, A Rocknroll Dance has a career bankroll of \$1,908,054 and would go past the \$2-million mark with a win in Friday night's \$215,000 Windy City Pace at Maywood Park.

As the string of sub-par efforts continued over the past two months—including failing to advance out of the Breeders Crown elims to the \$555,000 final—it started to look as if any race might have been A Rocknroll Dance's last for the season. But trainer Jim

Mulinix said A Rocknroll Dance has also begun flipping his palate briefly while racing and that has been a hindrance.

"He's sound but he seems to have a little trouble with his throat," said Mulinix. "It's a good-looking throat but I think he gets all nerved up and he flips his palate real quick and it's just enough to cost him a couple steps. David said when he scored him down (in the Messenger) he got all revved up and that he might have even flipped his palate then."

Mulinix said he told his wife, Ellen, prior to the Messenger that if A Rocknroll Dance didn't have a good race that he would call it a year, but he was encouraged by Miller's suggestions as well as offering to travel to Chicago to drive in the Windy City.

"David said he seems fresh and good, it just seems like he's mixed up a little," said Mulinix. "It's not soundness; it's

all issues in his head and breathing. That's why David said to try a few things."

Miller said he was encouraged after the Messenger by what he saw when he went back to check on his drive.

"I went back after the race and the horse looked physically fine," said Miller. "The horse was standing with his ears up and bouncing around the stall."

Mulinix said A Rocknroll Dance still has three more possible starts this year, the Matron elims and final at Dover Downs and the Cleveland Classic at Northfield Park. Plans call for the son of Rocknroll Hanover to return to the race-track in 2013, and when he does it will be after wintering in a new doubled-sized stall at Mulinix's farm in Wauseon, Ohio.

"I'm building him a bigger stall," said Mulinix. "I'd been toying with that idea but I've been on the road so much. This stall is closer to the door and also has an extra window as he likes to look out."

A Rocknroll Dance isn't the only horse who could jump the \$2-million hurdle on Friday at Maywood. Market Share, who has wins in the Hambletonian, Canadian Trotting Classic and most recently the American National at Balmoral Park, is just \$16,345 shy of two million and needs just a first or second in the \$108,000 Galt for 3-year-old colt trotters to reach the mark. The son of Revenue is listed as the 3-5 morning-line choice in the Galt, leaving from post five with Tim Tetrick driving for trainer Linda Toscano.

Just six 2-year-old male pacers will line up behind the gate in the \$110,000 Abe Lincoln, with Our Dragon King and Blatantly Best, respectively, the one-two finishers in the recent American National at Balmoral, matched up again. Drawing post one, Blatantly Best has been installed the slight favorite over Our Dragon King, who starts from post four.

Rounding out the quartet of stakes is the \$83,000 Cinderella for 3-year-old filly pacers. Program favorite Big McDeal ships in from Canada after finishing third in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown final to American Jewel for trainer Ben Wallace and driver Jody Jamieson. The second choice also belongs to an Ontario-based trainer as Casie Coleman sends Eighthundollarbill in off an overnight win at Harrah's Philadelphia. Eighthundollarbill opened up her 2012 campaign with three straight wins, including two in New York Sires Stakes, but then came up short in 11 straight races until her Nov. 1 score.

Indiana-Sired Sand Royal Blu Solid Matron Contender

Indiana champion Sand Royal Blu will be taking on four others in the \$159,675 Matron Stakes final for 2-year-old colt and gelding trotters on Sunday at Dover Downs.

A son of the Indiana-based sire Jailhouse Jesse, Sand Royal Blu had solid credentials before he competed in the Matron prep. He won handily by one length in 1:57—defeating all four horses he will face in the Matron final—but was overlooked by bettors, paying \$88.40 to win. The fifth horse he beat, the 1-5 favorite Dontyouforgetit who finished last, was not re-entered for the final.

“I didn’t think he deserved to be 43-1; his lines from Indiana weren’t that bad,” said David Miller, who drove the colt for the first time for trainer Tye Loy and breeder-owner Bill Sanders.

“I didn’t know what to expect,” added Miller. “The horse left the gate on his own and even going into the last turn I didn’t know how strong he’d be. But he took right off and it was a nice surprise.”

Sand Royal Blu has every right to be a good horse. He is out of the mare Sand Lavender-Blu (Malabar Man-Southwind Roebing, by Valley Victory), whose first foal is the fast filly Sand Violent Blu 2, 1:54.3f. Born on April 6, he was ready to race in late June this year and won a baby race at The Meadows in 2:00.4 on June 27. About a month later he won an Arden Downs stakes at The Meadows by a comfortable 2 1/2 lengths in 1:57.4. He was ready for the Indiana Sires Stakes Gold races and picked up a second and fourth in Gold legs before suffering a setback.

“He got injured in the stall,” said Loy. “I don’t know exactly what happened—he’s a 2-year-old trotter! But he ended up having some back problem. I also changed his

shoeing and his boots, so knock on wood, I hope we have some luck at Dover.”

Sand Royal Blu rebounded quickly and was back in the second flight of Indiana Sires Stakes Gold legs and made the second \$200,000 final. After starting from the trailing post 10, he made a first-over move and took the lead but faded to third.

Sand Royal Blu’s earnings stand at \$85,512 going into the Matron, and Miller is confident the colt has a chance at a good purse check. “He handled the track great and that’s what you want to see,” he said. “I don’t think in this race he’ll be 43-1.”

While Sand Royal Blu tries to make a little more money for Sanders, his fast older sister is finished for the season. In a \$15,000 race for filly trotters at Indiana Downs on Oct. 26, she blasted off the gate and took a quick lead but had tied up and thus finished back.

“They had a recall and she went crazy,” said Loy. “Ever since she got the abscess in her lung (in June) it’s been one thing or the other. She’s turned out now but she’s a big filly so she should do better as an older horse.”

Mare Has Home-Field Advantage In Forest City

The best older pacing mares in the sport will descend on The Raceway at The Western Fair District this Saturday night for the \$200,000 Forest City Pace final.

Local favorites Modern Cinderella and Misty Moonstone will leave right beside each other from posts two and three, respectively, in the star-studded field.

The latter will not be hard to pick out as the lone gray in the field, and if anyone has a home-field advantage, it just might be the daughter of Astreos. With nine career wins over the London oval to her credit, no one in the group has had more success at this venue.

"She really does seem to pick up her game on this track," explained trainer-driver Peter Core of the \$350,000 career winner. "If she was facing this same group at one of the big tracks like Woodbine or Mohawk she would be totally over-matched. But on this track I think she can go with them and be a competitor."

And a competitor she is, despite her endearing disposition around the barn.

"Misty is an absolute sweetheart around the barn, maybe the nicest I've been around," explained Core. "It's hard not to get attached to a horse like this because she gives you all

she's got on the track and she's really blossomed into a gritty performer as she's gotten older."

Misty Moonstone has drawn post three in Saturday night's final and Core realizes she faces a daunting task which includes trying to knock off a three-horse Ron Burke-trained juggernaut led by 7-5 morning line choice Rocklamation.

"Realistically, beating these mares looks like a huge reach but I'm hopeful that I can get good early position and there's some pace in the race. If that happens, I'm confident that my mare can follow along with them and get a big share." (*Western Fair*)

HARRISBURG YEARLING SALE

Mixed Bag

More Six-Figure Yearlings Sold, But Median Price Drops 15 Percent

The 2012 Standardbred Horse Sale Company's annual yearling auction in Harrisburg wasn't expected to have similar fireworks as last year, when a horse was sold for \$825,000. It wasn't, however, expected to be so soft as to finish with an 8.2 percent decline in the average price, and a 15 percent drop in the median price—the point where half the horses sell for more and half for less.

Two factors, however, played a large role in contributing to the decline in the average price: 81 more yearlings were sold this year versus last, and 71 more Ontario-sired yearlings were sold at the venue this year.

If you take out the 81 cheapest yearlings, the average price at the sale would have settled at \$31,036, a decline of just 1.7 percent from 2011. As for the Ontario effect, in 2011 the 151 Ontario-sired yearlings at Harrisburg sold for an average price of \$31,255; this year 222 Ontario-sired yearlings brought an average of only \$19,369, a 38 percent difference.

Two other major influences on the overall sale was the popularity of offspring by pacing sires Somebeachsomewhere and Well Said. The first crop by Somebeachsomewhere raced this year and propelled him to the distinction as the sport's single-season leading money-winning sire of 2 year olds with earnings of \$4,642,586 through Nov. 11. (The previous leader was No Nukes, with \$4.1 in purse winnings in 1990. Previously, Niatross grabbed the crown in 1985 with earnings of \$3.5 million.)

Of the 32 pacing yearlings sold, 17 (53 percent) were sired by Somebeachsomewhere, with another five by Well Said. Of the 22 six-figure yearlings by Somebeachsomewhere or Well Said, 15 were consigned by Hanover Shoe Farms. Of the \$19.1 million spent on pacers, \$7.7 million (40.7 percent) was for offspring by one of those two sires.

The most expensive yearling at the sale was Chuchill Hanover, a colt by Well Said out of the prolific producer Cathedra. With a

\$380,000 bid, he was purchased by E & M Stride, the ownership name of Emilio and Maria Rosati of Australia. Mark Harder will be training the colt in the U.S.

Myron Bell, acting as agent, paid the most for a yearling by Somebeachsomewhere when he purchased Blister Hanover, the first foal of a sister to Big Jim, for \$350,000. Bell, of course, enjoyed great success this season with the Somebeachsomewhere colt Captaintreacherous.

The top end of the market improved this year with 10 more yearlings selling for six-figure prices this year versus 2011. The median price fell from \$20,000 to \$17,000. In addition, the number of horses selling for less than \$10,000 climbed by 4.7 percent.

"I think fewer buyers are getting more and more selective, well in advance of the sale," noted Jim Simpson, president and CEO of Hanover Shoe Farms.

"It was a good sale, but there were too many \$1,000 and \$2,000 yearlings," said Steve Stewart of Hunterton Sales Agency.

"It's become a market of individuals, and when you get the individual and the pedigree, it can be huge. And the darker (color) the better," added Stewart. "But I don't think we go to the winner's circle and see all dark horses."

David Reid, whose Preferred Equine Marketing had the largest yearling agency consignment, said he expected the sale to be a little stronger.

"The lower quarter of the market was hit pretty hard," he noted. "Rocknroll Hanover is in a weaker jurisdiction (New Jersey) and he was particularly hurt."

Reid believes the general world economy is affecting prices, as well as problems in harness racing, such as the uncertainty about the future of racing in Ontario, and the rising cost of keeping a horse in training.

"I know that if breeders continue to lose money, they won't be in business, and this is an industry problem," he said. "There needs to be more money, somehow, going to young horses. For the people who are buying yearlings, they have to have a better chance of making money."

Bob Boni, who sold yearlings for numerous clients under the banner of Northwood Bloodstock Agency, agrees. "Nobody wants to own the factory anymore," said Boni.

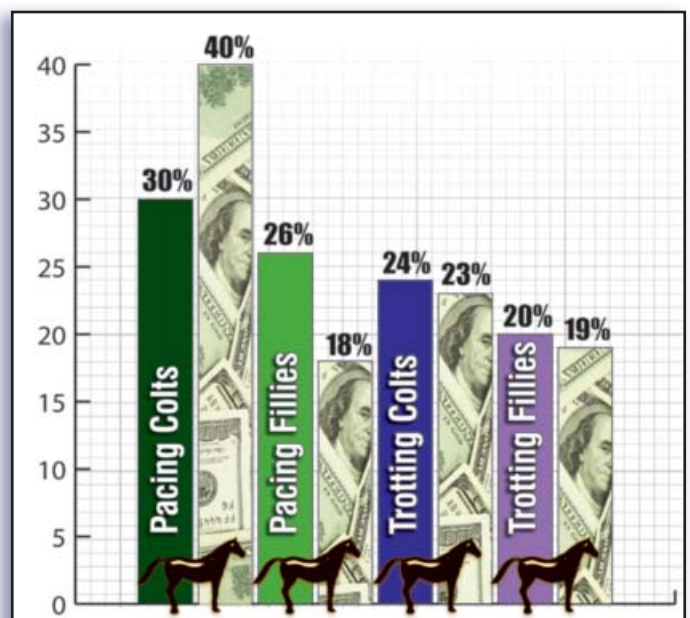

Last year D Train's full brother to Donato was sold for \$825,000. D Train's daughter Decimel Hanover had a Muscle Hill colt sell in the sale (hip 101) for \$105,000.
- At Harrisburg, 57.4 percent of the gross was for pacing-bred yearlings; at the Lexington Selected Sale, only 48.4 percent of the money was for pacers. In 2011 at Harrisburg, the pacing market accounted for 48.4 percent of the gross.
- Bill Weaver (Valley High Stable) has had a tumultuous past six weeks. He fell and was injured while in Lexington for the Grand Circuit meet and then returned home to New Jersey for heart bypass surgery. While he was busy dealing with his health, To Dream On and Wheeling N Dealin, who he bred, won the Breeders Crown championships for 2 year olds. Windsong Soprano Tops At \$340,000

Some Breeders Make Buys, But Quite A Few Cases Of No Bids

The mixed portion of this year's Standardbred Horse Sale in Harrisburg, held Friday, Nov. 9, and Saturday, Nov. 10, had its usual assortment of stallion shares, attractive mares, young unprovens for both racing and breeding, solid racehorses, reduction/dispersal sales, and even weanlings from the first crop by Rock N Roll Heaven.

Last year the broodmare Graceful Touch topped the sale when Frenchman Jean-Pierre Barjon bought her for \$560,000 from the Perretti Farms dispersal of mares. This year that territory was not reached although a trio of mares brought prices of \$200,000 or more, but the number of broodmares offered turned out to be too much for the marketplace. Many mares did not sell, with some not receiving a single bid, and quite a few buy-backs.

"Once the broodmares started to sell low, it was over," said Bob Boni of Northwood Bloodstock Agency, which had a wide variety of horses in its consignment. "A lot of nice mares just weren't looked at. There were a lot of moments when you just scratched your head."

Several of the sport's top breeders bought mares, however, and breeders in Ohio, who see brighter prospects, were also active.

The top price for a broodmare was the \$340,000 bid for Windsong Soprano 3, 1:52.4 (\$1,231,325), who was sold in foal to Kadabra. Sold as hip number 1377, she was bought by White Birch Farm and was consigned by Susan Grange's Lothlorien. White Birch also bought Western Silk, a 5-year-old pacing mare, for \$330,000 and will keep her in training with Coleman.

Among the notable offerings was Kentuckiana Farms' stock reduction, which included mares, stallion shares and weanlings offered through Northwood Bloodstock Agency. The broodmare group included Armbr Vanquish (hip 1432), the dam of 2011 Kentucky Futurity champion Manofmanymissions, who brought \$90,000. Bruce Brinkerhoff acted as agent and bought the 14-year-old Garland Lobell mare—in foal to Yankee Glide—for Angie and Dr. Cal Stiller's Stonebridge Farm in Ontario.

Among other noteworthy Kentuckiana mares, the 12-year-old mare Cantbuymehappiness, the dam of North America Cup winner Up The Credit, was sold for just \$21,000—in foal to Western Terror—to Dave Yoder of Maysville, Ky. Casie Coleman bought the 9-year-old Don't You Smile, in foal to Western Terror, for \$18,000. Coleman has been racing the mare's 2-year-old, Vegas Vacation, who finished second in Metro and Breeders Crown elims.

Although Perretti Farms dispersed its broodmares last year, it is getting back into breeding on a smaller scale. Among its purchases was Sweet Paprika (hip 1692), an Artiscaple sister to Bettor Sweet and Sweet Lou. Perretti purchased the 9-year-old mare, in foal to Bettor's Delight, for \$75,000. At this fall's Lexington Selected Sale the mare's yearling colt by Somebeachsomewhere was sold for \$100,000.

The dispersal of mares owned by Terry Brooks's Goldfinger Enterprises included Wichita Hanover (1651), the dam of A Rocknroll Dance. The 12-year-old mare was bought for \$25,000 by Crawford Farms of New York.

Approval Given To Build New Lebanon Raceway

The relocation of Lebanon Raceway in Ohio got a big boost on Tuesday when Warren County Commissioners approved site plans that will allow construction of a new multi-million-dollar racetrack and casino in Turtlecreek Township near Dayton. The project is scheduled to begin next month and last a year. The new site, which has yet to be given an official name, is expected to open in 2014.

Lebanon Raceway was sold earlier this year to Churchill Downs Inc. and Delaware North Gaming & Entertainment Cos. The new racino will be a 188,000-square-foot building that could hold up to 2,500 slot machines. Plans call for a five-eighths mile racetrack.

Reports state that construction is expected to cost \$105 million, with another \$70 million going toward expenses such as license fees and land. For those familiar with Ohio, the new racino will be located at the northeast corner of state Route 63 and Union Road, just off the Monroe exit off I-75 and about midway between Cincinnati and Dayton.

While approval has been given to Lebanon, Penn National Gaming is still waiting on word from the Ohio Racing Commission on its plans to relocate Raceway Park in Toledo to the Dayton area.

Campbell Meets With Red Mile Stewards

Driver John Campbell was in Kentucky Tuesday morning, Nov. 13, to attend a hearing with two of The Red Mile's track stewards regarding the disqualification of Odds On Equuleus for a win in a Bluegrass division Sept. 29. Shortly after the hearing, Campbell told harnessracing.com that he believes he presented a strong argument to overturning the ruling, which led to controversy when it first occurred.

Campbell had a prior meeting with the stewards two days after the incident, in which Odds On Equuleus was disqualified from first to last in the \$85,800 race when the judges deemed the driver took his charge up abruptly in the final turn and caused interference to the trailing horses. Following that meeting, the stewards said they didn't feel any need to further sanction Campbell, who had already lost \$2,145 as his five-percent fee of the winner's share of the purse.

Campbell flew to Kentucky from his New Jersey home for the Tuesday morning meeting, in which he was joined by Odds On Equuleus's trainer, Robin Schadt, and attorney William C. Hurt of the Lexington-based law firm of Hurt, Crosbie & May. They met with The Red Mile presiding judge Rich Williams and associate Dan Ross. Associate judge Anthony Clark, who also serves as race secretary at Raceway Park and was in the judges' booth for the disqualification, did not attend the hearing.

Williams also told harnessracing.com after the hearing that he has five days to either write a ruling or give a finding of facts in the case, taking into account Campbell's testi-

mony. If the disqualification remains, then Schadt and co-owner Dana Parham could continue the appeal process in which they already filed paperwork with the commission. (harnessracing.com)

Building Of New Meadowlands Grandstand Underway

The first columns of steel have been raised for the new grandstand at the Meadowlands Racetrack.

The 155,000 square-foot building, expected to open in late 2013, is the integral part of track operator Jeff Gural's plan to reinvigorate harness racing at the Meadowlands.

Approximately 50 pieces of steel a day will be set between now and mid-February 2013, the estimated topping off date, for a total of 2,200 tons. Two dozen tradesmen are at work daily on the project under the management of LPCiminelli.

Meadowlands Racetrack will hold 82 dates of live harness racing in 2013, as approved by the New Jersey Racing Commission at its meeting on Wednesday. The principal meet, which officially begins Friday, Dec. 28, will run through Saturday, Aug. 3. Racing is slated for three nights a week, Thursday-Saturday, through March 16.

The schedule then reverts to Friday and Saturday until the Championship Meet finale on Hambletonian Day, Aug. 3. Fall harness racing will return to the Meadowlands calendar in 2013, with a brief engagement from Nov. 23-Dec. 28.

Trainers who wish to race at the Meadowlands in 2013 must complete a racing application and submit it to the race office for approval by December 10, 2012. The application is available online at [MeadowlandsRacetrack.com](http://www.meadowlandsracetrack.com) (<http://www.meadowlandsracetrack.com/content.aspx?id=55>). (*Meadowlands*)

Toscano's Magical Season Nears Completion

As trainer Linda Toscano gets her horses ready for the final full weekend of stakes action this season, she also is getting ready to see the final chapter written in what has been a career year.

Toscano trains three horses in the sport's Top 10 poll: No. 1-ranked Chapter Seven, who saw his career come to an end with a win in last weekend's American National for older trotters at Balmoral Park; No. 4 Market Share, who won the American National for 3-year-old male trotters and is getting ready for Friday's Galt Stakes at Maywood Park; and No. 10 Heston Blue Chip, who will be in action in Sunday's Progress Pace at Dover Downs.

Her stable has posted a career-best \$6.38 million in purses this year, good for fourth place among all trainers in North America, despite Toscano making her fewest starts (429) since 2006. Her previous high for purses was \$3.71 million, set last season.

"It's really just been an incredible year," Toscano said. "I only hope to do half as much as we've done this year in the future."

Market Share has earned \$1.94 million this year and is on the verge of becoming only the fourth trotter in history to enjoy a \$2-million season. The others to reach that level were Muscle Hill (\$2.45 million in 2009), Donato Hanover (\$2.33 million, 2007) and Deweycheatumhowe (\$2.21 million, 2008).

Market Share will face seven rivals in the Galt, starting from post five with regular driver Tim Tetrick in the sulky.

"He's going to race one more time," Toscano said. "He was so good in the American National and came out of it good, so we thought we'd give him one more shot. (Reaching \$2 million) was the incentive, so we'll see. There haven't been a whole lot of horses to do that in one season, so that was definitely the incentive."

Toscano, who became the first female trainer to win the Hambletonian, could also become the first female trainer to earn the Glen Garnsey Trainer of the Year Award from the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

"It's an incredible honor just to be considered, but I really care more about the horses than I do about the accolades," Toscano said. "We try to do the right things and we just hope that the right things happen. It just happened to be one of those years where the stars aligned and everything fell into place." (*Harness Racing Communications*)

Pet Rock Hopes To Smash Competition In Windy City

Friday's \$215,000 Windy City Pace at Maywood Park should be a hotly contested affair from start to finish as a very strong field of eight 3-year-old pacing colts square off in this prestigious event.

Frank Bellino's Pet Rock has been accorded the slight morning line favoritism at 2-1 after drawing post position two for this battle. Doug McNair has been named to drive.

The son of Rocknroll Hanover-Casual Beauty enters this battle off a second-place finish in the Messenger Stake at Yonkers last Saturday night. He has a record of nine wins, eight seconds and four thirds in 24 lifetime starts with earnings of \$871,384 since being purchased before his first career start by Bellino.

Spotted by trainer Virgil Morgan Jr. in a qualifier at Scioto Downs as a 2 year old, Bellino's son Joe was contacted by the veteran conditioner to see if they would be interested in purchasing the colt.

"I called my dad and he said he wasn't really high on the horse, let's wait until he wins another qualifier," Joe Bellino said.

In the meantime, Morgan contacted salesman Ed Murphy and discovered Pet Rock was for sale. He then qualified at the Meadowlands, winning in 1:55.3.

"I was at my house all day waiting for the qualifier to come up," Bellino said with a laugh. "Once he qualified I called and said 'Murph, get that horse for me.' Of course, I had to pay a little more for him after that qualifier than I would have after the first qualifier.

"I took (the video) to my dad and said 'I bought the horse.' He said 'What horse?' and then he said 'Why?' I said 'You'll see after I show you the qualifier.'"

"It was a gutsy buy considering that he wasn't staked to many races," Morgan said. "The Bellinos have given him an opportunity. You never know after a qualifier in (1):58 whether they're going to be that good, but he was one that definitely caught my eye. He's got good conformation and he has proven that he doesn't need any certain type of track to help him. He'll get around any size track. That's a nice advantage." (*Maywood*)

McCarthy Has Windy City Hopes With Dynamic Youth

Andrew McCarthy has come close to winning several big races with Dynamic Youth. He hopes Friday is the night he gets to bring the horse to the winner's circle.

Dynamic Youth is among eight 3-year-old male pacers entered in Friday's \$215,000 Windy City Stakes at Maywood Park in Chicago. He will start from post four with McCarthy handling the driving for trainer Aaron Lambert and owner J&T Silva Stables, Kenneth Tucci and C&G Racing Stable.

In his two most recent starts, Dynamic Youth finished second in the \$260,000 American National Stakes and second in the \$250,000 Monument Circle, both with McCarthy at the lines. Earlier this year, the two finished second in the \$587,315 Confederation Cup.

"I'd love to get one of these races with him," McCarthy said with a laugh. "He's just been a little unlucky, but he's still making pretty good money.

"He's beautiful to drive. He can be a little bit tricky if you get him in a spot with horses around; he can want to take hold of you. But usually you just take him off (the gate) and he'll follow cover pretty good."

Dynamic Youth does have one major stakes victory to his credit—a Triple Crown jewel, in fact—having won the \$322,716 Cane Pace at Tioga Downs on Sept. 3 with George Brennan in the sulky. The triumph came nine days after McCarthy was sidelined by a broken ankle suffered in a racing accident at his home track of Mohegan Sun at Pocono Downs. He missed five weeks of action because of the injury.

"When he won the Cane Pace, when Georgie drove him there at Tioga, I think he proved that he's as good as any of them," said McCarthy, who races primarily at Pocono Downs and returns home to his native Australia during the track's offseason. "We had taken him up to Canada for the Confederation Cup and he raced really good there. He just got unlucky; we got the eight hole in the final, otherwise I think he would have won that race too."

For the year, Dynamic Youth has won six of 17 races and earned \$545,878. He is a son of Bettor's Delight and the first foal out of the mare Always True. He sold for \$85,000 under the name Aldelete Hanover at the Standardbred Horse Sale. (HRC)

It's Not Too Late: Sponsor Caraluzzi's Run For Racehorses

At 22, Jimmy Caraluzzi is a recent college graduate, helping at his father Joe Caraluzzi's stable at Gaitway Farm in New Jersey while he looks for a job. Just out of college, he doesn't have a lot of spare cash to give away, but he does have two strong legs that he's hoping will go a long way toward building support for the Standardbred Retirement Foundation.

"About a year and a half ago, I started running," says Caraluzzi. "I did a half marathon about a year ago. Eight or nine months ago, I signed up for the Philadelphia Marathon."

The 26.2 mile race will be held on Nov. 18 and end up near the "Rocky" steps of the Philadelphia Art Museum.

"I've always wanted to help the Standardbred Retirement Foundation in some way. I saw on the USTA website that they were having troubles at their location and had to move, so I thought this would be a way to help them out.

"I graduated from Rutgers in May and am still looking for a job. I was a finance major; I'm looking for a job in investment management. I had an internship with a financial advisor, but that was more wealth management and I am more interested in portfolio management."

Caraluzzi says his training has not been without its challenges and he's been nursing along a "lameness" issue.

"About two months ago, I was up to around 15 miles and got tendonitis in my knee," he says. "I had to miss about three weeks. That set me back quite a bit. I started going to the gym and using the elliptical and treadmill more, because it's easier on my knees.

"I did a half marathon a month ago in Yonkers (time was 1:50). That was three weeks after coming back from the injury, so I wasn't really prepared; I was just trying to catch up. I did an 18-mile run two weeks ago and I did a 20-mile run last week. I'm still all right."

Caraluzzi says he's borrowed a few strategies from the racehorse world to keep himself sound.

"I always take days off after a long run, just like the racehorses do," he says. "I ice myself. I run around the development where my dad lives (Raintree in Freehold). I have a lot of rock, some hip hop, some of everything on my iPod—anything to keep me going."

Caraluzzi says his fundraising goal is \$2,000—about \$77 a mile.

"I have about \$300 right now (his goal is \$2,000), it's inching up there. People can use Payitsquare to donate—it's very secure. I want to help the SRF find horses homes and keep them healthy—anything they need to do." (HRC)

Gural, Meadowlands Donate \$250,000 To Sandy Relief

New Meadowlands Racetrack LLC chairman Jeff Gural has pledged \$250,000 to the American Red Cross to assist with Hurricane Sandy relief efforts in New Jersey.

Gural and his wife, Paula, will make a personal donation of \$200,000, while another \$50,000 will be donated by the Meadowlands Racetrack.

Parking Lot M at the Meadowlands Racetrack has become a staging area for North Carolina Baptist Men Disaster Relief units to prepare and package 10,000 meals a day for the Red Cross to distribute to the communities hardest hit by Sandy. The Meadowlands has converted its Pegasus Restaurant into a shelter, providing meals and a staging area for first responders and disaster relief volunteers.

"We are grateful for the efforts of the American Red Cross and the North Carolina Baptist Men to aid New Jersey residents in the wake of Hurricane Sandy," Gural said. "The devastation to the communities that surround the Meadowlands and throughout the state is heartbreaking and we wanted to assist in any way we could."

Michigan House Passes Instant Racing 91-16

The Michigan State House of Representatives has passed by a vote of 91-16 a bill that will allow the state's racetracks to add Instant Racing Machines, which allow bettors to play on slot machine-like games on historical Thoroughbred races that are selected by random.

The bill is now awaiting a vote in the State Senate, where it is believed there is also enough support to be passed. However, opposition to the bill has already been stated, including probable legal challenges from the existing three downtown Detroit casinos and the Indian tribes who operate several casinos in the state.

"The mission behind (the legislation) is to try and save the race horse industry in our state," Republican Rep. Kevin Daley was quoted as saying. "The race horse industry has been kind of basically thrown under the bus since the casinos have come into our state. They've been unable to go into the modern era of doing some of the modern things to bring more people into their business."

A bill passed in 2004 provides that any expansion of gaming in the state go before the voters and must be approved as a constitutional amendment. That constitutional amendment does not include the casinos operated in Detroit or by Native American tribes.

Rosecroft Applies For 54 Dates In 2013

Rosecroft Raceway has submitted a 54-date live racing schedule for 2013 to the Maryland Racing Commission. The schedule, along with year-long simulcast approvals, will be voted on by the commission at its Nov. 20 meeting.

This will mark the third year of live racing for the Maryland harness track under the ownership of Penn National Gaming.

A 25-date winter spring meet will run Saturday, March 9, through Saturday, June 1. Racing will be conducted every Tuesday and Saturday evening during 2013. The fall meeting will span from Saturday, Sept. 14 through Saturday, Dec. 21. Combined with Ocean Downs traditional summer race meeting there will be ten continuous months of harness racing in the state of Maryland in 2013.

"There are still many significant headwinds facing the long-term future of Rosecroft Raceway," said Christopher McErlean, vice president of racing for Penn National Gaming Inc. "Even with the many disadvantages placed in its way, Rosecroft remains resilient and we look forward to improving the business and racing product in the coming year."

The current live racing meet runs through Dec. 22 every Tuesday and Saturday evening with a 7:25 p.m. post time, plus a special Thursday, Dec. 20, make-up race card.

Freehold Moves To NJ Preference For 40% Of Races

The Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ) and Freehold Raceway reached an agreement on Tuesday, Nov. 13, to offer 40 percent of all races at Freehold with a preference for New Jersey-owned or New Jersey-sired horses.

The SBOANJ's Tom Luchento and Leo McNamara negotiated the increase with Freehold general manager Howard Bruno and director of racing Karen Fagliarone.

"The preference will be given to New Jersey-owned or New Jersey-sired horses in those races, regardless of when the horses last raced," SBOANJ president Luchento explained. "Of course, if the class does not fill, it will be opened to other horses. This should be reflected in the next condition sheet." (*SBOANJ*)

Beach's Fee Increases; Restriction Reminder

Jim Simpson, the President of Hanover Shoe Farms and the syndicate manager of the stallion Somebeachsomewhere, announced on Thursday (Nov. 15) that the horse will stand the 2013 season at a stud fee of \$20,000. His 2012 fee was \$15,000.

The Beach's first crop are now two year olds and in it he has done what no other sire in the history of harness racing has accomplished. His 2 year olds have already earned an all-time record of \$4,642,586. He is the sire of 31 1:55 or faster 2 year olds. He has also demonstrated the ability to sire great fillies as well as colts. His fillies have thus far earned an astonishing \$2,603,799. His 2 year olds were headed by the magnificent colt Captainteacherous p.2,1.49.2(\$918,253), the Breeders Crown winning filly Somwhovrainbow p.2,1.51.2(446,831) and numerous other prominent 2 year olds.

Somebeachsomewhere will be greatly in demand and Hanover Shoe Farms will try to accommodate as many of its customers as possible, but warns that preference will be given to current syndicate members and to those who have previously supported the horse.

In other breeding industry news, 2013 will be the first year for a restriction in the conditions of stakes races serviced by the Meadowlands, Tioga and Vernon Downs and Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) tracks regarding the breeding of stallions under five years of age.

The restriction states that foals of 2014 sired by stallions which were foaled in 2009 or later (4 year olds or younger in 2013, the year of the breeding) shall not be eligible to stakes at the above tracks unless they meet the one of exemptions listed in the conditions.
