

Hattie's Hall Of Fame Status Rides On Hillbilly Hanover In Matron

There's a lot riding on Sunday's \$176,663 Matron final for 3-year-old colt pacers at Dover Downs, and it's not just the winner's share of the purse. A win by Hillbilly Hanover—who scored a 14-1 upset in the second of two eliminations last Sunday night—would automatically propel his dam, Hattie, to Hall of Fame status.

Already having produced the \$2 million-winner Holborn Hanover and the \$1.1 million-winner Hyperion Hanover, Hattie needs just another winner of more than \$500,000 to meet the Hall of Fame broodmare criteria: one \$1 million winner and two other \$500,000 winners.

Heading into the Matron final, Hillbilly Hanover has \$430,785 in career earnings, so the \$88,331 winner's share

of the purse would send him past the half million-dollar mark. Hattie's 8-year-old son, Haverford Hanover, has \$463,262 in career earnings and is currently racing at The Meadows, so she has a

second opportunity to add another notch to her pending Hall of Fame resume.

Hattie, who raced in the mid 1990s for her late owner Richard Staley and Hall of Fame trainer Doug Ackerman, earned \$266,623 on the racetrack. A daughter of Abercrombie, Hattie is out of the Albatross mare Albaquel, also a multiple stakes winner for Ackerman and Staley in the early 1980s.

Although he had gone winless his first 16 starts this year, Hillbilly Hanover was purchased privately by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli LLC, Frank Baldachino and Lawrence Karr and moved to trainer Ron Burke's barn in late September. Making his first start for his new connections in the \$510,300 Tattersalls on Oct. 6 at The Red Mile, the son of Dragon Again nearly beat his stablemate Sweet Lou, coming up short by a head after a valiant stretch bid.

Hillbilly Hanover then finished fourth and sixth in the Breeders Crown eliminations and final. Then drawing the rail for the \$415,820 Messenger at Yonkers Raceway on Nov. 10, Hillbilly Hanover was the betting favorite, although he continued his winless skein with a third-place finish.

Burke then dropped Hillbilly Hanover in a non-winners of five races conditioned event on Nov. 18 at Harrah's Philadelphia, and with Matt Kakaley he finally found the winner's circle—at overwhelming odds of 1-9. Buoyed by

the confidence of that victory, Hillbilly Hanover—with Yannick Gingras driving—went back-to-back with his career-best 1:50.3f win in the Matron elim, racing first-over through the middle half and then holding clear for a 1 3/4-length victory.

"I used him pretty hard leaving and then he came back up first-up," said Gingras. "He was very good."

Finishing third in that same elim was the Burke-trained, Kakaley-driven Escape The News. Gingras said although Burke listed him to drive both pacers in the elim, he let the trainer make the final decision.

"I was listed on both of them and told him to list me on the one he thought was his best shot," he explained. "I was happy to get the drive."

Hillbilly Hanover will start from post six in Sunday's Matron final as he goes in search of his third straight victory. Gingras said the first win was a confidence booster that he hopes to continue to build on.

"A horse like that, getting those trips, it may help him a little bit with a win. It definitely doesn't hurt, that's for sure," said Gingras. "He was really willing last week; he didn't act like a horse who didn't want to win."

Starting from post four as the 6-5 morning-line favorite is recent Breeders Crown champion Heston Blue Chip, with George Brennan getting the drive from trainer Linda Toscano because regular driver Tim Tetrick is attending a family wedding that night.

Also, North America Cup winner Thinking Out Loud, who won the first Matron elimination, will start from post one in the final, with Adios champ Bolt The Duer lined up in post two. Bolt The Duer and Thinking Out Loud finished one-two, respectively, in the Kentucky Sires Stakes final in early September at The Red Mile.

St. Lads Graduate Looks To Zoom By In Autumn

He's been a part of the Standardbred scene for decades, but time hasn't diminished Bob Ladouceur's love for his horses or the sport.

Ladouceur, 68, who owns and operates St. Lads Farm with his wife, Veronica, currently stables more than 80 horses at their home base in Ruscom Station, Ont. The breeding farm names their foals using the St. Lads prefix. One of their recent graduates is St. Lads Zoom Zoom.

The son of Apaches Fame-St Lads Sassy has won eight of nine career starts. His next test comes in the \$60,000 Autumn Stakes final on Saturday at Woodbine.

In his elimination, the bay gelding was parked three wide past the opening quarter with driver Randy Waples in :26.3, then led his rivals past the half in :55.1 and three quarters in 1:23.4, before edging away in deep stretch to score the win in a sizzling 1:52.4.

"That was a pretty impressive mile," Ladouceur said from his home. "A horse driven by Jody Jamieson (Executive Jet) made a break in front of us which caused us to go wide before making the front. For him to finish the way he did in that kind of time was pretty special."

St. Lads Zoom Zoom has banked \$61,725 this season including a victory in the \$63,400 Middlesex Pacing Series final at Western Fair.

When St. Lads Zoom Zoom was a yearling, he was bought back by Ladouceur at the Forest City Yearling.

"A client of mine, Diane

Stephenson, has a number of horses that we look after at our farm and one day her and her trainer Greg Horn came over to look at the yearlings. They both liked St. Lads Zoom Zoom and if the horse didn't bring a certain price at the sale, then I would bring him home and work something out with them."

Ladouceur bought St. Lads Zoom Zoom back for \$9,000 and struck a deal with Stephenson and Horn, who are based in Michigan.

"I loved the colt as a yearling," Ladouceur recalled. "He was one of the best looking yearlings in our consignment. There was nothing not to like about him."

Although St. Lads Zoom Zoom has had a solid career to date, the process of getting him to the races wasn't the easiest task.

"Greg doesn't like to race horses at two, so we waited on him for a 3 year old," Ladouceur said. "Training down, Greg said he was a bad actor, so he gelded him. I remember getting a report from Greg one day saying that he was starting to learn the ropes. A few weeks before he qualified in July, I remember Greg saying, 'We may have something here.'"

That blueprint, allowing St. Lads Zoom Zoom to not race at two, has paid dividends this season.

Meadowlands Hires PI To Focus On Integrity

The Meadowlands Racetrack has been proud to be home to the world's greatest harness racing since its founding. In addition, the racetrack takes pride in providing a racing product that is driven by integrity. In the 2013 racing season, the Meadowlands Racetrack will take another booming step in providing that integrity-driven product.

The Meadowlands has hired a private investigator who will be focused on the integrity of racing at the New Meadowlands Racetrack, Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs.

Chairman of New Meadowlands Racetrack LLC, Jeff Gural, shared the following, "It has always been one of my top priorities to provide a racing product whose integrity the betting public can be proud of. I feel that this step is a significant one in achieving that goal at The Meadowlands Racetrack as well as Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs. I look forward to working with our field investigator to support the world class, integrity-driven racing product the betting public wants and deserves."

Gural continued, "Our goal is to provide an integrity-driven racing product at the three tracks as we continue to ensure the health and welfare of our equine athletes both on and off the track. I am personally disappointed that so far we have not been able to come up with a program where a small portion of slots money is used for testing and marketing purposes, so I will make this important first step as for me anything less than a level playing field is unacceptable. Anyone who feels as I do and who would be interested in sharing the cost of this new integrity program at the Meadowlands, Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs, should contact Jason M. Settlemoir at jsettlemoir@newmracing.com."

An important aspect of the new field investigators duties are outlined in Section 27 of the 2013 Meadowlands Racetrack Racing Application. Upon applying for participation to race at the Meadowlands, Tioga Downs and Vernon Downs during the 2013 meet, horsemen and trainers must grant unfettered access to Meadowlands Racetrack officers, agents or representatives, to their ship-in stalls, training facilities, etc., as discussed in Section 27 of the application.

It reads as follows:

27. In consideration of the Meadowlands granting me the privilege of racing at Meadowlands Racetrack, I hereby appoint the Meadowlands Racetrack, its officers, agents or representatives as my agent for the limited purpose and authority to enter, without prior notice, the ship in stalls at Meadowlands Racetrack and/or any other premises, either in-state or out-of-state, including but not limited to any off-track stabling facilities, farms, training centers or other racetrack facilities, for the purpose of checking on the wellbeing and health of any racehorse listed on this application or entered in any upcoming Meadowlands race by me as trainer. Checking on the well being and health of any such racehorse shall include but not be limited to the taking of blood or urine or

other testing procedures by the Meadowlands officer, agent or representative. By acknowledgement of this limited agency given by me to the Meadowlands officers, agents or representatives, I acknowledge and agree that the Meadowlands officer, agent or representative is my agent or guest or invitee and is permitted to enter any of the above mentioned premises as my agent, guest or invitee. Additionally, I agree to produce at my own cost and within 24 hours of a request by the Meadowlands officer, agent or representative, any horse listed on this application or any horse which is entered in any Meadowlands race which is under my custody and control and which I am listed as trainer of record, for the purpose of blood, urine or other testing procedures at a designated location at Meadowlands Racetrack or other location designated by the Meadowlands. In Meadowlands sole discretion and for good cause shown, this time frame can be extended at my written request. In the event of non-cooperation and failure to adhere to these conditions, I am subject to the loss of privileges to enter horses at Meadowlands Racetrack. By signing this application, I further acknowledge and agree that the grant of racing privileges at the Meadowlands Racetrack is a privilege afforded me by Meadowlands Racetrack and is not a property right. *(Meadowlands)*

Put On A Show Wins 12th Of 2012

World champion 5-year-old pacing mare Put On A Show won her 12th race of the year on Wednesday afternoon at Harrah's Philadelphia, capturing a \$50,000 Open in wire-to-wire fashion in 1:51.1 for driver Brian Sears and trainer Chris Ryder. Also on the card, Empire Breeders Classic and Lady Maud champion Bettor B Lucky scored in 1:52.2 in a \$17,000 conditioned event for driver Yannick Gingras.

Put On A Show started from post seven in Wednesday's Open and Sears had his charge on top by the opening quarter of :27. Holding a two-length advantage over her seven rivals through fractions of :54.3 and 1:22.4, the 3-5 favorite Put On A Show closed out her 1 1/2-length win over runner-up Ooh Bad Shark with a final quarter of :28.2. Royal Cee Cee N was 3 1/2 lengths behind in third.

After tying up during her start against her male peers in the \$500,000 Breeders Crown Open Pace Oct. 27 at Woodbine Racetrack, Put On A Show finished a late-closing third in an Open Pace Nov. 16 at Yonkers Raceway after starting from post eight. Her Philadelphia win was her second start since her Crown attempt, bringing her seasonal earnings to \$494,403 for owners Richard Young, Joanne Young and Craig Henderson. Overall, the daughter of Rocknroll Hanover has 31 wins in 49 starts and \$2,387,878 in earnings. Her 1:47.3 win in the Lady Liberty on Aug. 4 at the Meadowlands is the fastest mile ever by a female pacer.

Break The Bank K To Stand At Midland In Ohio

BreakThe Bank K 2,1:55.3f; 3,1:51.3, a millionaire and winner of the 2010 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Colt Trot, will stand his first season at stud in 2013 at Midland Acres in Bloomingburg, Ohio. He will stand for a fee of \$3,500, or \$3,000 for multiple bookings.

"Since Jailhouse Jesse and Justice Hall moved to our Indiana farm, we've been on the lookout for the right trotting sire to replace them in Ohio. We found him in BreakThe Bank K," said Dr. John Mossbarger of Midland Acres.

"It looks like we've finally turned the corner here with the arrival of slots, and breeders are optimistic about the future of the Ohio Sire Stakes and improved purses in general. There's been a lot of demand for a high-quality trotting sire in Ohio, and BreakThe Bank K certainly fits the bill," he added.

BreakThe Bank K, campaigned in the successful racing stable of Bob Key and trained by Trond Smedshammer as a 3 year old, was driven exclusively that season by Brian Sears. Sears had high praise for the trotter. "He's a very well-made horse, wore very little equipment and had very high speed," he said. "He's got all the attributes to be a very successful sire."

Mossbarger was optimistic that BreakThe Bank K's pedigree is also good fit for Ohio. "BreakThe Bank K provides an outcross to many of today's mares, being a son of Revenue S, who also sired this year's Hambletonian winner, Market Share," Mossbarger said. "We hope he plays a big role in Ohio's future." (*Midland Acres*)

Zoccali New Director Of Racing Operations At Meadowlands

The Meadowlands Racetrack has announced that the position of director of racing operations will be filled by Darin Zoccali, effective Nov. 30.

Zoccali, 29, a native of Staten Island, N.Y., is a graduate of St. John's University. He later attended Pace Law School in White Plains, N.Y. He has been around horse racing, and particularly the Meadowlands, his entire life, attending the races with his father since he was a small child. After law school, Zoccali decided to pursue a career in his true passion, horse racing.

In 2006, Zoccali began filling in as a co-host on the Meadowlands in-house and nightly recap television show, while working as a news correspondent for the United States Trotting Association. The following year he realized a dream, gaining the opportunity to call races at both Tioga Downs and Ocean Downs. In the years that followed Zoccali became a regular contributor to "Down the Stretch" on SiriusXM radio while seeing his role at the Meadowlands

continuing to grow in guest services, marketing and television. Later he would become the associate announcer at Parx Racing (formerly Philadelphia Park) and one of the feature writers for Harness Racing Update. In January 2012 he took on the role of morning line odds-maker and track handicapper at the Meadowlands.

In a twist of fate, Zoccali now finds himself working alongside one of the first people to give him an opportunity in the industry, Jason Settlemoir.

"Having worked with Darin for the last six years at Tioga Downs, I've come to learn that his passion for the sport of harness racing is only surpassed by his work ethic," said Settlemoir. "He brings many things to the table and at a young age has already contributed to the sport in many different ways. He excels in studying numbers and figures, breaking them down and forming ideas based on what he has learned. I am excited to set forth on this new journey with Darin filling this role. He brings energy and enthusiasm to a position that warrants a great deal of both. We are getting set to launch a new era at the Meadowlands with the opening of a brand new facility and I am very pleased to have Darin as a part of this team."

Zoccali is overwhelmed by the opportunity. "I was ecstatic when I was asked to become the odds-maker and track handicapper last year," said Zoccali. "I told my wife, there is one person in the world that gets to do that and to think that's me, I was speechless. But now this gives that concept a whole new meaning. I have learned many things since I started working in this business. One of those things was there is no better team than Jeff Gural and Jason Settlemoir. I'm just happy to be a part of this team, where I will continue to learn from them and will do everything I can to contribute to this racetrack that has meant so much to me, my entire life. This is not just a job and this is not just a racetrack to me. It continues to be a huge part of my life."

In addition to his role as director of racing operations, Zoccali will continue as the morning line odds-maker and track handicapper. He will continue to appear on the Meadowlands television broadcasts and will remain the Meadowlands correspondent to TVG, appearing each race night on "Drive Time." (*Meadowlands*)

Morrill Is King Of Road In New York

As Mel Brooks famously said while portraying Louis the XIV in Brooks' comedy classic History of the World, "It's good to be the king."

There is no denying Jim Morrill Jr.'s title as the king of the New York Sires Stakes (NYSS), not after he picked up yet another award as the New York Sires Stakes Driver of the Year in 2012.

And Morrill agrees with Brooks. "Oh, yeah," he laughed. "They've called me that for the last three, four years, ever since Wally Hennessey left the throne. I kind of took it over."

No lie there. Morrill won three of the eight \$225,000 NYSS finals at Yonkers Raceway on Sept. 22, scoring with the 2-year-old trotting colt Fashion Blizzard, the 2-year-old filly pacer Summertime Lea and the 3-year-old filly trotter Cowgirl Hall.

"That's the best I've ever done," Morrill said. "I'm rolling right along. I'm where I want to be."

To say New York-breds have been good for his career would be quite an understatement. He won the first leg of the Trotting Triple Crown when he drove Peter Arrigenna's 3-year-old New York-bred Archangel to victory in the Yonkers Trot in world record time, then finished fourth with him in the second leg, the \$1.5 million Hambletonian. Archangel also set a track record at Batavia Downs when he won an NYSS division in 1:54.3. Batavia Downs honored Archangel with a commemorative coffee mug giveaway Nov. 21.

Morrill began this year ranked 29th all-time in earnings (\$70,795,406) and 77th in victories (5,042). What's amazing is that he's achieved that lofty status despite routinely taking every winter off, a concession to his incredibly busy travel regimen the rest of the year. "I can only do so much," he said.

Time off in the winter allows him to have time with his family, his wife, Molly, and their three children, 24-year-old Jessica, 22-year-old Jonathan and 15-year-old Karli.

Family is important to Morrill. It always has been. He was born in Methuen, Maine, and grew up near Rockingham Park in New Hampshire.

"My father raced most of his days at Rockingham, Foxboro, Green Mountain and Hinsdale," Morrill said. "But when I was going through high school, I wasn't into racing. I was doing my own things, playing hockey and other sports. The horses never really came on until my hockey career ended. After I graduated, I said, 'Now what?'"

His dad had the answer. "I put together a farm with my dad," Morrill said. "He meant the world to me. He was a great guy. I can't say enough about him. When I started driving, he was still driving, but he stepped down and gave me everything. I lost him five years ago."

Asked if he's happy with where his career and his life are at now, he said, "A thousand percent. I just thank God every day that I didn't get hurt." (HBNYS)
