### Six Set For Battle In Progress Pace

While 11 of the 12 divisions of racing have wrapped up their stakes campaigns for 2014, there are still two races left on the calendar this month for the 3-year-old colt pacers. Northfield Park's Cleveland Classic will put a bow on the season on Dec. 12, but first up is Sunday night's \$301,560 Progress Pace at Dover Downs.

Although eight went postward in last Sunday's Progress Preview, two defections have left a field of just six going postward. The compact group includes solid favorites McWicked and JK Endofanera, who will start from posts 4 and 2, respectively. In the Preview, \$25,000 supplemental entry McWicked bested JK Endofanera by two lengths in 1:48.4.

McWicked (\$1,322,157) and JK Endofanera (\$1,028,645) are the only two division members to top the \$1-million mark in seasonal earnings. All Bets Off (\$911,425), who joins fellow Ron Burke trainees JK Endofanera and Big Boy Dreams in the field, would join the exclusive club if he comes up a winner.

After appearing to have run out of gas this fall, McWicked has bounced back to his early-season form over his last three starts since trainer Casie Coleman added Lasix. McWicked raced for the first time on the anti-bleeding medication in the Breeders Crown elims, where he finished a close second. He then ended his seven-race losing streak by capturing the \$531,250 Crown final, which was followed up by his score in the Progress Preview.

"It started around the Jug that he wasn't firing on the end," said McWicked's driver, David Miller. "Now he's finishing on the end. He was back to himself like he was early in the year. Lasix really has seemed to help him out."

With a revolving door of winners in the majors for 3-year-old pacing colts this season, division honors have appeared up in the air. Voting will begin in few days by members of the U.S. Harness Writers Association, but Burke thinks McWicked's Breeders Crown victory likely sealed the deal.

"I think McWicked pretty well sewed it up, and I hate to say it," said Burke, whose JK Endofanera counts the North America Cup as one of his 10 victories this year. "He won the Breeders Crown, and I said all along that whoever won it would get it, unless some oddball won it and then it

would have been wide open. Give that horse credit. It looked like he was all done and he has come back and is racing great again."

Yannick Gingras, who drove JK Endofanera last time out in the Progress Preview, admitted he has his work cut out for him if he is to turn the tables on McWicked on Sunday.

"It's hard to pass McWicked in a last quarter of :26.3, so we'll see what happens this week," Gingras said, referring to the Preview. "I have a good post and my horse has a good shot, no doubt."

The Progress will be JK Endofanera's 20th start of the year, but Gingras said he sees no signs of weariness.

"Actually, I think he's fairly sharp," he said. "He really didn't race on smaller tracks all year so they spaced his starts out for the big-track races. He really didn't get beat up as much as some of the other ones. So he's still pretty fresh. He has one more big start in him, I'm pretty sure of that."

Burke said that this will be JK Endofanera's last start of the year but All Bets Off and Big Boy Dreams are both penciled in for the Cleveland Classic. Interestingly, Burke said he hasn't eased off on his training regimen as the year comes to an end.

"I usually bear down on them even more because the end is in sight," he said. "And I think all three of mine will be good (in the Progress). They were all super (in the Preview)." — *By Gordon Waterstone*

## Julie Miller: Harness 145, Thoroughbred 1

Credit Julie Miller with 146 winners so far this year, 145 as a Standardbred trainer and one as a Thoroughbred owner. Yes, besides overseeing the harness horses in tandem with her husband, Andy, Miller is a co-owner of the 3-year-old Thoroughbred gelding He's Got Talent, who posted a 1:13.21 victory in a six-furlong race on Tuesday afternoon, Dec. 2, at Parx Racing in suburban Philadelphia.

"It's nice to be an owner and go watch and root for your horse," said Miller, who was not at Parx for the victory. "I don't have to worry about managing the horse, so it's fun. We went as a family a couple times this summer to Monmouth, and my daughter Olivia fell in love with it. It's a fun thing we do as a family thing.

"I don't have anything to do with it, I just come and watch. I'm strictly an owner, paying my bills and watching him race."

Miller's partner on He's Got Talent is fellow harness trainer Nick Surick, the boyfriend of her niece, Hannah. The pair's first Thoroughbred was Valley Stream, who they claimed earlier this year but was soon claimed away. He's Got Talent was claimed for \$10,000 on Aug. 31 at Monmouth Park, where he finished sixth as the 6-5 favorite.

In the barn of trainer Dianne Jeannot, He's Got Talent finished third his first two starts for the Miller/Surick team before Tuesday's victory in a \$16,000 claimer with jockey Eri Luis

Vaz. With the 60-percent winner's share of the \$26,000 purse, He's Got Talent has earned \$28,016 in the three starts.

"We claimed him when the Monmouth meet ended and then he got hurt in the stall and we had to give him some time off," said Miller.

Miller said it was a no-brainer for her to enter the world of Thoroughbreds.

"I love horses and my passion is racing horses," she said. "My extracurricular hobby is I love to trail ride and I love the Thoroughbreds."

ing only in mid-October. A winner of more than \$2.2 million in 169 career starts, Golden Receiver had two winning qualifiers for Miller before finishing a narrow second (by a nose) in a \$30,000 A2/A1/FFA pace on Nov. 29 at the Meadowlands.

"He's just a classy veteran," said Miller. "The owners called us and asked if we wanted to take him on and campaign him at the Meadowlands this season."

Golden Receiver will make start number two for Team Miller in the same class in Race 6 on Saturday night at the Big M, this time starting from the outside post 9. Last time

out, Golden Receiver started from the outside post in a seven-horse field with Andy driving and led at every call (:26.3, :55.2 and 1:23) before getting nipped at the wire despite a last quarter of :26.4 by Speed Again in 1:49.4. Speed Again starts from post 8 in Saturday's race.

"He needed that start last week and I look for him to be better this week," said Miller. "But I was really happy with the way he raced last week. How ridiculous is it that I'm saying he was short?"

Miller added how impressed she was that Golden Receiver is still going strong at age nine.

"I always laugh because the older all of us get, we seem to get a little hitch to our giddy-up, but he still keeps going strong," said Miller, who added she made just a couple minor changes, including shoeing. "It seems like his best game plan is being on the front end. Once you're at this point, it's hard to re-program a horse like that." — *By Gordon Waterstone*

### Prix d'Amerique Prep Race On Saturday In Paris

One of the major prep races for the Prix d'Amerique will be held at the Vincennes track in Paris, France, on Saturday, Dec. 6.

The field includes two-time Prix d'Amerique winner Ready Cash (2011 and 2012 champion), who was retired from racing back in February this year and has been standing at stud. The horse's primary owner, French trainer Philippe Alaire, put him back in training. Since he has not been racing, Ready Cash needs to earn at least 31,000 euros this year (about \$38,000) to be eligible to the Prix d'Amerique.

Also in the field is Solvato, a half brother to Shake It Cerry.

The Prix du Bourbonnais has a large enough purse to take care of Ready Cash's money problems, but he will be handicapped, starting 25 meters behind the field. The race covers a distance of approximately 1 3/4 miles.

## Crunching The Numbers Makes Father Patrick Horse Of The Year

Selecting the best choice for Horse of the Year is all about ranking the accomplishments. By my score that means Father Patrick should be named top horse by a one-point nod over Sweet Lou.

I'll be honest, that's not how I ranked the horses in my last vote for the influential Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown weekly poll. I voted undefeated JK She'salady first, Shake It Cerry second, then Father Patrick and Sweet Lou. All four would be fine choices in a year lacking a clear favorite.

But since Horse of the Year is the pinnacle of the annual awards, I thought some serious analysis and number crunching was in order to figure out my vote.

I started by ranking the accomplishments and assigning weighted points for each of 14 categories I scored for each horse. In my book, winning your division's biggest stakes races trumps everything because it's the all-important convergence of money, competition and prestige. Before you point out that Father Patrick didn't win the Hambletonian, stick with me. Next most important is earnings, clearly a bigger barometer of individual success than wins, overall record or mark for the obvious reason—the game, like much of life, revolves around money. Next, I went with strength of division, followed by win/on-the-board percentage, a horse's mark—including a 10-point bonus if a horse set or equaled a world record. I rounded it out by considering the length of each horse's 2014 campaign and, finally, included a 10-point bonus if a horse won the biggest stakes race in its division.

I started with the top eight horses in the last Hambletonian Society poll of the year—the aforementioned four, plus Nuncio, Sebastian K, Mission Brief and McWicked. Using my scoring system, Father Patrick earned 156 points, followed by Sweet Lou (155), JK She'salady (150), Shake It Cerry (116), McWicked (112), Nuncio (110), Sebastian K (106) and Mission Brief (97).

Father Patrick racked up top spot because he had the highest earnings of all eight horses, ranked third in terms of the percentage of major stakes victories—winning the Breeders Crown, Canadian Trotting Classic, Beal, Stanley Dancer, Zweig and American National—was in the third toughest division behind the open pacers and sophomore pacing colts, and he set a world record at Pocono. Yes, he didn't win the Hambletonian—plus some mid-level stakes down the stretch—but Sweet Lou didn't win the Breeders Crown or the Canadian Pacing Derby, his division's two biggest stakes.

Sweet Lou scored well for being in the toughest division, setting a world record at Pocono and having the third highest earnings overall, a haul of \$1.36 million that was \$500,000 more than the next horse in his division (Foiled Again). Sweet Lou also had the longest campaign of them all—269 days from his first qualifier of the year to his last race. Considering he finished just one point behind Father Patrick in my rankings, I consider this a toss up. Either one would be a good choice.

JK She'salady scored extremely well for winning her division's biggest stakes and being perfect, but faltered slightly compared to Father Patrick and Sweet Lou in terms of division strength, relatively low earnings compared to the others, having the shortest racing season and the fact she's a 2 year old. Simply put, 2 year olds don't face the kind of competition and schedule as horses three or older. As for being undefeated, I think too much emphasis is placed on that, especially if the horse is a rookie.

Shake It Cerry ranked second in terms of percentage of big stakes wins. She also did well on earnings and win percentage. She was hurt by the fact the 3-year-old trotting filly division wasn't particularly strong, she didn't have a world record this year, and she didn't win her division's biggest race, the Hambletonian Oaks.

As for McWicked, despite not winning either the North America Cup or the Little Brown Jug—he wasn't eligible to the Meadowlands Pace—he did race in the second toughest division, had the highest earnings, and set a world record at Pocono.

Nuncio scored well for earnings and being in a tough division, but won just three of his division's eight biggest stakes and played second fiddle to stablemate Father Patrick most of the year.

Sebastian K received points for his incredible world record at Pocono and strength of division, but ranked fairly low in terms of big stakes wins, earnings and faltering down the stretch.

Mission Brief set a world record and won both the Breeders Crown and the Merrie Annabelle, but made breaks in other key races, had relatively low earnings compared to the others, had a short season and suffers compared to all except JK She'salady for being a 2 year old.

There you have my pseudo-scientific attempt to determine the best choice for the 2014 Horse of the Year. No matter how the other voters rank the horses, I hope they give it serious consideration.

## Simulcast Impasse Affects Meadowlands

MidAtlantic Cooperative LLC, a purchasing cooperative representing 23 racetracks, has issued a statement that it has failed to reach agreement with Monarch Content Management Company (a company under the umbrella of the Stronarch Group), and that could keep horseplayers at many tracks from wagering on the Meadowlands races this weekend. The impasse is over rates paid for racing simulcast signals.

The MidAtlantic Coop members include: Parx Racing, Penn National, Freehold Raceway, Atlantic City Race Course, Delaware Park, CharlesTown, Colonial Downs, Pocono Downs, Harrah's Philadelphia, Dover Downs, Harrington Raceway, Ocean Downs, Suffolk Downs, Rockingham Park, Rosecroft, Sam Houston, Thistledown, Mahoning Valley Race Course, Dayton Raceway, Northfield Park, Retama Park, Belterra Park and Plainridge Race Course. The Meadowlands signal is offered under the management of Monarch. Because of New Jersey state law, all New Jersey tracks will still be able to offer wagering on the Meadowlands races.

Also, any advance deposit wagering site or off-track wagering facility affiliated with any of the above listed locations may also be impacted.

In a release issued Thursday, the Meadowlands stated: "We deeply regret any inconvenience this may cause any of our customers and we are hopeful this contractual issue will be resolved in the near future.

If you are an individual who frequents any of the sites listed above with the purpose of wagering on the Meadowlands, we urge you to contact the site beforehand to confirm whether or not the Meadowlands signal is being offered.

Once again, we apologize for any inconvenience this may cause you."

## Takter Planning Maven's French Campaign

Standardbred Canada has reported that the trotting mare Maven will leave for France on Dec. 18 and is scheduled to compete at the Vincennes track in Paris on Dec. 28. Herb Liverman, who bought Maven for \$750,000 at last month's Harrisburg mixed sale and now co-owns the mare with John Fielding and Joyce McClelland, said trainer Jimmy Takter has a schedule of four races planned for Maven, with the last the Prix d'Amerique on Jan. 25. Takter won the 1999 Prix d'Amerique with Moni Maker.

This will be the second trip to Europe this year for Maven. She competed in the Elitlopp in Stockholm in late May, finishing third in an elimination heat and sixth in the final, with Timoko winning both races. Yannick Gingras drove Maven in Sweden and has been her regular driver in the US, but Takter is planning to use a French driver for the races in Paris.

Maven was the runner-up to Commander Crowe in the Breeders Crown Open Trot and then finished fifth to Intimide in last Saturday's TVG final at the Meadowlands.

## James Keeps Watching McWicked Win

Horse owner Ed James figures it's best to do a lot of listening and limit his talking. So James listened when he was advised that McWicked was the best horse in the 2013 Standardbred Horse Sale's Mixed Sale. And his response was succinct.

"I said, 'OK, I'll buy him,'" James recalled, laughing. "I make it simple."

James, who races as SSG Stables, bought McWicked for \$210,000. He put the 3-year-old pacer in the care of trainer Casie Coleman and the colt has won 11 of 22 races, hit the board a total of 20 times, and earned \$1.32 million. His victories include the Breeders Crown, Max C. Hempt Memorial, Delvin Miller Adios, and Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championship.

On Sunday, McWicked will start from post 4 with driver David Miller in the \$301,560 Progress Pace at Dover Downs. McWicked is the 2-1 second choice on the morning line behind 7-5 favorite JK Endofanera, who drew post two with driver Yannick Gingras.

McWicked, who was supplemented to the race for \$25,000, won this past Sunday's \$35,000 Progress Pace Preview by two lengths over JK Endofanera in 1:48.4. The stakes record for the Progress Pace is 1:49, set in 2012 by Heston Blue Chip.

"I've been in this business for 58 years and never had a horse this good," the 83-year-old James said about McWicked. "I have no concern at all with him. I trust in the ability he has to be as good as the next best one. I think David gave him a great drive the other night. Hopefully he can do it again."

James, who is the president of SSG Gloves, purchased McWicked following a 2-year-old campaign in which the colt won three of 10 starts and \$179,617 while in the stable of trainer Julie Miller. He turned over the horse to trainer Jim McDonald, who prepped McWicked for his 3-year-old season, and then to Coleman.

"Casie said, 'This is a real good horse. I can make him a great horse.' So she did," James said. "I'm not that smart as far as horses go. But I'm smart as far as people go. And I'm fortunate enough to know good people and I'm fortunate enough that they'll take my horses. I've had very good luck.

"I don't say much of anything to my trainers, which they appreciate," he added. "My trainers never hear from me, unless they call me."

McWicked leads all 3-year-old pacers in earnings, followed by North America Cup winner JK Endofanera, who has banked \$1.02 million.

McWicked's only off-the-board finishes were a fourth in the North America Cup final, after winning his elimination, and a fifth in the Little Brown Jug final.

"He had a little bit of road trouble in the North America Cup, but that's OK," James said. "I never did drive, I have no intentions of learning to drive, so I don't tell anybody how to drive."

McWicked won seven of eight starts between June 21 and Sept. 7, then was winless in his next seven races before capturing the Breeders Crown on Nov. 22 at the Meadowlands. He has raced on Lasix his three most recent starts, picking up two wins and a second. (HRC)

### After 5 Years, Arch & Ida Get Ready To Part Ways

From afar, he might not appear the easiest to love. But it didn't take him long to steal Ida Nilsen's heart. Archie is just that way.

For the last five years, Nilsen has been the caretaker of world renowned trotter Arch Madness, aka Archie, in the stable of trainer Trond Smedshammer. Last Saturday night, Nilsen and Arch Madness went to the races together for the final time. On Monday, Nilsen said an emotional goodbye.

Nilsen's work visa expires this week and the 29-year-old native of Norway returned to her homeland Tuesday. She was undecided if she would remain there or come back to the U.S. sometime in the future.

"I don't know what I'm going to do," Nilsen said Monday afternoon. "I'm just going to go home and see what kinds of opportunities are thrown at me."

Her opportunity to work and travel with Arch Madness, she added, was "truly a fairytale."

Nilsen arrived at Smedshammer's stable seven years ago after deciding to leave Norway when friend Maria Kristensen—Arch Madness' previous caretaker—told her how much she enjoyed working in the States.

"I always wanted to come here and when she told me how great it was I made up my mind," Nilsen said. "It was the best decision I ever made."

When Kristensen left the stable in 2009, Nilsen took over as Arch Madness' caretaker.

But it wasn't love at first sight.

"I didn't really care much for him because I saw him in the barn with Maria and he was very spoiled," Nilsen said, adding with a laugh, "Kind of like the way he is with me now—and everyone else probably sees it, but now I don't see it."

"It didn't take me long before I fell in love with him. It's just the way he is. When he lets you get close to him, he's got a great personality. There's just no one like him. To everyone else, he just seems like an old grump, but he is very great, not only on the racetrack, but to be around in the barn as a horse."

"He knows people. He's very smart like that. The way he acts when he sees me, I fell in love with that."

Arch Madness won his first start, an elimination of the Maple Leaf Trot, with Nilsen by his side and finished second in the Maple Leaf Trot final.

During their ensuing time together, Nilsen saw Arch Madness win numerous races, but none more emotional than his triumph in the 2011 Oslo Grand Prix. Smedshammer, also from Norway, was unable to travel home for the race because of paperwork delays for his visa.

"It was a lot of pressure to race a horse in that race," Nilsen said. "Everyone dreams of racing in that race, and I got to race in it—and we won it. Then I cried. I cried until after the winner's circle."

"To bring a horse like him to my home country, that was really very special. Everyone expected us to do well, and he did great." (HRC)
