

### Hypnotic Blue Chip Is Racing's Michael Jordan

In the early stages of returning from his second retirement from racing, the 7-year-old pacer Hypnotic Blue Chip can certainly be considered the sport's Michael Jordan, who retired three times over his Hall of Fame basketball career.

Owner Fran Azur first decided to retire Hypnotic Blue Chip in the fall of 2011. At the time, Hypnotic Blue Chip had earnings of more than \$1.4 million, with his victories including a world-record 1:47.2 effort in a division of the U.S. Pacing Championship in 2010 at the Meadowlands.

Azur planned to stand Hypnotic Blue Chip at stud in 2012, but after breeding only a few mares he was brought back to the races. And just like Jordan, who returned each time from his retirements as good as ever, Hypnotic Blue Chip had a suc-

cessful campaign. He won seven times in 25 starts, including a seasonal-best 1:49.1 at the Meadowlands, with \$199,519 in earnings.

After two starts last January, Hypnotic Blue Chip was again retired to stand stud, but after breeding 13 mares, the decision was made for a second return to racing. After time off at Azur's farm in Pennsylvania, Hypnotic Blue Chip made two qualifying starts in November at the Meadowlands.

In his pari-mutuel return on Dec. 7 in a B-1 pace at the Big M, Hypnotic Blue Chip started from post eight with driver Tim Tetrick and rallied from eighth at the half to close within one length of the winning Bolder in 1:51.4.

Hypnotic Blue Chip will make his second start back in the same class on Saturday night at the Big M. With Tetrick recovering from hip-replacement surgery, John Campbell has been enlisted to drive from the outside post 10.

"He was very good in his first start and getting the 10 hole this week really sucks," said trainer Kevin McDermott. "We'll race him accordingly and let him finish up.

"He really has come back better than he has the last two years. Hopefully he'll make a good living just racing in opens, at the Meadowlands, Chester (Harrah's Philadelphia)

or wherever. He's ready to roll. Hopefully he'll have a good season next year."

With his returns to racing, Hypnotic Blue Chip has built his career bankroll to more than \$1.7 million. McDermott admits he has his eye on reaching \$2 million.

"Absolutely. It's something I actually thought about and would love to do," McDermott concluded.—By Gordon Waterstone

## Three Named Unanimous Dan Patch Winners

Bee A Magician, Father Patrick, and Maven were unanimous 2013 Dan Patch Award selections as the best harness racing horses in their respective divisions, the U.S. Harness Writers Association announced Thursday.

A total of 131 ballots were returned. Three-year-old filly trotter Bee A Magician and older female trotter Maven were named on all 131 while 2-year-old male trotter Father Patrick was named on 130 with one abstention.

Six other year-end champions were named Thursday in divisions that saw only one horse receive at least 10 percent of the vote. Three-year-old male pacer Captaintreacherous and older male trotter Market Share both received 130 votes and were declared winners in their divisions.

Also being named winners were 2-year-old filly pacer Precocious Beauty, 2-year-old filly trotter Shake It Cerry, 3-year-old filly pacer I Luv The Nitelife, and older male pacer Foiled Again.

Winners in the three remaining divisions—2-year-old male pacer, 3-year-old male trotter, and older female pacer—will be announced at the Dan Patch Awards banquet on Sunday, Feb. 23, at Dover Downs. Pacer of the Year, Trotter of the Year, and Horse of the Year also will be revealed at that time.

Finalists for best 2-year-old male pacer are He's Watching and Luck Be Withyou, with the 3-year-old male trotter race coming down to Royalty For Life and Spider Blue Chip and older female pacer a battle between Anndrovette and Rocklamation. (HRC)

## Tetrick Recovering From Hip Replacement Surgery

Driver Tim Tetrick told harnessracing.com Thursday morning that while he is still in some pain following surgery two days ago to replace his left hip, the operation was successful and he hopes to return to the sulky in early February.

Because of a degenerative hip condition that resulted in him limping and in constant pain, Tetrick had his right hip replaced in December 2008 and originally planned to have the left hip done in late 2009. The surgery five years ago went well enough that Tetrick delayed the second procedure until now, which was done Tuesday at Rubina Medical Center in Bensalem, Pa. After spending the night in the hospital, Tetrick returned home on Wednesday.

"I'm OK; so far so good," said Tetrick, who turned 32 on Nov. 22. "I'm hoping to get back right after the Super Bowl (Feb. 2). Last time was 37 days, but now we'll just see how it goes.

"I'm just really sore, stiff and bruised up. I don't know if the last one was just exceptional, but this surgery didn't go as well as the first. But I'm getting better."

Tetrick's last drives came at Harrah's Philadelphia on Monday, Dec. 16. He finished the year with 582 victories, currently ranking him fifth in North America. With earnings of \$16,164,822, he is assured of capturing his seventh consecutive money title. Tetrick's career purse earnings of \$140,804,214 place him seventh on the all-time list.

## Christmas Miracle For N.J. Harness Racing Family

This holiday season, Frank Rende Jr. is conjuring up every ounce of his faith, work ethic and positive energy to pull through a recent family disaster.

On Nov. 29, after celebrating Thanksgiving, Rende, his wife Debbie, and their three children, Nicholas, 19, Vincent, 9, and Sofia, 8, were suddenly awakened just after 4:30 a.m. and forced to flee their burning home in Ringwood, N.J.

The Rende's youngest son, Vincent, is credited with saving their lives by waking everybody up. Most of their possessions were destroyed and the house is uninhabitable due to the fire damage. Their insurance does not cover all of their needs, such as repairs, furniture, appliances and clothes. "To see the house my dad built with his own two hands in 1959 with smoke coming out it was more than a shock," said Rende. "The origin guy discovered there was a tiny crack in the chimney. Over 60 years the clay tiles had disintegrated by water because there was no cap. It smoldered for hours without setting off the smoke alarms. Then, to hear the crackling from the flames was just devastating.

"We're lucky to be alive, because if it wasn't for my boy we'd all be dead," Rende continued. "When I opened up the bedroom door and saw the smoke I knew we only had a few minutes left. My oldest son, Nicholas, sleeps like a rock, and I was so sleepy after eating turkey. I was so out of it I fell down the stairs when I got up. I couldn't believe it. It was really a bad dream."

However, Rende will be forever thankful for his heroic little boy. "It was a miracle!" he exclaimed. "Thank God my son Vincent is a light sleeper. You can just snap your fingers to wake him up. I used to think it was a negative when he was really younger and we had to tip toe around, but thankfully things are going in a positive direction for us now.

"Right now, this situation takes up most of my time," Rende admits. "My wife works as a waitress. It's been so stressful, frustrating and inconvenient, but we're lucky to still be here. We're hanging in there, one day at a time, temporarily living in a one-room motel in Greenwood Lake, N.Y. I had to pull my kids out of Delaware schools. I've been driving my kids to school every day up here and the teachers have been great."

Rende plans to repair his home in a few months and return to his first love of harness racing.

"My immediate agenda is to clean out the house and try to save some of our possessions. We're going to rebuild and I'm going back to training horses. My sister, Debbie (same first name as Frank's wife) is stabled in Delaware, and I'm trying to help her as much as I can. I've been a horse person since I was born. I sat in a sulky when I was five. I started driving in races when I was 18. I always wanted to be the next John Campbell. I'm 50, but I feel like a young 50." (*Meadowlands*)

## Take My Picture Gets Picture Taken In Snow

Last Saturday night's ninth race at Woodbine was the 99th career start for the 6-year-old gelding trotter Take My Picture, and it was arguably his most adventurous.

Driven by Paul MacDonell, Take My Picture scored his 22nd career victory, but for the most part the trip was hidden to fans as the race was contested under blizzard-like conditions, including single-digit temperatures. The charted line shows Take My Picture starting in post 8 and winning by one length in 1:55.3, but the individual quarter calls show only "snow" notations.

"The track condition itself wasn't terrible, it was the visibility that was the problem," said MacDonell. "They scraped the track right down

before the first race and then by the ninth race it was starting to fill in pretty good because the snow was coming down hard. But it made for a nice cushion and it helped him.

"He's a real classy horse and nice to drive. The conditions don't impede him any. He goes through that stuff like it's nothing."

What's missing in the charted lines is that MacDonell left with Take My Picture and settled in the two hole, where he remained until midstretch when he angled his charge to the outside and rallied between horses for the victory.

"He was near the front the whole way sitting in the two hole, and he got out nice in the lane," said MacDonell. "The wind was blowing as well and a lot of the front horses weren't holding on, so the ones that were two, three and

four seemed to be getting the best trips and getting the lion's share. You couldn't come from too far back but you also couldn't be on the front."

MacDonell said his primary issue with the weather was the snow pelting his goggles.

"When the snow melts, the water hits the glasses," he said. "It's not as bad as driving in the mud; it's just that your eyes fill up with water. I had to pull my glasses down on my nose a wee bit."

Take My Picture is scheduled to make his 100th career start in Race 5 on Saturday night at Woodbine, starting from post 9 with MacDonell driving. A \$35,000 yearling purchase by Joseph and Laurie Davino, Take My Picture is out of the Muscles Yankee mare Habit's Lady, a half sister to the 2010 Peter Haughton Memorial winner Civil Action.

Trained by John Drennan, Take My Picture has career earnings of \$815,483 and a mark of 1:52.3 taken last April at Woodbine. His biggest year came as a 3 year old in 2010 when he earned nearly \$400,000, including a big payday as runner-up in the \$573,770 Yonkers Trot. Take My Picture has another \$8,750 in earnings coming via a pair of second-place finishes in under-saddle races in 2012. — By Gordon Waterstone

## Smilin Eli Is NJSS Premier Horse Of The Year

Smilin Eli has been selected as the 2013 New Jersey Sire Stakes (NJSS) Premier Division Horse of the Year. The son of Muscles Yankee won all three of his NJSS starts at the Meadowlands, including the \$150,000 championship final in a career best and stakes record-matching 1:51.2.

The award for NJSS Green Acres Division Horse of the Year went to the 2-year-old pacing filly Ideal Helen, winner of all three of her major New Jersey-sired stakes races at Freehold Raceway, the \$61,900 Lou Babic Memorial Filly final, \$52,650 New Jersey Futurity and \$25,000 NJSS Green Acres final.

These awards, which are voted by the Sire Stakes Board of Trustees, are based only on performances in races for New Jersey-sired horses, including NJSS races and other N.J.-sired major stakes and futurities.

The awards will be presented Jan. 26, 2014 at the 57th annual New Jersey Breeders Awards luncheon at Charley's Other Brother in Easthampton. Tickets are \$35. For reservations, call (609) 984-4389. (NJSS)

## Kramer Wins Record Eight Dashes In The Snow

If Santa Claus is hampered by snow next week while trying to deliver his Christmas presents, maybe he should turn to Michigan-based driver Brad Kramer for help. Kramer proved last Saturday night (Dec. 14) at Sports Creek Raceway he can find his way through snow as he won a track-record eight races over a racetrack surface rated three seconds off by the stewards because of the conditions.

Because of the heavy snow, there were 43 scratches on the 16-race card, but Kramer still had 11 drives remaining. Of his eight winners, six came for trainer Joe Cirusuola, whose farm is just 15 minutes from Sports Creek so it was an easier ship for him as opposed to other horsemen who were unable to make a longer trip due to the poor weather.

"I came up to Joe's farm in the morning from my house and even then it took 90 minutes instead of about an hour," Kramer told harnessracing.com Tuesday morning. "I was glad I made that decision because it wasn't too bad getting to the track."

Kramer said winning six races for Cirusuola gave his night special meaning because the trainer recently resumed working in the barn after the recent death of his wife, Candace, who was also a trainer.

"The track itself wasn't too bad with the snow and to win six for Joe was great," said Kramer, who currently stands second on the Sports Creek dash list behind only Jason Merriman.

The 56-year-old has 7,553 career victories with \$31.3 million in purse earnings. He has topped the \$1-million mark in purses in each of the last 17 years, but because of the reduced racing opportunities in Michigan that streak will be snapped this year.

While Kramer earned a new spot in the Sports Creek record book with his eight-win binge, he already shares a national record. On July 20, 2005, Kramer won eight consecutive races at the Gladwin, Mich., fair, tying him at the time with Stephane Bouchard, who achieved the same feat at Yonkers in 2003. The duo was joined by Jim Morrill Jr. in 2009 when he won eight straight at Tioga Downs.

## Andy Miller Joins \$100 Million Club

Mother Nature delayed the milestone a couple of days, but on Monday afternoon, Dec. 16, Andy Miller became the 16th driver in North American harness racing history to surpass \$100 million in career purses when New York Kitty finished second in the fourth race at Harrah's Philadelphia. Miller's drives Saturday night at the Meadowlands and Sunday at Philly were wiped out when snow forced each track to cancel those race cards.

Miller, 45, entered the day needing \$7,056 to reach \$100 million. He finished fourth in the second race with Muscolo and second in the third race with Brdways Perfection before hitting the milestone one race later.
