### Cullipher Brings New Charges To Meadowlands

Trainer Jeff Cullipher will send out five pacers on Friday night's card at the Meadowlands, including Stonedust in the \$20,000 Preferred Handicap Pace. With Saturday's card canceled due to a New York Jets home game that afternoon at adjacent MetLife Stadium, the contest was moved to Friday and highlights a 12-race program.

Stonedust has not raced since a fourth-place finish in the Invitational Pace on Oct. 13 at Hoosier Park, but he comes into Saturday's contest off a 1:53.1 win in a Dec. 8 quali-

fier at the Big M. David Miller was in the sulky for the qualifier and he'll again be behind the 4-year-old gelding, who starts from post 6 in the six-horse field.

“He just had a little time off for some R&R and get him back ready,” said Cullipher, who purchased Stonedust in partnership with Tom Pollack last April at Yonkers before sending the pacer to Hoosier Park where he competed in top-class events all summer. “This is his first start back and I'm not going to tell David (Miller) how to drive him as he's a Hall of Famer and knows what to do.”

Stonedust did not race at two for his prior connections, and he made only four starts last year with one win and \$6,200 in earnings. Stonedust comes into Friday's race with 10 wins in 29 starts—including a career-best 1:51 at Hoosier Park—and \$110,420 in earnings.

“He's exceeded expectations, that's for sure,” said Cullipher. Stonedust is a son of Sagebrush out of the Laag mare April Ruffles, whose progeny includes her first foal, Ruffed Up, who won the 2000 Pennsylvania Sires Stakes championship for 3-year-old colt pacers and \$650,089. April Ruffles also produced Fast Ruffles, who earned \$413,758 in only one year of racing as a 2 year old in 2004. Fast Ruffles' wins include the Matron and divisions of the Bluegrass and International Stallion, as well as a second-place finish in the Breeders Crown final.

Another horse coming off a layoff and starting on Friday for Cullipher is Castle Flight, who starts from post 2 in Race 4, a \$16,000 conditioned pace with a \$50,000 optional claiming clause, with Miller driving. In his last two starts in August, the 6-year-old Panspacificflight gelding swept a two-week mini-series at Hoosier Park. Castle Flight won a qualifier in late October at Hoosier and then didn't appear again until a winning qualifier Dec. 8 at the Meadowlands.

Cullipher said there was no cause for concern about the gaps in racing.

“When he won that series it put a bunch of money on his card so he was going to have to race over his head and it would interfere some other horses I had racing in the upper-conditioned races,” explained Cullipher. “So we went ahead and gave him his break then, but when he got back we were going to put him in claimers, but Hoosier Park's higher-up claimers weren't filling so I couldn't get him back in.”

Castle Flight's win in the \$23,750 mini-series final was a 1:49.4 effort, which equaled his career best set in 2017 at Hoosier. Entered for the \$50,000 tag, Castle Flight comes into Friday's race with \$212,106 in earnings for Cullipher and Pollack.

Cullipher also sends out Dubious Claim from post 6 in Race 6, an \$8,500 conditioned pace. Brett Miller will drive the 4-year-old Western Terror in his second start since being purchased last month by Cullipher and Pollack. In his debut for his new connections in a similar-class event on Dec. 8 at the Meadowlands, Dubious Claim finished seventh.

"Last week was our first start with him and I had only trained him once," said Cullipher. "Honestly, I expected him to run off and it didn't work out. We changed a couple things so hopefully it will work out this week."

Incredible Shark and New Talent start as a wagering entry in Race 2, a \$13,000 conditioned pace. Incredible Shark starts from post 5 with Marcus Miller driving, while New Talent and driver David Miller will line up in post 8.

New Talent is arguably the best on paper of the two stablemates. The 5-year-old Mach Three gelding has career earnings of \$305,603, with \$86,700 amassed this year while racing primarily in Hoosier Park's top-class races. He finished seventh by just 3 1/2 lengths in his Big M debut on Dec. 8 after being parked first-over in a 1:50.1 mile. — *By Gordon Waterstone*

## Hoosiers Take On Buckeyes At Hollywood Dayton

The fourth annual Hoosiers vs. Buckeyes Driver's Challenge will take place Saturday night at Hollywood Dayton Raceway. Dayton's five leading dash-winning drivers will compete against five of Hoosier Park's best drivers in the six-race competition. Post time is 6:15 p.m.

Hollywood Dayton Raceway provides \$2,500 in prize money for the contest and the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association adds \$500. In the past, the drivers from both tracks have graciously donated the entire \$3,000 pool to Dayton Firefighters Local 136, the unit that provides ambulance and EMT service to Dayton Raceway during each and every live racing program. The local firefighters and paramedics use the funds to purchase toys for needy children in their service area at Christmas time.

Team Buckeyes is captained by Jeremy Smith, whose teammates include Dan Noble, Chris Page, Josh Sutton and Kayne Kauffman. Trace Tetrick is the captain of Team Hoosiers, which includes Ricky Macomber Jr., Lewayne Miller, Mike Oosting and Brandon Bates.

Each team will start from the odd numbered post positions in half the races and each of the 10 drivers were pre-assigned post positions that added up to 33 over the six races. A win is worth 30 points, with second worth 24 points and third worth 18 points. Points for fourth through ninth will be awarded 14-11-8-5-3-1. A driver will receive 10 points for a scratched horse.

The Buckeyes won the inaugural Driver's Challenge in 2015, with the Hoosiers capturing the 2016 title. The Buckeyes won in a tight contest last year so the Hoosiers will be looking to even the score this time around.

"I think we should come out on top, hopefully," said Tetrick. "We have a good group of guys so I think we can get it done. It all goes to a good cause. It helps buy toys for Christmas so I think we're all winners in the game just being involved with it."

With Hoosier Park closed, Tetrick has been racing in Ohio, first at Miami Valley and now at Hollywood Dayton. The program lines show that of Tetrick's six contest drives he has only been behind one in recent weeks. And while he's driven Always A Fighter to a second and first his last two starts, that 8-year-old pacer will be making his first start for trainer Jacob Fox after being claimed last time out for \$15,000. Bumped up to a \$20,000 tag, Always A Fighter starts from post 8 as the 9-2 fourth choice in the program in the last contest race (Race 11).

Tetrick is listed on only one morning-line choice, that being Whiskey Friskie in Race 9, the fifth contest race. Trained by Brandon Piguet, Whiskey Friskie won two starts back and then finished a late-closing third last time out after starting from post 7. Whiskey Friskie starts from post 1 on Saturday, a spot Tetrick said will work to his advantage. —By Gordon Waterstone

## Winningest Horse Title Up For Grabs

With just three weeks left in 2018, the title of "Winningest Standardbred in North America" is still up for grabs.

Currently atop the leaderboard with 20 wins each are Southwind Amazon, a staple in Northfield Park's open ranks, and Spicy Victor, who has

been a constant in claiming events at Western Fair in London, Ont. Four horses, including likely Older Mare Pacer of the Year Shartin N and Midwest standout Always A Prince, both done for the year, are one win behind.

Since being purchased by Ameer Najor and sent to trainer Paul Holzman in early 2016, Southwind Amazon has made the winner's circle a second home. In 111 starts for his new connections, Southwind Amazon has won 49 times—a win average of 44 percent. Over that span, Southwind Amazon has amassed earnings of more than a half-million dollars, bringing his career total to \$737,547.

Southwind Amazon will aim for win 21 on Monday night at Northfield Park, starting from post 8 in the \$19,000 Open Pace with Ronnie Wrenn Jr. driving.

While he's been a successful mainstay in the Northfield Park opens, it hasn't been easy for Southwind Amazon. Northfield Park's executive vice president of racing Dave Bianconi usually assigns Southwind Amazon an outside post.

"If I don't assign him an outside post, then I'll ask Paul to give the horse a week off or take him somewhere else to race so I can give the other horses a break," said Bianconi of Southwind Amazon's dominance at the Cleveland half-miler.

From Sept. 17 to Oct. 29, Southwind Amazon made six consecutive starts from the outside post 8, but after a third and sixth after two wins and two seconds, Bianconi granted some relief and Southwind Amazon lined up in post 3. A victory then led to three straight starts from post 7.

Southwind Amazon won the first two of those three starts but in the third last time out on Dec. 10 he finished fifth after being parked the mile.

"That was after his week off and I don't train him hard because he doesn't like it, so he was a little bit short," said Holzman, who purchased the son of Camluck on behalf of Najor for \$30,000. "He still went a big trip being parked the mile. He has been an unbelievable horse for me; he's raced three straight years with no layoffs."

Holzman said he's amazed by Southwind Amazon's toughness. "In the first year and a half I had him I raced him at 11 or 12 different racetracks and he had to log a million miles," said Holzman, who has a stable of approximately 15 horses at Sahbra Farms in Ohio. "He's a Camluck and he's iron-clad. They are tough as nails." —By Gordon Waterstone

## NJ Lawmakers Advance \$100 Million Subsidy

On Monday, Dec. 10, the New Jersey Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee advanced by a vote of 13-0 proposed legislation that would provide a \$100-million subsidy to the state's racing and breeding industry. The proposed legislation will provide a \$20 million annual subsidy to be divided equally between the Thoroughbred and Standardbred industries. The state's funding would benefit not just racetracks but everyone involved in racing.

"The horse racing industry has had a long road to recovery, and we feel this purse supplement money, as well as the ability to enter into agreements with sports book operators at the racetracks, would provide a necessary shot of adrenaline into the horse racing industry," AJ Sabath, a lobbyist representing the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOANJ), told the committee before the vote.

The \$100-million subsidy would be funneled through the New Jersey Racing Commission, which would require the funds be used for purses and track operations. The money would be divided equally between breeds, which means Monmouth Park would receive half and the



Meadowlands and Freehold, as well as the New Jersey Sires Stakes and other breeding programs, would share in the other half.

The bill also requires sportsbook operators reach an agreement that some of the revenue will also be shared with the horsemen. The Meadowlands and Monmouth Park currently have operating sportsbooks, while Freehold has announced it is negotiating with potential sportsbook partners.

## Greek-American Standardbearer Mykonos Eyes Third Straight

In the nearly 40 years they've been breeding and campaigning Standardbreds, Jim Kezios and John Krillies—racing as Tripoli Stable of Norridge, Ill.—have followed a consistent theme in naming their horses.

"Both of us are Greek, so we like to honor Greek traditions," Kezios says. "We name most of our horses for Greek islands, mythical characters or war heroes."

The latest in the Tripoli line, the 3-year-old Mykonos, is extending that tradition. He'll try for his third straight victory in Saturday afternoon's first race, leaving from post 7 with Jeremy Indof piloting. His full brother, Zone Blitz, also will race Saturday (race 4, post 4, Indof).

Of all the horses who've borne Tripoli's Greek-influenced names, probably the most successful was Kanaris, who was named for Constantine Kanaris, a freedom fighter in the Greek War of Independence who

eventually became the country's prime minister. Kanaris the pacer banked \$361,649 lifetime and took a mark of 1:48.3. He was second at 25-1 in the 2014 \$250,000 Jim Ewart Memorial Invitational at Scioto Downs, defeating the likes of Foiled Again, Sweet Lou and 2012 Adios winner Bolt The Duer.

"That definitely was the highlight for us," Kezios says.

Tripoli named its son of Corner Blitz-She's So Keen after the Greek island Mykonos, which Kezios, his wife and their daughters visited about 10 years ago. The island has an important place in Greek mythology. It was there that Zeus was said to have battled the Titans, there that Hercules slew giants considered invincible. Not only killed them, the myth goes, but also dismembered them and scattered their body parts that now exist, in petrified form, as large rocks that dot the island.

For all the violence of those myths, Mykonos seems idyllic, cooled by gentle sea breezes that allow year-round tourism to flourish. The island is known for its family-oriented activities as well as all-night bars and what Kezios discreetly describes as "adult beaches." He did not experience those beaches.

"I was very happy doing things with my family," he says. "What I remember most are the windmills and the breezes coming off the Mediterranean. It's one of the most beautiful islands you'd ever want to go to."

Mykonos is not yet in Kanaris' class. Both recent wins have come in conditioned claimers, and he's stepping up Saturday to a much tougher \$11,100 event for winners of two races but not more than four. Dirk Simpson, who trains the brothers, believes Mykonos is ready for the challenge.

"His potential is good," Simpson says. "I like him a little better than Zone Blitz; he's a little more aggressive. Getting away from that long stretch at Hoosier Park didn't hurt him."

Kezios agrees with that assessment.

"He raced at Illinois fair tracks at two, and he was able to zip around those. We thought a five-eighths-mile track would be better for him than mile tracks or Hoosier."

To date, Mykonos has banked \$48,807. If his earnings swell, would Kezios consider allocating his share of the profit to a return trip to the island?

"If I can find the time, I'm planning on going back there whether or not the horse does well," he says. "Time is sometimes harder to find than money." (Evan Pattak)
